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HOUSE FILE 2498 FISCAL NOTE

The estimate for House File 2498 is hereby submitted as a fiscal note pursuant to Joint Rule 17 and as a correctional impact statement pursuant to Section 2.56, Code of Iowa. Data used in developing this fiscal note and correctional impact statement are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 2498 defines the practice of direct entry midwifery, establishes a midwifery advisory council, and specifies registration requirements for those individuals engaged in the practice of direct entry midwifery. The Bill requires the Department of Public Health, upon application and receipt of a prescribed fee, to issue a certificate of registration to individuals who have met all the requirements. In addition, House File 2498 specifies that a nonregistered individual who practices as a certified midwife without having obtained a registration certificate is guilty of a serious misdemeanor.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. The registration fee is estimated at \$150 annually with 20 potential registrants in the first year. General Fund revenues during the first year would be \$3,500.
- 2. Fines and penalties for the first year would total an estimated \$500.
- 3. One additional FTE position for a Program Planner II is required by the Department of Public Health. The salary and benefits for this position at the mid-range paygrade level is \$44,000.
- 4. Additional equipment and support expenditures of \$5,500 are required for an additional computer, desk, and various office supplies.
- 5. The midwifery council, composed of seven members from across the State, would meet once a month for the first year. The council would incur costs for travel, lodging, and meals totaling an estimated \$11,000.

CORRECTIONAL IMPACT

No significant correctional impact would be expected to result from HF 2498.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated General Fund first year cost of HF 2498 is as follows:
