Section 1. Section 321.34, subsection 19, Code Supplement 2 1999, is amended to read as follows:

19. UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES RETIRED SPECIAL PLATES. 3 An 4 owner referred to in subsection 12 who is a retired member of 5 the United States armed forces, may, upon written application 6 to the department and upon presentation of satisfactory proof 7 of membership, order special registration plates with a United 8 States armed forces retired processed emblem. The emblem 9 shall be designed by the department in consultation with 10 service organizations. The application is subject to approval 11 by the department. For purposes of this subsection, a person 12 is considered to be retired if the person served-twenty-years 13 or-longer-in is recognized by the United States armed forces 14 or-is-a-person-who-served-a-minimum-of-ten-years-and-received 15 an-honorable-discharge-from-service-due-to-a-medical 16 disqualification as retired from the United States armed

17 forces.

EXPLANATION

-1-

19 This bill provides that persons who are recognized by the 20 United States armed forces as retired from the United States 21 armed forces are considered to be "retired" for purposes of 22 obtaining a United States armed forces retired motor vehicle 23 license plate. Currently, only persons who have served 20 24 years or longer or persons who have served 10 years or longer 25 and received an honorable discharge due to a medical 26 disqualification are eligible to receive the special plate. 27
