A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating federal funds made available from federal
2 block grants and other federal grants, allocating portions of
3 federal block grants, and providing procedures if federal
4 funds are more or less than anticipated or if federal block
5 grants are more or less than anticipated and providing an
6 effective date.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
4 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
5 30, 2001, the following amount:

6 \$ 12,542,219

7 a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
8 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
9 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
10 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance
11 abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department
12 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
13 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
14 conformance with chapter 17A.

15 b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
16 not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for
17 administrative expenses.

18 c. The department shall expend no less than an amount
19 equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the
20 state fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, for pregnant women
21 and women with dependent children.

22 d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount
23 not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

24 2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in
25 subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

26 a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for
27 prevention programs.

28 b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
29 drug treatment and prevention activities.

30 c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on
31 alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

32 3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the
33 federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated
34 federal fiscal year 2000-2001 award appropriated in subsection
35 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment

1 programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that,
2 based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess
3 awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

4 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

5 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
6 section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the
7 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending
8 September 30, 2001, the following amount:

9 \$ 3,095,824

10 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the
11 anticipated funds to be received from the federal government
12 for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C.,
13 chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community
14 mental health services block grant. The department shall
15 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided
16 in the federal law making the funds available and in
17 conformance with chapter 17A.

18 c. The administrator of the division of mental health and
19 developmental disabilities of the department of human services
20 shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the
21 block grant to eligible community mental health services
22 providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved
23 by the federal substance abuse and mental health services
24 administration for the fiscal year involved.

25 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
26 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department
27 of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds
28 set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the
29 division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall
30 pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the
31 cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
32 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
33 auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and
34 developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

35 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
2 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
3 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
4 30, 2001, the following amount:

5 \$ 6,968,187

6 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
7 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
8 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
9 subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health
10 services block grant. The department shall expend the funds
11 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
12 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
13 17A.

14 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
15 exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

16 Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by
17 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect
18 costs.

19 2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds
20 appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public
21 health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health
22 for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be
23 used for audits in subsection 1.

24 The departments of public health, human services, and
25 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional
26 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the
27 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of
28 services to women and children.

29 3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds
30 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement
31 appropriations for maternal and child health programs within
32 the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds,
33 \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care
34 program.

35 b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds

1 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the
 2 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of
 3 the state board of regents for mobile and regional child
 4 health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals
 5 and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs
 6 from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to
 7 establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile
 8 and regional child health specialty clinics.

9 4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer
 10 the statewide maternal and child health program and the
 11 crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional
 12 child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities
 13 to improve the health of low-income women and children and to
 14 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential
 15 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance
 16 with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social
 17 Security Act.

18 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES
 19 APPROPRIATIONS.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 21 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
 22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
 23 30, 2001, the following amount:

24 \$ 1,945,069

25 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 26 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 27 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A,
 28 subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and
 29 health services block grant. The department shall expend the
 30 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
 31 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
 32 chapter 17A.

33 Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not
 34 exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

35 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific

1 amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award
2 shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and
3 for rape prevention education.

4 3. An amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds
5 appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the Iowa
6 department of public health for administrative expenses in
7 addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

8 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1,
9 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1
10 shall be used by the department for healthy people
11 2010/healthy Iowans 2010 program objectives, preventive health
12 advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including
13 nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease
14 services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the
15 fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and
16 acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. The moneys
17 specified in this subsection shall not be used by the
18 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by the state
19 hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect costs. Of the
20 funds used by the department under this subsection, an amount
21 not exceeding \$90,000 shall be used for the monitoring of the
22 fluoridation program and for start-up fluoridation grants to
23 public water systems, and an amount not exceeding \$50,000
24 shall be used to provide chlamydia testing.

25 Sec. 5. DRUG CONTROL AND SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM
26 APPROPRIATION.

27 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
28 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
29 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
30 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
31 following amount:

32 \$ 5,834,000

33 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
34 funds to be received from the federal government for the
35 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter

1 V, which provides for the drug control and system improvement
2 grant program. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
3 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
4 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
5 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

6 2. An amount not exceeding 7 percent of the funds
7 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
8 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
9 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
10 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
11 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
12 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
13 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
14 appropriated in subsection 1.

15 Sec. 6. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM
16 APPROPRIATION.

17 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
18 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
19 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
20 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
21 following amount:

22 \$ 1,670,000

23 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated
24 funds to be received from the federal government for the
25 designated fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 46, subchapter
26 XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent crimes
27 against women. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention
28 coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
29 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
30 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

31 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
32 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
33 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
34 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
35 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement

1 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
2 the state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the
3 use and administration of the state's portion of the funds
4 appropriated in subsection 1.

5 Sec. 7. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BLOCK GRANT APPROPRIATION.

6 1. There is appropriated from the fund created in section
7 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement
8 and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year
9 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
10 following amount:

11 \$ 320,100

12 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
13 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
14 designated federal fiscal year under annual federal
15 appropriations which provide for grants to reduce crime and
16 improve public safety. The drug enforcement and abuse
17 prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in
18 this subsection as provided in the federal law making the
19 funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

20 2. An amount not exceeding 3 percent of the funds
21 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the drug
22 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
23 administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
24 subsection for administrative expenses, the drug enforcement
25 and abuse prevention coordinator shall pay to the auditor of
26 state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use
27 and administration of the state's portion of the funds
28 appropriated in subsection 1.

29 Sec. 8. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE
30 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from
31 the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor
32 for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for
33 the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending
34 September 30, 2001, the following amount:

35 \$ 520,237

1 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
 2 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 3 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136,
 4 which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs
 5 in state and local correctional facilities. The drug
 6 enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the
 7 funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal
 8 law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
 9 17A.

10 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

11 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
 12 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of
 13 the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
 14 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
 15 following amount:

16 \$ 5,676,277

17 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 18 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
 19 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106,
 20 which provides for the community services block grant. The
 21 division of community action agencies of the department of
 22 human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this
 23 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
 24 available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

25 b. The administrator of the division of community action
 26 agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not
 27 less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to
 28 eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting
 29 low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a
 30 minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum
 31 allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds
 32 from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds.
 33 The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-
 34 level population in the area represented by the community
 35 action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level

1 population in the state.

2 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds
3 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of
4 community action agencies of the department of human rights
5 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this
6 subsection for administrative expenses, the division of
7 community action agencies of the department of human rights
8 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay
9 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
10 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The
11 auditor of state shall bill the division of community action
12 agencies for the costs of the audits.

13 Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

14 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
15 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal
16 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
17 30, 2001, the following amount:

18 \$ 29,939,000

19 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
20 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
21 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69,
22 which provides for community development block grants. The
23 department of economic development shall expend the funds
24 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
25 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
26 17A.

27 2. An amount not exceeding \$1,397,560 for the federal
28 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, shall be used by the
29 department of economic development for administrative expenses
30 for the community development block grant. The total amount
31 used for administrative expenses includes \$698,780 for the
32 federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, of funds
33 appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from
34 the state equal to \$698,780 from the appropriation of state
35 funds for the community development block grant and state

1 appropriations for related activities of the department of
 2 economic development. From the funds set aside for
 3 administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of
 4 economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an
 5 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
 6 administration of the state's portion of the funds
 7 appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill
 8 the department for the costs of the audit.

9 3. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 10 8.41 to the department of economic development for the fiscal
 11 year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000,
 12 the following amount:

13 \$ 3,216,000

14 Funds appropriated in this subsection are community
 15 development block grant moneys awarded to the state under Pub.
 16 L. No. 105-174, the Federal 1998 Supplemental Appropriations
 17 and Recissions Act. The department of economic development
 18 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
 19 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
 20 conformance with chapter 17A. An amount not exceeding 2
 21 percent of the funds awarded shall be used by the department
 22 for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside for
 23 administrative expenses, the department shall pay to the
 24 auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of
 25 auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of
 26 the funds appropriated in this subsection retroactively to
 27 October 1, 1997.

28 Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

29 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
 30 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the
 31 department of human rights for the federal fiscal year
 32 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
 33 following amount:

34 \$ 19,951,229

35 The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds

1 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
2 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94,
3 subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy
4 assistance block grants. The division of community action
5 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
6 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
7 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
8 chapter 17A.

9 2. At least 15 percent of the amount appropriated in this
10 section that is actually received shall be used for
11 residential weatherization or other related home repairs for
12 low-income households. Of this allocation amount, not more
13 than 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In
14 order to receive low-income home energy assistance program
15 funding, the head of an eligible household must be willing to
16 allow residential weatherization or other related home
17 repairs. However, if the eligible household is located in
18 rental property, the unwillingness of the property owner to
19 allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs
20 shall not prevent the eligible household from receiving low-
21 income home energy assistance program funding.

22 3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2,
23 \$1,695,854, or 10 percent of the remainder of the
24 appropriation in this section actually received, whichever is
25 less, is allocated for administrative expenses of the low-
26 income home energy assistance program. Not more than \$290,000
27 of the amount allocated in this subsection shall be used for
28 administrative expenses of the division. The costs of
29 auditing the use and administration of the portion of the
30 appropriation in this section that is retained by the state
31 shall be paid from the amount allocated in this subsection to
32 the division. The auditor of state shall bill the division
33 for the audit costs.

34 4. The remainder of the appropriation in this section
35 following the allocations made in subsections 2 and 3, shall

1 be used to help eligible households as defined in 42 U.S.C.,
2 chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet home energy costs.

3 5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in
4 this section that is actually received, may be carried forward
5 for use in the succeeding federal fiscal year.

6 6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy
7 problems shall be limited to 5 percent of the amount
8 appropriated in this section that is actually received.

9 Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

10 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
11 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal
12 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
13 30, 2001, the following amount:

14 \$ 18,812,027

15 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
16 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
17 designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7,
18 subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block
19 grant. The department of human services shall expend the
20 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
21 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
22 chapter 17A.

23 2. Not more than \$1,196,211 of the funds appropriated in
24 subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services
25 for general administration. From the funds set aside in this
26 subsection for general administration, the department of human
27 services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount
28 sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
29 administration of the state's portion of the funds
30 appropriated in subsection 1.

31 3. In addition to the allocation for general
32 administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds
33 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the
34 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal
35 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, for the following

1 programs within the department of human services:
2 a. Field operations:
3 \$ 7,154,673
4 b. Child and family services:
5 \$ 1,070,140
6 c. Local administrative costs
7 and other local services:
8 \$ 758,773
9 d. Volunteers:
10 \$ 82,927
11 e. Community-based services:
12 \$ 95,365
13 f. MH/MR/DD/BI community service (local purchase):
14 \$ 8,453,938

15 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
16 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop
17 a plan for the use of federal social services block grant
18 funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

19 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services
20 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
21 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
22 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
23 fund the state programs and services.

24 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
25 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
26 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
27 services block grant funds available for the local programs
28 and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal
29 social services block grant funds to the counties. The
30 proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will
31 be used to fund the local programs and services.

32 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's
33 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

34 Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM
35 HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from

1 the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health
 2 administration to provide mental health services for the
 3 homeless, for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1,
 4 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the division of mental
 5 health and developmental disabilities of the department of
 6 human services shall assure that a project which receives
 7 funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local
 8 match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach
 9 services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and
 10 homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of
 11 becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

12 1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic
 13 services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and
 14 rehabilitation services.

15 2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary
 16 hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health
 17 services and substance abuse services.

18 3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide
 19 services to persons targeted by the grant.

20 4. Provide case management to homeless persons.

21 5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain
 22 homeless persons living in residential settings which are not
 23 otherwise supported.

24 6. Projects may expend funds for housing services
 25 including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing,
 26 security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance
 27 in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing
 28 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless
 29 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental
 30 payments to prevent eviction.

31 Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATION. There
 32 is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the
 33 department of human services for the federal fiscal year
 34 beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the
 35 following amount:

1 \$ 30,389,871

2 Funds appropriated in this section are the funds
3 anticipated to be received from the federal government under
4 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for
5 the child care and development block grant. The department
6 shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as
7 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
8 conformance with chapter 17A.

9 Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

10 1. If the funds received from the federal government for
11 the block grants specified in this Act are less than the
12 amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be
13 prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than
14 for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape
15 prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this
16 Act, for which each block grant is available according to the
17 percentages that each program is to receive as specified in
18 this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds
19 allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect
20 the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation
21 is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the
22 funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent

 21 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal
 22 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September
 23 30, 2001, the following amount:

25 Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds
 26 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the

20 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with

21 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify

22 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to

APPROPRIATING FEDERAL FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS AND OTHER FEDERAL GRANTS, ALLOCATING PORTIONS OF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS, AND PROVIDING PROCEDURES IF FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED OR IF FEDERAL BLOCK GRANTS ARE MORE OR LESS THAN ANTICIPATED AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 12,542,219

a. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the substance abuse prevention and treatment block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be used by the department for administrative expenses.

c. The department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, for pregnant women and women with dependent children.

d. Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$24,585 shall be used for audits.

2. The funds remaining from the appropriation made in subsection 1 shall be allocated as follows:

a. At least 20 percent of the allocation shall be for prevention programs.

b. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on drug treatment and prevention activities.

c. At least 35 percent of the allocation shall be spent on alcohol treatment and prevention activities.

3. The substance abuse block grant funds received from the federal government in excess of the amount of the anticipated federal fiscal year 2000-2001 award appropriated in subsection 1 shall be distributed at least 50 percent to treatment programs and 50 percent to prevention programs except that, based upon federal guidelines, the total amount of the excess awarded to prevention programs shall not exceed \$1,000,000.

Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 3,095,824

b. Funds appropriated in this subsection are the anticipated funds to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the community mental health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

c. The administrator of the division of mental health and developmental disabilities of the department of human services shall allocate not less than 95 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community mental health services providers for carrying out the plan submitted to and approved by the federal substance abuse and mental health services administration for the fiscal year involved.

2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division of mental health and developmental disabilities for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 6,968,187

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter V, which provides for the maternal and child health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$45,700 shall be used for audits.

Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect costs.

2. An amount not exceeding \$150,000 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 to the Iowa department of public health shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

The departments of public health, human services, and education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional

child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of services to women and children.

3. a. Sixty-three percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to supplement appropriations for maternal and child health programs within the Iowa department of public health. Of these funds, \$284,548 shall be set aside for the statewide perinatal care program.

b. Thirty-seven percent of the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated to the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics under the control of the state board of regents for mobile and regional child health specialty clinics. The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall not receive an allocation for indirect costs from the funds for this program. Priority shall be given to establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of mobile and regional child health specialty clinics.

4. The Iowa department of public health shall administer the statewide maternal and child health program and the crippled children's program by conducting mobile and regional child health specialty clinics and conducting other activities to improve the health of low-income women and children and to promote the welfare of children with actual or potential handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance with the requirements of Title V of the federal Social Security Act.

Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the Iowa department of public health for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 1,945,069

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the

designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 6A, subchapter XVII, which provides for the preventive health and health services block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Of the funds appropriated in this subsection, an amount not exceeding \$5,522 shall be used for audits.

2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1, the specific amount of funds stipulated by the notice of block grant award shall be allocated for services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education.

3. An amount not exceeding \$94,670 of the remaining funds appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 shall be used by the Iowa department of public health for administrative expenses in addition to the amount to be used for audits in subsection 1.

4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 1, 2, and 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department for healthy people 2010/healthy Iowans 2010 program objectives, preventive health advisory committee, and risk reduction services, including nutrition programs, health incentive programs, chronic disease services, emergency medical services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and start-up fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome services. There is appropriated from the fund created in section 8.41 to the office of the governor for the drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this section are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 136, which provides grants for substance abuse treatment programs in state and local correctional facilities. The drug enforcement and abuse prevention coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 9. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 5,676,277

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 106, which provides for the community services block grant. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

b. The administrator of the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall allocate not less than 96 percent of the amount of the block grant to eligible community action agencies for programs benefiting low-income persons. Each eligible agency shall receive a

minimum allocation of not less than \$100,000. The minimum allocation shall be achieved by redistributing increased funds from agencies experiencing a greater share of available funds. The funds shall be distributed on the basis of the poverty-level population in the area represented by the community action areas compared to the size of the poverty-level population in the state.

2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative expenses, the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division of community action agencies for the costs of the audits.

Sec. 10. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of economic development for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 69, which provides for community development block grants. The department of economic development shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. An amount not exceeding \$1,401,520 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, shall be used by the department of economic development for administrative expenses for the community development block grant. The total amount

used for administrative expenses includes \$700,760 for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, of funds appropriated in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from the state equal to \$600,760 from the appropriation of state funds for the community development block grant and state appropriations for related activities of the department of economic development. From the funds set aside for administrative expenses by this subsection, the department of economic development shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the department for the costs of the audit.

3. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of economic development for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999, and ending September 30, 2000, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are community development block grant moneys awarded to the state under Pub. L. No. 105-174, the Federal 1998 Supplemental Appropriations and Recissions Act. The department of economic development shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A. An amount not exceeding 2 percent of the funds awarded shall be used by the department for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside for administrative expenses, the department shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in this subsection retroactively to October 1, 1997.

Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the department of human rights for the federal fiscal year

beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 19,951,229

The funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, which provides for the low-income home energy assistance block grants. The division of community action agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. At least 15 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received shall be used for residential weatherization or other related home repairs for low-income households. Of this allocation amount, not more than 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In order to receive low-income home energy assistance program funding, the head of an eligible household must be willing to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs. However, if the eligible household is located in rental property, the unwillingness of the property owner to allow residential weatherization or other related home repairs shall not prevent the eligible household from receiving low-income home energy assistance program funding.

3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2, \$1,695,854, or 10 percent of the remainder of the appropriation in this section actually received, whichever is less, is allocated for administrative expenses of the low-income home energy assistance program. Not more than \$290,000 of the amount allocated in this subsection shall be used for administrative expenses of the division. The costs of auditing the use and administration of the portion of the appropriation in this section that is retained by the state shall be paid from the amount allocated in this subsection to the division. The auditor of state shall bill the division for the audit costs.

4. The remainder of the appropriation in this section following the allocations made in subsections 2 and 3, shall be used to help eligible households as defined in 42 U.S.C., chapter 94, subchapter II, to meet home energy costs.

5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received, may be carried forward for use in the succeeding federal fiscal year.

6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy problems shall be limited to 5 percent of the amount appropriated in this section that is actually received.

Sec. 12. SOCIAL SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

Funds appropriated in this subsection are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government for the designated federal fiscal year under 42 U.S.C., chapter 7, subchapter XX, which provides for the social services block grant. The department of human services shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2. Not more than \$1,196,211 of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of human services for general administration. From the funds set aside in this subsection for general administration, the department of human services shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

3. In addition to the allocation for general administration in subsection 2, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 shall be allocated in the following amounts to supplement appropriations for the federal

fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, for the following programs within the department of human services:

Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop a plan for the use of federal social services block grant funds for the subsequent state fiscal year.

The proposed plan shall include all programs and services at the state level which the department proposes to fund with federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify state and other funds which the department proposes to use to fund the state programs and services.

The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and services which are eligible to be funded with federal social services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social services block grant funds available for the local programs and services, and the manner of distribution of the federal social services block grant funds to the counties. The proposed plan shall identify state and local funds which will be used to fund the local programs and services.

The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM HOMELESSNESS. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from the federal alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health

administration to provide mental health services for the homeless, for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the division of mental health and developmental disabilities of the department of human services shall assure that a project which receives funds under the formula grant from either the federal or local match share of 25 percent in order to provide outreach services to persons who are chronically mentally ill and homeless or who are subject to a significant probability of becoming homeless shall do all of the following:

1. Provide community mental health services, diagnostic services, crisis intervention services, and habilitation and rehabilitation services.
2. Refer clients to medical facilities for necessary hospital services, and to entities that provide primary health services and substance abuse services.
3. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide services to persons targeted by the grant.
4. Provide case management to homeless persons.
5. Provide supportive and supervisory services to certain homeless persons living in residential settings which are not otherwise supported.
6. Projects may expend funds for housing services including minor renovation, expansion and repair of housing, security deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance in applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental payments to prevent eviction.
7. If the department has data indicating that a geographic area has a substantial number of persons with mental illness who are homeless and are not being served by an existing grantee for that area under the formula grant and the existing grantee has expressed a desire to no longer provide services or the grantee's contract was terminated by the department for nonperformance, the department shall issue a request for

proposals to replace the grantee. Otherwise, the department shall maximize available funding by continuing to contract to the extent possible with those persons who are grantees as of the effective date of this subsection. The department shall issue a request for proposals if additional funding becomes available for expansion to persons who are not being served and it is not possible to utilize existing grantees.

Sec. 15. CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the fund created by section 8.41 to the department of human services for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2000, and ending September 30, 2001, the following amount:

..... \$ 30,389,871

Funds appropriated in this section are the funds anticipated to be received from the federal government under 42 U.S.C., chapter 105, subchapter II-B, which provides for the child care and development block grant. The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If the funds received from the federal government for the block grants specified in this Act are less than the amounts appropriated, the funds actually received shall be prorated by the governor for the various programs, other than for the services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention education under section 4, subsection 2, of this Act, for which each block grant is available according to the percentages that each program is to receive as specified in this Act. However, if the governor determines that the funds allocated by the percentages will not be sufficient to effect the purposes of a particular program, or if the appropriation is not allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the funds in a manner which will effect to the greatest extent possible the purposes of the various programs for which the block grants are available.

2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those committees, the director of the legislative service bureau, and the director of the legislative fiscal bureau shall be notified of the proposed action.

b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations, and information on the reasons why particular percentages or amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs, the departments and programs affected, and other information deemed useful. Chairpersons notified shall be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on the proposed action before the action is taken.

3. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act is less than the amount appropriated, the amount appropriated shall be reduced accordingly. An annual report listing any such appropriation reduction shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

1. If funds received from the federal government in the form of block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 12 of this Act, the excess shall be prorated to the appropriate programs according to the percentages specified in those sections, except additional funds shall not be prorated for administrative expenses.

2. If actual funds received from the federal government from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 11 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program, 15 percent of the excess shall be allocated to the low-income residential weatherization program.

3. If funds received from the federal government from community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 9 of this Act, 100 percent of the excess is allocated to the community services block grant program.

4. If the amount of moneys received from the federal government for a specific grant number specified in this Act exceeds the amount appropriated, the excess amount is appropriated for the purpose designated in the specific grant's appropriation. An annual report listing any such excess appropriations shall be submitted to the fiscal committee of the legislative council.

Sec. 18. PROCEDURE FOR EXPENDITURE OF ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS. If other federal grants, receipts, and funds and other nonstate grants, receipts, and funds become available or are awarded which are not available or awarded during the period in which the general assembly is in session, but which require expenditure by the applicable department or agency prior to March 15 of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, these grants, receipts, and funds are appropriated to the extent necessary, provided that the fiscal committee of the legislative council is notified within thirty days of receipt of the grants, receipts, or funds and the fiscal committee of the legislative council has an opportunity to comment on the expenditure of the grants, receipts, or funds.

Sec. 59. LIHEAP FUNDING -- DISCONNECTION PROHIBITION. It is the intent of the general assembly that if the governor determines federal funds are insufficient to adequately provide for certification of eligibility for the low-income home energy assistance program by the community action agencies during the federal fiscal year which commences October 1, 2000, the Iowa utilities board shall issue an order prohibiting disconnection of service from November 1 through April 1 by a regulated public utility furnishing gas or electricity to households whose income falls at or below one hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level as established by the United States office of management and budget. 1. Section 10, subsection 3, of this Act, appropriating federal community development block grant moneys for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999.

2. Section 14, subsection 7, relating to contracts for projects for assistance in transition from homelessness.
