A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to services provided by county officers including funding for emergency medical services and the disposition of lost property. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- Section 1. Section 135.25, Code 1999, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 135.25 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES FUND.
- 4 An emergency medical services fund is created in the state

- 6 includes, but is not limited to, amounts appropriated by the

1 EXPLANATION

2 This bill provides that funding allocated by the department

7 The bill also amends provisions of Code chapter 556F

8 relating to the disposition of lost goods, financial

9 instruments, and other things of value. The bill increases

10 the total value of lost goods and moneys from \$5 to \$20 which

11 requires a finder to search for the owner, if known, and make

12 restitution. If the owner is unknown, the bill provides that

13 the finder shall take the money and description of other

14 property to the county sheriff or the chief of police of the

15 county where the property was found, and provide an affidavit

16 of the property and circumstances of the finding to the

17 sheriff or chief of police. A copy of the affidavit is sent

18 to the county auditor for recording in the auditor's lost

19 property book. Under current law, the county auditor receives

20 the affidavit directly from the finder.

21 The finder is also required to advertise the finding and

22 the finder's address by posting at the courthouse or at the

23 city hall or police station and at one other of the most

24 public places in the county. Current law requires posting at

25 the door of the courthouse and at three other of the most

26 public places in the county. However, if the value of the

27 finding exceeds \$40, an advertisement must be published once

28 each week for three consecutive weeks in a newspaper having

29 general circulation in the county. Current law requires

30 publication for a finding valued at more than \$10.

Section 1. Section 135.25, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

135.25 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES FUND.

An emergency medical services fund is created in the state treasury under the control of the department. The fund includes, but is not limited to, amounts appropriated by the general assembly, and other moneys available from federal or private sources which are to be used for purposes of this section. Funds remaining in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund of the state but shall remain in the emergency medical services fund, notwithstanding section 8.33. The fund is established to assist counties by matching, on a dollar-for-dollar basis, moneys spent by a county for the acquisition of equipment for the provision of emergency medical services and by providing grants to counties for education and training in the delivery of emergency medical services, as provided in this section and section 422D.6. A county seeking matching funds under this section shall apply to the emergency medical services division of the department. The department shall adopt rules concerning the application and awarding process for the matching funds and the criteria for the allocation of moneys in the fund if the moneys are insufficient to meet the
