Proposal to clarify a conflict in employment of bail enforcement agents

When SF 2374, a bill licensing bail enforcement agents, was enacted in 1998, it mistakenly omitted an exception to the licensing requirement for those agents working exclusively as an employee of an agency. This created a conflict with the exception that has existed in section 80A.4 for private investigators and security agents (this section now governs both private investigators/security agents and bail enforcement agents).

This proposal simply removes that conflict by providing the same exception for bail enforcement agents as has existed for other entities covered by that section.
