A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making transportation and other  
2 infrastructure-related appropriations to the state department  
3 of transportation, including allocation and use of moneys from  
4 the general fund of the state, road use tax fund, and primary  
5 road fund, and providing for the nonreversion of certain  
6 moneys.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. For airport engineering studies and improvement projects as provided in chapter 328: \$ 2,475,000

2. For the rail assistance program and to provide economic development project funding: \$ 662,000

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the road use tax fund to the state department of transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

1. For the payment of costs associated with the production of driver's licenses, as defined in section 321.1, subsection 20A: \$ 2,103,000

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30, 2001, from the appropriation made in this subsection, shall not revert, but shall remain available for the following fiscal years for the purposes specified in this subsection.

2. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

a. Operations and finance: \$ 5,267,313

b. Administrative services: \$ 946,149

23 EXPLANATION

24 This bill makes appropriations for the 2000-2001 fiscal  
25 year from the general fund of the state, the road use tax  
26 fund, and the primary road fund to the state department of  
27 transportation.

28 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the  
29 state for the rail assistance program and to provide economic  
30 development project funding and for airport engineering  
31 studies.

32 Appropriations from the road use tax fund include  
33 appropriations for driver's license production costs,  
34 salaries, operations, motor vehicles, unemployment and  
35 workers' compensation, for county issuance of driver's

1 licenses, for a system providing toll-free telephone road and  
2 weather reports, for scale facilities, and indirect cost  
3 recoveries.

4 Appropriations from the primary road fund include  
5 appropriations for salaries, operations, planning and  
6 programming, project development, maintenance, motor vehicles,  
7 equipment, the merit system, unemployment and workers'  
8 compensation, disposal of hazardous wastes at field locations,  
9 indirect costs, wastewater handling, roof replacement at field  
10 facilities, field garages, operations, and compliance with ADA  
11 at department facilities.

28 Seriously disabled veterans who have been provided with an  
29 automobile or other vehicle by the United States government  
30 under the provisions of sections 1901 to 1903, Title 38 of the  
31 United States Code, 38 U.S.C. § 1901 et seq. (1970), shall be  
32 exempt from payment of any automobile registration fee  
33 provided in this chapter, and shall be provided, without fee,  
34 with a registration plate. The disabled veteran, to be able  
35 to claim the above benefit, must be a resident of the state of

1 Iowa. The disabled veteran may obtain a special or  
2 personalized plate under section 321.34 by paying the  
3 difference between the fee for a regular registration plate  
4 and the fee for the special or personalized registration  
5 plate.

6 Sec. 5. REFUNDS OF FEES -- PILOT PROJECT. Notwithstanding  
7 the obligation to collect a fee for a renewal or duplicate of  
8 a nonoperator's identification card or a driver's license  
9 pursuant to section 321.190 or 321.191, the state department  
10 of transportation may conduct a pilot project for waiving or  
11 refunding such fees pursuant to rules adopted by the  
12 department. The department may conduct the pilot project at  
13 two driver's license stations in the state. In conducting the  
14 pilot project the department may waive payment of or refund  
15 all or a portion of the fees to an applicant for a renewal or  
16 a duplicate if the department determines that the service  
17 standard for timely issuance has not been met or an error on  
18 the license or identification card requires the applicant to  
19 return to the driver's license station. The decision of the  
20 department not to issue a refund is final and not subject to  
21 review pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa administrative  
22 procedure Act in chapter 17A.

23 EXPLANATION

24 This bill makes appropriations for the 2000-2001 fiscal  
25 year from the general fund of the state, the road use tax  
26 fund, and the primary road fund to the state department of  
27 transportation.

28 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the  
29 state for the rail assistance program and to provide economic  
30 development project funding and for airport engineering  
31 studies.

32 Appropriations from the road use tax fund include  
33 appropriations for driver's license production costs,  
34 salaries, operations, motor vehicles, unemployment and  
35 workers' compensation, county issuance of driver's licenses, a

1 system providing toll-free telephone road and weather reports,  
2 scale facilities, membership in the North America's  
3 superhighway corridor coalition, and indirect cost recoveries.  
4 Appropriations from the primary road fund include  
5 appropriations for salaries, operations, planning and  
6 programming, project development, maintenance, motor vehicles,  
7 equipment, the merit system, unemployment and workers'  
8 compensation, disposal of hazardous wastes at field locations,  
9 indirect costs, wastewater handling, roof replacement at field  
10 facilities, field garages, operations, and compliance with ADA  
11 at department facilities.

12 The bill amends Code section 321.105 to provide that a  
13 disabled veteran who has been provided with a vehicle by the  
14 federal government and is exempt from paying vehicle  
15 registration and registration plate fees may obtain a special  
16 or personalized registration plate by paying the difference  
17 between the fee for a regular registration plate and the fee  
18 for the special or personalized plate.

19 The bill also allows the state department of transportation  
20 to conduct a pilot project for waiving or refunding fees for  
21 renewals or duplicates of identification cards and driver's  
22 licenses issued by the department pursuant to rules adopted by  
23 the department. The decision of the department to issue a  
24 refund is final and is not subject to review under the Iowa  
25 administrative procedure Act.
