A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations from the rebuild
2 Iowa infrastructure fund to state departments and agencies,
3 including the department for the blind, the department of
4 corrections, the department of cultural affairs, the
5 department of economic development, the department of general
6 services, the judicial branch, the department of public
7 safety, the state board of regents, the state department of
8 transportation, the office of treasurer of state, and the
9 commission of veterans affairs, creating an environment first
10 fund and making appropriations from that fund for
11 environmental purposes, making related Code language changes,
12 and providing effective dates.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

DEPARTMENT FOR THE BLIND

Section 1. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department for the blind for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

For improvements to the facility for the blind:

..... \$ 122,000

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of corrections for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. To supplement funds appropriated in 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1219, section 2, subsection 3, for construction of a 200-bed facility at the Iowa state penitentiary at Fort Madison:

..... \$ 3,000,000

2. For community-based corrections projects in Council Bluffs:

..... \$ 300,000

DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

For historical site preservation grants, to be used for the restoration, preservation, and development of historical sites:

..... \$ 2,500,000

Historical site preservation grants shall only be awarded

1 for projects which meet the definition of "vertical
2 infrastructure" in section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c".

3 In making grants pursuant to this section, the department
4 shall consider the existence and amount of other funds
5 available to an applicant for the designated project. Each
6 grant awarded from moneys appropriated in this section shall
7 not exceed \$100,000 per project. Not more than two grants may
8 be awarded in each county.

9 DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

10 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
11 infrastructure fund to the department of economic development
12 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June
13 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
14 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

- 15 1. To be deposited in the physical infrastructure
- 16 assistance fund created in section 15E.175:
- 17 \$ 2,500,000

18 The department shall maximize the moneys appropriated in
19 this subsection, to the extent possible, for physical
20 infrastructure assistance program projects which meet the
21 definition of "vertical infrastructure" in section 8.57,
22 subsection 5, paragraph "c", or for projects which facilitate
23 the creation of "vertical infrastructure" projects. The
24 department shall report to the general assembly by June 30 of
25 each fiscal year for which funds are appropriated in this
26 subsection regarding the amount of such funds used for
27 "vertical infrastructure" projects and the amount of such
28 funds used for projects which facilitate the creation of
29 "vertical infrastructure".

- 30 2. For accelerated career education program capital
- 31 projects at community colleges which are authorized under
- 32 chapter 260G and which meet the definition of "vertical
- 33 infrastructure" in section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
- 34 \$ 3,000,000

35 The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be

1 allocated equally among the community colleges in the state.
2 If any portion of the equal allocation to a community college
3 is not obligated or encumbered by April 1, 2001, the
4 unobligated and unencumbered portions shall be available for
5 use by other community colleges.

6 3. For deposit in the rural enterprise fund to be used for
7 the dry fire hydrant and rural water supply education and
8 demonstration project, notwithstanding section 8.57,
9 subsection 5, paragraph "c":

10 \$ 200,000

11 DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

12 Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
13 infrastructure fund to the department of general services for
14 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
15 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
16 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

17 For capital projects and improvements at Terrace Hill:

18 \$ 1,200,000

19 Sec. 6. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 121, sections 11 and 12,
20 are amended by striking the sections.

21 Sec. 7. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 4, subsection
22 1, is amended to read as follows:

23 1. For major renovation and major repair needs including
24 health, life, and fire safety, for compliance with the federal
25 Americans With Disabilities Act for state-owned buildings and
26 facilities:

27 FY 1999-2000 \$ 7,500,000

28 FY 2000-2001 \$ 7,500,000

29 Notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c",
30 of the amount appropriated for each the fiscal year beginning
31 July 1, 1999, in this subsection, up to \$800,000 may be used
32 by the department for routine maintenance needs for the
33 capitol complex.

34 The moneys appropriated in this subsection for the fiscal
35 year beginning July 1, 2000, shall be used for the repair or

1 replacement of building components to return state-owned
2 buildings or facilities to their intended uses or to make them
3 compliant with changes in laws, regulations, or codes. The
4 moneys shall be allocated in accordance with the priorities
5 and recommendations set forth by the vertical infrastructure
6 advisory committee.

7 Sec. 8. 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 4, subsection
8 15, is amended by striking the subsection.

9 Sec. 9. 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1219, section 6,
10 subsection 1, unnumbered paragraphs 3 and 4, as amended and
11 enacted by 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 39, are
12 amended to read as follows:

13 Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to
14 \$1,250,000 may be used by the department for the purchase,
15 demolition, assessment, and site conditioning of property
16 located at the southwest corner of Byon street and East Tenth
17 street, together with the contiguous property south of the
18 southwest corner property and the property between East Tenth
19 street and East Eleventh street between Byon street and Des
20 Moines street, all within the following boundaries: south of
21 interstate 235, north of Grand avenue, east of Pennsylvania
22 avenue, and west of East Fourteenth street in the city of Des
23 Moines.

24 Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to
25 \$430,000 may be used by the department to complete the
26 infrastructure assessment, notwithstanding section 8.57,
27 subsection 5, paragraph "c".

28 JUDICIAL BRANCH

29 Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
30 infrastructure fund to the judicial branch for the fiscal year
31 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, the
32 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
33 used for the purpose designated:

34 For construction of a new judicial building:
..... \$ 8,300,000

1 The judicial branch is authorized to enter into contracts
2 for the full cost of the planning, design, and construction of
3 a new judicial building for which appropriations are made in
4 this section and in 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1223, section 8,
5 and 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204, section 6. The state shall
6 not be obligated for costs associated with contracts
7 identified in this paragraph in excess of funds appropriated
8 by the general assembly. Notwithstanding any provision of
9 this Act to the contrary or section 8.33, moneys appropriated
10 in this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
11 close of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2003, shall
12 revert at the close of that fiscal year. However, if the
13 project for which the moneys are appropriated is completed in
14 an earlier fiscal year, unencumbered or unobligated moneys
15 shall revert at the close of that fiscal year.

16 Sec. 11. 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1219, section 8, is
17 amended to read as follows:

18 SEC. 8. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
19 infrastructure fund to the judicial department for the fiscal
20 year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, the
21 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
22 used for the purpose designated:

23 For capital projects at the capitol building:

24 \$ 250,000

25 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
26 funds remaining on June 30, ~~2000~~, 2002, from the funds
27 appropriated in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
28 infrastructure fund on August 31, ~~2000~~ 2002.

29 Sec. 12. 1998 Iowa Acts, chapter 1223, section 8, is
30 amended to read as follows:

31 SEC. 8. JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT. There is appropriated from
32 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the judicial
33 department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and
34 ending June 30, 1998, the following amount, or so much thereof
35 as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

1 For design and development of a new judicial building:
2 \$ 1,700,000

3 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
4 funds remaining on June 30, ~~2000~~, 2003, from the funds
5 appropriated in this section shall revert to the rebuild Iowa
6 infrastructure fund on August 31, ~~2000~~ 2003.

7 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

8 Sec. 13. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
9 infrastructure fund to the department of public safety for the
10 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001,
11 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to
12 be used for the purpose designated:

13 For planning, design, and construction of a new building to
14 house department offices and crime laboratory space and state
15 medical examiner laboratory, office, and related space:
16 \$ 8,500,000

7 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

8 Sec. 14. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
19 infrastructure fund to the state board of regents for the
20 fiscal period beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
21 2003, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
22 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

23 1. For improvements to Gilman hall at Iowa state
24 university of science and technology, including the
25 replacement of the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning
26 system, replacement of the fume hood exhaust system, and the
27 construction of an addition to house mechanical equipment:
28 FY 2000-2001..... \$ 8,500,000
29 FY 2001-2002..... \$ 2,500,000
30 FY 2002-2003..... \$ 0

31 2. For continued renovation of the biological sciences
32 facility at the state university of Iowa:
33 FY 2000-2001..... \$ 4,700,000
34 FY 2001-2002..... \$ 7,000,000
FY 2002-2003..... \$ 3,000,000

1 3. For construction of an addition to McCollum science
 2 hall at the university of northern Iowa:
 3 FY 2000-2001..... \$ 3,000,000
 4 FY 2001-2002..... \$ 5,500,000
 5 FY 2002-2003..... \$ 8,400,000

6 4. For planning and design of a new business college
 7 building at Iowa state university of science and technology,
 8 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
 9 FY 2000-2001..... \$ 300,000
 10 FY 2001-2002..... \$ 0
 11 FY 2002-2003..... \$ 0

12 The state board of regents is authorized to enter into
 13 contracts for the full cost of carrying out the projects
 14 listed in subsections 1 through 3, for which appropriations
 15 are made in those subsections. The state shall not be
 16 obligated for costs associated with contracts identified in
 17 this paragraph in excess of the funds appropriated by the
 18 general assembly.

19 STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

20 Sec. 15. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
 21 infrastructure fund to the state department of transportation
 22 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June
 23 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
 24 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

25 1. For vertical infrastructure improvements at all 10 of
 26 the commercial air service airports within the state:
 27 \$ 1,000,000

28 One-half of the funds appropriated in this subsection shall
 29 be allocated equally between each commercial service airport,
 30 40 percent of the funds shall be allocated based on the
 31 percentage that the number of enplaned passengers at each
 32 commercial service airport bears to the total number of
 33 enplaned passengers in the state during the previous fiscal
 34 year, and 10 percent of the funds shall be allocated based on
 35 the percentage that the air cargo tonnage at each commercial

1 service airport bears to the total air cargo tonnage in the
2 state during the previous fiscal year. In order for a
3 commercial service airport to receive funding under this
4 subsection, the airport shall be required to submit
5 applications for funding of specific projects to the
6 department for approval by the state transportation
7 commission.

8 2. For deposit in an aviation hangar revolving loan fund,
9 as created in this Act, for improvements to and design and
10 construction of hangars at general aviation airports within
11 the state:

12 \$ 500,000

13 OFFICE OF TREASURER OF STATE

14 Sec. 16. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
15 infrastructure fund to the office of treasurer of state for
16 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
17 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
18 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

19 For county fair infrastructure improvements for
20 distribution in accordance with chapter 174 to qualified fairs
21 which belong to the association of Iowa fairs:
22 \$ 1,060,000

23 COMMISSION OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

24 Sec. 17. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
25 infrastructure fund to the commission of veterans affairs for
26 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
27 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
28 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

29 To supplement moneys appropriated in prior fiscal years for
30 construction of a new dining hall and food services facility:
31 \$ 992,000

32 Sec. 18. REVERSION. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys
33 appropriated in this division of this Act that remain
34 unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year
that begins July 1, 2003, shall revert at the close of that

1 fiscal year. However, if the projects for which the moneys
2 are appropriated are completed in an earlier fiscal year,
3 unencumbered or unobligated moneys shall revert at the close
4 of that fiscal year.

5 Sec. 19. EFFECTIVE DATE. The following sections of this
6 division of this Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
7 take effect upon enactment:

8 1. Section 6, amending 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 121,
9 sections 11 and 12.

10 2. Sections 7 and 8, amending 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 204,
11 section 4, subsections 1 and 15.

20 DIVISION II

21 RESTORE THE OUTDOORS PROGRAM

22 AND ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND

23 Sec. 20. Section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph e, Code
24 1999, is amended to read as follows:

25 e. Notwithstanding provisions to the contrary in sections
26 99D.17 and 99F.11, for the fiscal years beginning July 1,
27 1995, and ~~July 1, 1996~~ for each fiscal year thereafter, not
28 more than a total of sixty million dollars, ~~and for each~~
29 ~~fiscal year thereafter~~, shall be deposited in the general fund
30 of the state in any fiscal year pursuant to sections 99D.17
31 and 99F.11. The next thirty-five million dollars of the
32 moneys directed to be deposited in the general fund of the
33 state pursuant to sections 99D.17 and 99F.11 shall be
34 deposited in the environment first fund created in section
35 8.57A. The total moneys in excess of the moneys deposited in

1 the general fund of the state and the environment first fund
2 in a fiscal year shall be deposited in the infrastructure fund
3 and shall be used as provided in this section, notwithstanding
4 section 8.60.

5 Sec. 21. NEW SECTION. 8.57A ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND.

6 1. An environment first fund is created under the
7 authority of the department of management. The fund shall
8 consist of appropriations made to the fund and transfers of
9 interest, earnings, and moneys from other funds as provided by
10 law. The fund shall be separate from the general fund of the
11 state and the balance in the fund shall not be considered part
12 of the balance of the general fund of the state. However, the
13 fund shall be considered a special account for the purposes of
14 section 8.53, relating to generally accepted accounting
15 principles.

16 2. Moneys in the environment first fund are not subject to
17 section 8.33. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, subsection 2,
18 interest or earnings on moneys in the environment first fund
19 shall be credited to the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund.

20 3. Moneys in the fund in a fiscal year shall be used as
21 appropriated by the general assembly for the protection,
22 conservation, enhancement, or improvement of natural resources
23 or the environment.

24 Sec. 22. Section 8.58, Code 1999, is amended to read as
25 follows:

26 8.58 EXEMPTION FROM AUTOMATIC APPLICATION.

27 To the extent that moneys appropriated under section 8.57
28 do not result in moneys being credited to the general fund
29 under section 8.55, subsection 2, moneys appropriated under
30 section 8.57 and moneys contained in the cash reserve fund,
31 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, and
32 Iowa economic emergency fund shall not be considered in the
33 application of any formula, index, or other statutory
34 triggering mechanism which would affect appropriations,
35 payments, or taxation rates, contrary provisions of the Code

1 notwithstanding.

2 To the extent that moneys appropriated under section 8.57
3 do not result in moneys being credited to the general fund
4 under section 8.55, subsection 2, moneys appropriated under
5 section 8.57 and moneys contained in the cash reserve fund,
6 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, environment first fund, and
7 Iowa economic emergency fund shall not be considered by an
8 arbitrator or in negotiations under chapter 20.

9 Sec. 23. Section 461A.3A, subsection 2, unnumbered
10 paragraph 1, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

11 There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
12 fund for each fiscal year of the fiscal period beginning July
13 1, 1997, and ending June 30, ~~2001~~ 2004, the sum of three
14 million dollars to the department for use in the restore the
15 outdoors program. Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered
16 or unobligated moneys remaining at the end of a fiscal year
17 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure
18 during the following fiscal year for purposes of the restore
19 the outdoors program.

20 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

21 Sec. 24. There is appropriated from the environment first
22 fund to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for
23 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,
24 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
25 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

26 1. To implement a conservation reserve enhanced program to
27 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of
28 intercepting tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss,
29 improving water quality, and enhancing agricultural production
30 practices:

31 \$ 1,500,000

32 2. For implementation of a program that provides multi-
33 objective resource protections for flood control, water
34 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:

35 \$ 1,450,000

1 3. To initiate a statewide voluntary farm management
 2 demonstration program to demonstrate the effectiveness and
 3 adaptability of emerging practices in agronomy that protect
 4 water resources and provide other environmental benefits:
 5 \$ 850,000

6 4. For assisting farm operators in applying for project
 7 grants associated with the statewide voluntary farm management
 8 demonstration program:
 9 \$ 50,000

10 5. For assistance in writing plans for the reclamation of
 11 lands and water which were mined for coal or affected by
 12 mining processes:
 13 \$ 50,000

14 6. For deposit in the alternative drainage system
 15 assistance fund created in section 159.29A to be used for
 16 purposes of supporting the alternative drainage system
 17 assistance program as provided in section 159.29B:
 18 \$ 1,300,000

19 Of the amount appropriated in this section, \$300,000 shall
 20 be allocated to drainage district 176 to provide cost-share
 21 assistance for closing agricultural drainage wells and
 22 constructing alternative drainage systems in order to assist
 23 in raising the level of cost-share payments to 75 percent of
 24 the cost of the projects.

25 7. To provide financial assistance for the establishment
 26 of permanent soil and water conservation practices:
 27 \$ 2,000,000

28 a. Not more than 5 percent of the moneys appropriated in
 29 this subsection may be allocated for cost-sharing to abate
 30 complaints filed under section 161A.47.

31 b. Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, 5
 32 percent shall be allocated for financial incentives to
 33 establish practices to protect watersheds above publicly owned
 34 lakes of the state from soil erosion and sediment as provided
 in section 161A.73.

1 c. Not more than 30 percent of a district's allocation of
2 moneys as financial incentives may be provided for the purpose
3 of establishing management practices to control soil erosion
4 on land that is row-cropped, including but not limited to no-
5 till planting, ridge-till planting, contouring, and contour
6 strip-cropping as provided in section 161A.73.

7 d. The state soil conservation committee created in
8 section 161A.4 may allocate moneys appropriated in this
9 subsection to conduct research and demonstration projects to
10 promote conservation tillage and nonpoint source pollution
11 control practices.

12 e. The financial incentive payments may be used in
13 combination with department of natural resources moneys.

14 8. To encourage and assist farmers in enrolling in the
15 continuous sign-up federal conservation reserve program and
16 work with them to enhance their revegetation efforts to
17 improve water quality and habitat:

18 \$ 1,500,000

19 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

20 Sec. 25. There is appropriated from the environment first
21 fund to the department of natural resources for the fiscal
22 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the
23 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
24 used for the purposes designated:

25 1. To establish a program to assist rural homeowners in
26 improving on-site wastewater systems:
27 \$ 600,000

28 2. To provide local watershed managers with geographic
29 information system data for their use in developing,
30 monitoring, and displaying results of their watershed work:
31 \$ 195,000

32 3. For continuing the establishment and operation of water
33 quality monitoring stations:
34 \$ 1,950,000

35 4. To develop a program to support local volunteer

1 management efforts in water quality programs:
2 \$ 70,000
3 5. To establish and implement improved water quality
4 planning, standards, and assessment:
5 \$ 372,000
6 6. For contracting to assist department staff with the
7 review of national pollutant discharge elimination system
8 permits:
9 \$ 250,000
10 7. To expand the floodplain protection education to better
11 inform local officials that make decisions with regard to
12 floodplain management:
13 \$ 200,000
14 8. To identify an effective and efficient method of
15 developing a total maximum daily load program:
16 \$ 153,000
17 9. For the dredging of lakes, including necessary
18 preparation for dredging, in accordance with the department's
19 classification of Iowa lakes restoration report:
20 \$ 2,900,000
21 a. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to
22 \$200,000 may be used by the department to provide assistance
23 to qualified applicants for purposes of financing capital
24 improvements to natural or constructed lakes including but not
25 limited to dredging, installation or repair of erosion control
26 measures, and land acquisition. To qualify for assistance, an
27 applicant must be a nonprofit organization based in the
28 community where the lake is located which is active in
29 sponsoring improvements to the lake and is capable of managing
30 or overseeing the improvements or be a governmental body.
31 Assistance shall not be provided to construct a new lake.
32 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this subsection, the
33 department may consider grants for any public lakes.
34 b. To qualify for assistance under paragraph "a", an
applicant must demonstrate that existing or planned

1 infrastructure and practices are capable of ensuring long-term
2 benefits to the lake. An applicant must also show that each
3 dollar of assistance will be matched by one dollar contributed
4 by a source other than the state.

5 11. For a community-based grant distribution program to
6 provide funding for the planting of trees throughout the
7 state:

8 \$ 250,000

9 12. For a contribution towards the development of the
10 Lewis and Clark rural water system:

11 \$ 60,000

 28 transportation, and for the department for the blind, state
 29 board of regents, the judicial branch, the office of treasurer

31 The bill creates an environment first fund under the
 32 authority of the department of management. The fund is to be
 33 separate from the general fund of the state and is to consist
 34 of appropriations made to the fund and transfers of interest,
 earnings, and moneys from other funds as provided by law.

1 Moneys in the fund in a fiscal year are to be used as
2 appropriated by the general assembly for the protection,
3 conservation, enhancement, or improvement of natural resources
4 or the environment. The bill also provides that a portion of
5 the gambling revenues currently being deposited in the rebuild
6 Iowa infrastructure fund are to be deposited into the
7 environment first fund.

8 The bill also extends the restore the outdoors program,
9 which provides a standing appropriation from the rebuild Iowa
10 infrastructure fund for vertical infrastructure projects at
11 state parks and other public facilities managed by the
12 department of natural resources, through the fiscal year
13 ending June 30, 2004. Currently, the standing appropriation
14 is scheduled to cease in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001.

15 The bill appropriates \$10.5 million from the environment
16 first fund to the resources enhancement and protection fund in
17 lieu of the \$20 million appropriated from the general fund of
18 the state.

19 The bill amends a provision in Code section 18.3 to require
20 the department of general services to notify a state agency of
21 the department's intention to bill the state agency for
22 certain architectural and construction-related services to be
23 provided by the department, and of the cost of such services.
24 The state agency may request that all or a portion of the
25 service not be provided by the department if the same service
26 will be provided by another person. The department or a state
27 agency may file a complaint with the executive council
28 regarding the provision of, billing for, or request to not
29 perform the service.

30 The bill also creates new Code section 18A.6 providing
31 procedural requirements applicable to capital projects on the
32 capitol complex. The bill states that such projects shall be
33 planned, approved, and funded only after considering the
34 guiding principles set forth in any capitol complex master
35 plan adopted by the capitol planning commission on or after

1 January 1, 2000. The bill then lists several of the
2 principles which shall be given priority consideration. The
3 provision is effective upon the bill's enactment.

4 The bill creates an aviation hangar revolving loan fund in
5 new Code section 330.2, to be used by the state department of
6 transportation for loans to provide assistance for the design,
7 construction, or improvement of hangars at general aviation
8 airports in the state.
