Re: Suspension of Permitting Requirements for Hazardous Facilities

When the state returned the federal hazardous waste RCRA program several years ago, the legislature suspended provisions of the law on the premise that they could be reinstated if the state regained delegation of the federal program. The suspension language was placed in session law annually until some time ago when it was extended for several years. The provision expired in 1999, without being amended. This bill proposes an amendment that would suspend the effectiveness of the provisions until such time as the department requests approval of delegation of the program. There is occasional consideration of the RCRA program, but so far the state has not decided to seek its return. Until it does, these provisions are not appropriate. The bill will resolve the issue and not require further action unless delegation is sought and legislative changes are required by EPA at that time.
