For purposes of this subsection, a person 12 is considered to be retired if the person served-twenty-years 13 or-łonger-in is recognized by the United States armed forces

## EXPLANATION

This bill provides that persons who are recognized by the United States armed forces as retired from the United States armed forces are considered to be "retired" for purposes of obtaining a United States armed forces retired motor vehicle license plate. Currently, only persons who have served 20 years or longer or persons who have served 10 years or longer and received an honorable discharge due to a medical disqualification are eligible to receive the special plate.
