A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to state government technology and operations, by
2 making and relating to appropriations to the Iowa
3 communications network for the support of certain Part III
4 users, making appropriations to various entities for other
5 technology-related purposes, providing for the procurement of
6 information technology, providing for the use of the network,
7 and providing an effective date.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. TREASURER OF STATE. There is appropriated from
2 the general fund of the state to the treasurer of state for
3 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
4 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
5 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

6 For debt service:

7 \$ 12,860,000

8 Funds appropriated in this section shall be deposited in a
9 separate fund established in the office of the treasurer of
10 state, to be used solely for debt service for the Iowa
11 communications network. The Iowa telecommunications and
12 technology commission shall certify to the treasurer of state
13 when a debt service payment is due, and upon receipt of the
14 certification the treasurer shall make the payment. The
15 commission shall pay any additional amount due from funds
16 deposited in the Iowa communications network fund.

17 Sec. 2. IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK OPERATIONS.

18 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
19 state to the Iowa telecommunications and technology commission
20 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June
21 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
22 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated in this
23 subsection:

24 For operations of the network consistent with chapter 8D
25 and for the following full-time equivalent positions:

26 \$ 2,981,920
27 FTEs 104.00

28 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33 or 8.39, moneys
29 appropriated in this section which remain unobligated or
30 unexpended at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert to
31 the general fund of the state but shall remain available for
32 the purposes designated in the succeeding fiscal year, and
33 shall not be transferred to any other program.

34 3. a. It is the intent of the general assembly that the
35 Iowa telecommunications and technology commission annually

1 review the hourly rates established, as provided in section
2 8D.3, subsection 3, paragraph "i", consistent with this
3 paragraph. Such rates shall be established in a manner to
4 minimize any subsidy provided through state general fund
5 appropriations.

6 b. Notwithstanding paragraph "a", the general assembly
7 declares its support for, and that it is the intent of the
8 general assembly to continue, subsidization of video rates
9 charged to libraries, public or nonpublic schools for grades
10 kindergarten through twelve, private universities and
11 colleges, community colleges, and institutions under the
12 control of the state board of regents. Except for original
13 debt service, the Iowa telecommunications and technology
14 commission shall develop a long-term plan for establishing
15 rates that will eliminate, by June 30, 2007, the need for
16 legislatively appropriated funds to be used for subsidization
17 of network costs for authorized users other than the network
18 costs associated with video rates charged to public or
19 nonpublic schools for grades kindergarten through twelve,
20 private universities and colleges, community colleges, and
21 institutions under the control of the state board of regents.

22 4. Notwithstanding section 18.6, subsection 1, for the
23 purposes of any agreement entered into pursuant to this
24 subsection only, it is the intent of the general assembly that
25 the Iowa telecommunications and technology commission utilize
26 a process seeking competitive applications for a demonstration
27 project, and enter into an agreement for a demonstration
28 project to provide voice service for state government over
29 internet protocol. Such agreement for a demonstration project
30 may be entered into with a vendor which agrees to provide all
31 necessary equipment associated with the project at no cost to
32 the state. The Iowa telecommunications and technology
33 commission shall not enter into an agreement for the actual
34 provision of such voice service without utilizing a
35 competitive application process. The vendor and the

1 commission shall submit a written report regarding the quality
2 of the service associated with the demonstration project no
3 later than January 15, 2001.

4 Sec. 3. PUBLIC BROADCASTING. There is appropriated from
5 the general fund of the state to the public broadcasting
6 division of the department of education for the fiscal year
7 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the
8 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
9 used for the purposes designated in subsections 1 and 2 and
10 for the following full-time equivalent positions:

11	\$	2,170,595
12	FTEs	9.00

13 1. Of the amount appropriated in this section, \$478,403
14 shall be expended by the public broadcasting division of the
15 department of education to provide support for functions
16 related to the network, including but not limited to the
17 following functions: development of distance learning
18 applications; development of a central information source on
19 the Internet relating to educational uses of the network;
20 second-line technical support for network sites; testing and
21 initializing sites onto the network; and coordinating the work
22 of the education telecommunications council.

23 2. Of the amount appropriated in this section, \$1,692,192
24 shall be allocated by the public broadcasting division of the
25 department of education to the regional telecommunications
26 councils established in section 8D.5. The regional
27 telecommunications councils shall use the funds to provide
28 technical assistance for network classrooms, planning and
29 troubleshooting for local area networks, scheduling of video
30 sites, and other related support activities.

31 Sec. 4. DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES. There is
32 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
33 division of information technology services of the department
34 of general services for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
35 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so

1 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
2 designated:

3 For the purpose of providing information technology
4 services to state agencies and for the following full-time
5 equivalent positions:

6	\$	3,563,943
7	FTEs	131.61

8 Sec. 5. POOLED TECHNOLOGY ACCOUNT.

9 1. a. A pooled technology account is established in the
10 office of the treasurer of state under the control of the
11 division of information technology services of the department
12 of general services and shall be used for the purpose of
13 supporting various technology programs as provided in this
14 section.

15 b. Notwithstanding the distribution formula contained in
16 section 8.62 for an operational appropriation which remains
17 unexpended or unencumbered for the fiscal year beginning July
18 1, 1999, 75 percent of the unexpended or unencumbered moneys
19 subject to section 8.62 are appropriated to the pooled
20 technology account. The remaining 25 percent of such moneys
21 shall remain with the entity to which the operational
22 appropriation was made. Notwithstanding section 8.33, for an
23 appropriation other than an operational appropriation as
24 provided in section 8.62 which remains unencumbered for the
25 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, 100 percent of the
26 unexpended or unencumbered moneys are appropriated to the
27 pooled technology account.

28 Notwithstanding this paragraph, the first \$7,500,000
29 subject to reversion and appropriation to the pooled
30 technology account under this paragraph shall be deposited in
31 the general fund to be used for balancing the state's budget
32 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June
33 30, 2001.

34 2. Moneys in the pooled technology account are allocated,
35 to the extent available, in the descending priority order for

1 use during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending
2 June 30, 2001, as follows:

3 a. The first \$2,727,004 shall be allocated to the Iowa
4 telecommunications and technology commission to be used solely
5 for maintenance and lease costs associated with Part III
6 connections.

7 b. The next \$4,000,000 shall be allocated to the division
8 of information technology services of the department of
9 general services for the projects designated in this paragraph
10 only, and in descending priority order as follows:

11 (1) The IowAccess project of the division of information
12 technology services of the department of general services.

13 (2) A process project office for the division of
14 information technology services of the department of general
15 services.

16 (3) An electronic data collection, management, and
17 reporting associated with the temporary assistance for needy
18 families (TANF) welfare reform program of the department of
19 human services.

20 (4) A child support recovery unit system for the
21 department of human services.

22 (5) A corrections offender network for the department of
23 corrections.

24 (6) The development of a resource house for the department
25 of workforce development.

26 (7) A data warehouse for the division of criminal and
27 juvenile justice planning of the department of human rights.

28 (8) Participation in the field automation and information
29 management system (FAIM) by the department of agriculture and
30 land stewardship.

31 (9) Gasoline measurement testing equipment for the
32 department of agriculture and land stewardship.

33 (10) An electronic benefits transfer system for the
34 department of human services.

35 (11) An electronic database directory of all health care

1 and support services available to senior citizens for the
2 department of elder affairs, as required under the senior
3 living program Act, as enacted in Senate File 2193, and for
4 other costs associated with the implementation of that
5 program.

6 c. The next \$3,000,000 shall be allocated to the office of
7 the secretary of state for the costs associated with filings
8 under the Uniform Commercial Code if House File 2513 is
9 enacted.

10 d. The next \$7,000,000 shall be allocated to the public
11 broadcasting division of the department of education for the
12 conversion to digital television broadcasts.

13 e. The next \$1,000,000 shall be allocated to the
14 university of northern Iowa for developing a twenty-first
15 century learning initiative. The university of northern Iowa
16 shall consult with the division of information technology
17 services of the department of general services in developing
18 this initiative.

19 f. The next \$7,000,000 shall be allocated to the division
20 of information technology services of the department of
21 general services for the projects designated in this paragraph
22 only, and in descending priority order as follows:

- 23 (1) An electronic data warehouse for the department of
24 human services.
- 25 (2) Establishment of an Iowa communications network room
26 in the state historical building for the department of
27 cultural affairs.
- 28 (3) An electronic data interchange for the department of
29 education.
- 30 (4) Developing and implementing an electronic professional
31 license renewal system for the division of information
32 technology services of the department of general services.
- 33 (5) Developing and implementing an electronic system for
34 vital records for the Iowa department of public health.
- 35 (6) Telefiling of tax returns for the department of

1 revenue and finance.

2 (7) Developing and implementing an on-line system for
3 issuing environmental permits for the department of natural
4 resources.

5 g. The next \$3,500,000 shall be allocated to the Iowa
6 telecommunications and technology commission for continued
7 buildout of asynchronous transfer mode technology for the
8 network.

9 h. The next \$3,500,000 shall be allocated to the Iowa
10 telecommunications and technology commission for continued
11 buildout of asynchronous transfer mode technology for the
12 network.

13 3. A department or agency receiving an appropriation under
14 subsection 2 shall consult with the division of information
15 technology services in the department of general services
16 regarding any technology purchase, lease, or contract, prior
17 to making a purchase or entering into a lease or contract.

18 4. Effective July 1, 2001, the division of information
19 technology in the department of general services shall not
20 deposit any additional moneys into the pooled technology
21 account, unless reauthorized to do so by the general assembly
22 during the 2001 regular session. Funds allocated to a project
23 pursuant to this section which are encumbered prior to July 1,
24 2001, may be spent for the specified purpose as provided in
25 this Act. Funds which are allocated but unencumbered as of
26 July 1, 2001, shall revert to the general fund.

27 5. The department of management, in cooperation with the
28 division of information technology services of the department
29 of general services, shall develop a standard budget request
30 form for technology or business reengineering projects. A
31 department requesting funding for projects which will cost
32 more than \$100,000 shall use the request form. The form shall
33 require consistent reporting criteria including, but not
34 limited to, project description, project goals, project
35 performance measures, return on investment, cost, time frame,

1 funding sources, and customer base.

2 Sec. 6. FUNDING FOR IOWACCESS.

3 1. Notwithstanding section 321A.3, subsection 1, for the
4 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001,
5 the first \$1,000,000 collected and transferred by the
6 department of transportation to the treasurer of state with
7 respect to the fees for transactions involving the furnishing
8 of a certified abstract of a vehicle operating record under
9 section 321A.3, subsection 1, shall be allocated as follows:

10 a. Four hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to
11 the IowAccess revolving fund created in section 18.187 and
12 administered by the division of information technology
13 services of the department of general services for the
14 purposes of developing, implementing, maintaining, and
15 expanding electronic access to government records in
16 accordance with the requirements set forth in chapter 18,
17 division VII.

18 b. Six hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to
19 the division of information technology services of the
20 department of general services to be used for general
21 operating expenditures of the division.

22 2. It is the intent of the general assembly that all fees
23 collected with respect to transactions involving IowAccess
24 shall be deposited in the IowAccess revolving fund created in
25 section 18.187 and shall be used only for the support of
26 IowAccess projects.

27 Sec. 7. 2000 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2395, if enacted, is
28 amended by adding the following new section:

29 SEC. ____ . NEW SECTION. 14B.102A OPERATIONS REVOLVING
30 FUND.

31 An operations revolving fund is created in the state
32 treasury. The operations revolving fund shall be administered
33 by the department and shall consist of moneys collected by the
34 department as fees, moneys appropriated by the general
35 assembly, and any other moneys obtained or accepted by the

1 department for deposit in the revolving fund. The proceeds of
2 the revolving fund are appropriated to and shall be used by
3 the department for the operations of the department consistent
4 with this chapter. The department shall submit an annual
5 report not later than January 31, to the members of the
6 general assembly and the legislative fiscal bureau, of the
7 activities funded by and expenditures made from the revolving
8 fund during the preceding fiscal year. Section 8.33 does not
9 apply to any moneys in the revolving fund and, notwithstanding
10 section 12C.7, subsection 2, earnings or interest on moneys
11 deposited in the revolving fund shall be credited to the
12 revolving fund.

13 Sec. 8. Section 18.183, subsections 1 and 2, Code
14 Supplement 1999, are amended to read as follows:

15 1. The government agency that is the lawful custodian of a
16 public record shall be responsible for determining whether a
17 record is required by state statute to be confidential. The
18 transmission of a record by a government agency by use of
19 electronic means established, maintained, or managed by the
20 ~~division-of-information-technology-services~~ department shall
21 not constitute a transfer of the legal custody of the record
22 from the individual government agency to the ~~division-of~~
23 ~~information-technology-services~~ department or to any other
24 person or entity.

25 2. The ~~division-of-information-technology-services~~
26 department shall not have authority to determine whether an
27 individual government agency should automate records of which
28 the individual government agency is the lawful custodian.
29 However, the ~~division~~ department may encourage governmental
30 agencies to implement electronic access to government records.

31 Sec. 9. Section 18.184, Code 1999, is amended to read as
32 follows:

33 18.184 FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS.

34 1. The ~~division-of-information-technology-services~~
35 department shall collect moneys paid to participating

1 governmental entities from persons who complete an electronic
2 financial transaction with the governmental entity by
3 accessing the IowAccess network. The moneys may include all
4 of the following:

5 a. Fees required to obtain an electronic public record as
6 provided in section 22.3A.

7 b. Fees required to process an application or file a
8 document, including but not limited to fees required to obtain
9 a license issued by a licensing authority.

10 c. Moneys owed to a governmental entity by a person
11 accessing the IowAccess network in order to satisfy a
12 liability arising from the operation of law, including the
13 payment of assessments, taxes, fines, and civil penalties.

14 2. Moneys transferred using the IowAccess network may
15 include amounts owed by a governmental entity to a person
16 accessing the IowAccess network in order to satisfy a
17 liability of the governmental entity. The moneys may include
18 the payment of tax refunds, and the disbursement of support
19 payments as defined in section 252D.16 or 598.1 as required
20 for orders issued pursuant to section 252B.14.

21 3. ~~The division-of-information-technology-services~~
22 department shall serve as the agent of the governmental entity
23 in collecting moneys for receipt by governmental entities.
24 The moneys shall be transferred to governmental entities
25 directly or to the treasurer of state for disbursement to
26 governmental entities as required by the treasurer of state in
27 cooperation with the auditor of state.

28 4. In addition to other forms of payment, credit cards
29 shall be accepted in payment for moneys owed to a governmental
30 entity as provided in this section, according to rules which
31 shall be adopted by the treasurer of state. The fees to be
32 charged shall not exceed those permitted by statute. A
33 governmental entity may adjust its fees to reflect the cost of
34 processing as determined by the treasurer of state. The
35 discount charged by the credit card issuer may be included in

1 determining the fees to be paid for completing a financial
2 transaction under this section by using a credit card.

3 Sec. 10. Section 18.185, Code 1999, is amended to read as
4 follows:

5 18.185 AUDITS REQUIRED.

6 A technology audit of the electronic transmission system by
7 which government records are transmitted electronically to the
8 public shall be conducted not less than once annually for the
9 purpose of determining that government records and other
10 electronic data are not misappropriated or misused by the
11 ~~division-of-information-technology-services~~ department or a
12 contractor of the ~~division~~ department. A financial audit
13 shall be conducted not less than once annually to determine
14 the financial condition of the ~~division-of-information~~
15 ~~technology-services~~ department and to make other relevant
16 inquiries.

17 Sec. 11. Section 18.187, Code Supplement 1999, is amended
18 to read as follows:

19 18.187 IOWACCESS REVOLVING FUND.

20 An IowAccess revolving fund is created in the state
21 treasury. The revolving fund shall be administered by the
22 ~~division~~ department and shall consist of moneys collected by
23 the ~~division~~ department as fees, moneys appropriated by the
24 general assembly, and any other moneys obtained or accepted by
25 the ~~division~~ department for deposit in the revolving fund.
26 The proceeds of the revolving fund are appropriated to and
27 shall be used by the ~~division~~ department to maintain, develop,
28 operate, and expand the IowAccess network consistent with this
29 ~~chapter~~ subchapter. The ~~division~~ department shall submit an
30 annual report not later than January 31, to the members of the
31 general assembly and the legislative fiscal bureau, of the
32 activities funded by and expenditures made from the revolving
33 fund during the preceding fiscal year. Section 8.33 does not
34 apply to any moneys in the revolving fund and, notwithstanding
35 section 12C.7, subsection 2, earnings or interest on moneys

1 deposited in the revolving fund shall be credited to the
2 revolving fund.

3 Sec. 12. Notwithstanding 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 210,
4 section 10, subsection 1, paragraph "f", any moneys
5 appropriated to the reversion incentive program fund
6 established in 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 210, section 10, which
7 remain unobligated or unexpended on the effective date of this
8 section of this Act shall be transferred to the pooled
9 technology account established in section 5 of this Act.

10 Sec. 13. 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1224, section 7,
11 subsection 2, paragraph j, is amended to read as follows:

12 j. To the department of revenue and finance for a
13 remittance processing system:

14 \$ 1,500,000

15 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
16 department of revenue and finance in this paragraph "j" which
17 remain unobligated or unexpended at the close of the fiscal
18 year shall not revert but shall remain available for
19 expenditure for the purpose for which allocated in this
20 paragraph "j" for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
21 ending June 30, 2001.

22 Sec. 14. 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1224, section 7,
23 subsection 2, paragraph r, as amended by 1999 Iowa Acts,
24 chapter 207, section 18, is amended to read as follows:

25 r. To the department of general services for a purchasing
26 system:

27 \$ 2,500,000

28 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
29 department of general services in this paragraph "r" which
30 remain unobligated or unexpended at-the-close-of-the-fiscal
31 year on the effective date of this section of this Act shall
32 not-revert-but-shall-remain-available-for-the-purpose
33 designated-in-this-paragraph-"r"-for-the-fiscal-year-beginning
34 July-17-1999,-and-ending-June-30,-2000 be transferred to the
35 pooled technology account established in section 5 of this

1 Act.

2 Sec. 15. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 196, section 1, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 SECTION 1. DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES -- EMBEDDED
5 CHIPS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
6 infrastructure fund to the division of information technology
7 services of the department of general services for the fiscal
8 year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, to
9 supplement the moneys in the reversion incentive program fund
10 as provided in 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 210, section 10, the
11 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
12 used for the purpose designated:

13 For the replacement of noncompliant year 2000 embedded
14 chips in the technology and equipment of state departments,
15 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
16 \$ 2,435,000

17 Moneys appropriated in this section shall be deposited into
18 the reversion incentive program fund created pursuant to 1997
19 Iowa Acts, chapter 210, section 10.

20 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
21 section which remain unencumbered or unobligated ~~at the close~~
22 ~~of the fiscal year on the effective date of this section of~~
23 this Act shall not revert but shall remain available for
24 ~~expenditure for the purpose designated until the close of the~~
25 ~~fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and any unobligated or~~
26 ~~unencumbered moneys remaining on that date shall be credited~~
27 ~~to the general fund of the state~~ be transferred to the pooled
28 technology account established in section 5 of this Act.

29 Sec. 16. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 207, section 5,
30 subsection 3, paragraphs d, e, g, i, and l, are amended to
31 read as follows:

32 d. To the department of human services for a welfare
33 reform system (TANF):
34 \$ 742,555

35 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the

1 department of human services in this paragraph "d" which
2 remain unobligated or unexpended at the close of the fiscal
3 year shall not revert but shall remain available for the
4 purpose designated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000,
5 and ending June 30, 2001.

6 e. To the department of human services for a child support
7 recovery project:

8 \$ 1,131,976

9 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
10 department of human services in this paragraph "e" which
11 remain unobligated or unexpended at the close of the fiscal
12 year shall not revert but shall remain available for the
13 purpose designated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000,
14 and ending June 30, 2001.

15 g. To the department of education for electronic data
16 exchange (EASIER):

17 \$ 500,000

18 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
19 department of education in this paragraph "g" which remain
20 unobligated or unexpended at the close of the fiscal year
21 shall not revert but shall remain available for the purpose
22 designated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
23 ending June 30, 2001.

24 i. To the division of information technology services in
25 the department of general services for reengineering projects:
26 \$ 1,750,000

27 Of the amounts appropriated in this paragraph "i", \$750,000
28 shall be allocated as follows:

29 (1) One hundred thousand dollars for the development of a
30 business licensure center for the department of economic
31 development.

32 (2) Five hundred thousand dollars for a community
33 resources directory for the department of Iowa workforce
34 development.

35 (3) One hundred fifty thousand dollars for the

1 implementation of an enterprise-wide information security
2 system plan.

3 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
4 division of information technology services in this paragraph
5 "i", other than the moneys allocated in this paragraph "i",
6 subparagraphs (1) and (3), which remain unobligated or
7 unexpended at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert
8 but shall remain available for the purpose for which allocated
9 in the subparagraph for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
10 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.

11 1. To the office of the governor for technology upgrades:
12 \$ 45,000

13 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys allocated to the
14 office of the governor in this paragraph "1" which remain
15 unobligated or unexpanded at the close of the fiscal year
16 shall not revert but shall remain available for the purpose
17 designated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
18 ending June 30, 2001.

19 Sec. 17. CONDITIONAL EFFECTIVENESS.

20 1. Sections 7 through 11 of this Act take effect upon the
21 effective date of an enactment of the general assembly during
22 the 2000 regular legislative session, signed by the governor,
23 which establishes an information technology department. If
24 sections 7 through 11 take effect pursuant to this subsection,
25 the Code editor shall transfer sections 18.183, 18.184,
26 18.185, and 18.187, as amended by this Act, and section 18.186
27 to the new Code chapter establishing an information technology
28 department, as appropriate. The term "department" in sections
29 18.183, 18.184, 18.185, and 18.187, as amended by this Act,
30 means the information technology department.

31 2. The references to the division of information
32 technology services of the department of general services in
33 this Act, if enacted, shall be corrected by the Code editor to
34 refer to the information technology department, if an
35 information technology department is established by enactment

2 session, and signed by the governor.

3 Sec. 18. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 5, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16,
4 and 17 of this Act, being deemed of immediate importance, take
5 effect upon enactment.

6 EXPLANATION

7 This bill relates to state government technology operations
8 by making appropriations to a number of entities for such
9 technology. Specifically the bill makes appropriations for
10 the 2000-2001 fiscal year from the general fund of the state
11 for debt service associated with the Iowa communications
12 network, for subsidization of operations of the network
13 necessary as a result of charging authorized users video rates
14 which generate less revenue than necessary to cover associated
15 costs of the network, for support functions related to the
16 network provided by the public broadcasting division of the
17 department of education, and for information technology
18 services provided by the division of information technology
19 services of the department of general services to other state
20 agencies.

21 The bill creates a pooled technology account in the office
22 of the treasurer of state under the control of the division of
23 information technology services of the department of general
24 services for the purpose of supporting various technology
25 projects. The account is to be funded by taking a portion of
26 funds which are subject to reversion from the 1999-2000 fiscal
27 year, and by transferring certain moneys which have been
28 previously appropriated but which have not been spent. The
29 technology projects specified are to be funded in the order
30 provided in the bill to the extent that funds are available.

31 The bill provides for funding for IowAccess and provides
32 that it is the intent of the general assembly that all fees
33 collected associated with transactions through IowAccess are
34 to be deposited in the IowAccess revolving fund created in
35 Code section 18.187 and shall be used only for the support of

1 IowAccess projects.

2 The bill creates a new Code section 14B.102A which creates
3 an operations revolving fund for an information technology
4 department, if such department is created during the 2000
5 regular session.

6 The bill provides for the transfer of Code sections
7 relating to IowAccess if an information technology department
8 is established during the 2000 regular session.

9 The bill provides that certain appropriations made in prior
10 years are not to revert but are to remain available for the
11 purposes for which appropriated for the 2000-2001 fiscal year.

12 The bill provides an immediate effective date for portions
13 of the bill.

1 Section 1. TREASURER OF STATE. There is appropriated from
 2 the general fund of the state to the treasurer of state for
 3 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,

EXPLANATION

7 This bill relates to state government technology operations
8 by making appropriations to a number of entities for such
9 technology. Specifically the bill makes appropriations for
10 the 2000-2001 fiscal year from the general fund of the state
11 for debt service associated with the Iowa communications
12 network, for subsidization of operations of the network
13 necessary as a result of charging authorized users video rates
14 which generate less revenue than necessary to cover associated
15 costs of the network, for support functions related to the
16 network provided by the public broadcasting division of the
17 department of education, and for information technology
18 services provided by the division of information technology
19 services of the department of general services to other state
20 agencies.

21 The bill creates a pooled technology account in the office
22 of the treasurer of state under the control of the division of
23 information technology services of the department of general
24 services for the purpose of supporting various technology
25 projects. The account is to be funded by taking a portion of
26 funds which are subject to reversion from the 1999-2000 fiscal
27 year, and by transferring certain moneys which have been
28 previously appropriated but which have not been spent. The
29 technology projects specified are to be funded in the order
30 provided in the bill to the extent that funds are available.

31 The bill provides for funding for IowAccess and provides
32 that it is the intent of the general assembly that all fees
33 collected associated with transactions through IowAccess are
34 to be deposited in the IowAccess revolving fund created in
35 Code section 18.187 and shall be used only for the support of

1 IowAccess projects.

2 The bill creates a new Code section 14B.102A which creates
3 an operations revolving fund for an information technology
4 department, if such department is created during the 2000
5 regular session.

6 The bill provides for the transfer of Code sections
7 relating to IowAccess if an information technology department
8 is established during the 2000 regular session.

9 The bill provides that certain appropriations made in prior
10 years are not to revert but are to remain available for the
11 purposes for which appropriated for the 2000-2001 fiscal year.

12 The bill provides an immediate effective date for portions
13 of the bill.
