A BILL FOR

1 An Act establishing a pharmaceutical assistance and case management by pharmacists program for the elderly, providing for an appropriation, and providing a penalty. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231.61 PHARMACEUTICAL ASSISTANCE 2 AND CASE MANAGEMENT BY PHARMACISTS PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.
- 3 l. For the purposes of this section, unless the context 4 otherwise requires:
- 5 a. "Eligible person" means a person, sixty-five years of
- 6 age or older, with an annual net income of not more than one
- 7 hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level, as defined
- 8 by the most recent poverty income guidelines published by the
- 9 United States department of health and human services; or a
- 10 person, sixty-five years of age or older, who with the
- 11 person's spouse has an annual net income of not more than one
- 12 hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level, as defined
- 13 by the most recent poverty income guidelines published by the
- 14 United States department of health and human services.
- 15 "Eligible person" does not include a person who is eligible
- 16 for financial assistance for the purchase of prescription
- 17 drugs under another local, state, or federal program to the
- 18 extent that the other program provides financial assistance
- 19 for the purchase of prescription drugs.
- 20 b. "Prescription drug" means a prescription drug as
- 21 defined in section 155A.3.
- 22 c. "Program" means the pharmaceutical assistance and case
- 23 management program by pharmacists established in this section.
- 24 d. "Reasonable cost" means a charge which is equal to the
- 25 average wholesale cost of the prescription drug and the
- 26 additional dispensing pharmacy's usual fee, not to exceed the
- 27 seventy-fifth percentile of usual and customary fees in this
- 28 state, as determined by the Iowa department of public health.
- 29 2. A pharmaceutical assistance and case management program
- 30 is created within the department to provide for subsidization
- 31 of the prescription drug costs of eligible persons and to
- 32 provide case management by pharmacists to eligible persons
- 33 throughout the state. The director shall appoint an advisory
- 34 committee to make recommendations to the commission in the
- 35 creation of the program and in adoption of rules to implement

1 the program. The Iowa pharmacy association shall assist the 2 commission in the creation and implementation of the program.

- 3 3. The commission shall adopt rules to implement this4 section. The rules shall provide for all of the following:
- 5 'a. A means to determine the eligibility of a person,
- 6 including proof of the person's actual and anticipated annual
- 7 net income, evidence of complete or partial payment for the
- 8 costs of prescription drugs from a provider other than the
- 9 program, and other provisions consistent with this section.
- 10 b. The program application form, which includes an
- 11 explanation of the penalties for violation of the section. An
- 12 initial application shall be accompanied by proof of the date
- 13 of birth of the person.
- 14 | c. Issuance by the department of a participation card,
- 15 upon approval of an application. The card shall act as a form
- 16 of identification for a person to use in proving eligibility.
- 17 The card shall include a conspicuous notation of the penalties
- 18 for violation of this section. The annual fee for
- 19 participation in the program is eighty dollars.
- 20 d. A prescription copayment of twenty percent of the
- 21 reasonable cost of the prescription, which shall be collected
- 22 from the person participating in the program by the dispensing
- 23 pharmacy, not to exceed eight hundred dollars in prescription
- 24 costs for each calendar year. Thereafter, a copayment of
- 25 forty percent of the reasonable cost of prescriptions in
- 26 excess of eight hundred dollars for the remainder of any
- 27 calendar year shall be collected. The balance of the
- 28 reasonable costs shall be paid by the department to the
- 29 dispensing pharmacy after submission of a claim to the
- 30 department.
- 31 | e. A provision that if the prescription drug is available
- 32 under a generic name, the eligible person may obtain the brand
- 33 name drug rather than the generic drug by paying the
- 34 difference in the costs of the brand name drug and generic
- 35 name drug. However, if the prescribing practitioner indicates

- 1 on the prescription that a substitution of a generic drug for
- 2 the brand name drug is prohibited, the eligible person is
- 3 subject only to payment of the copayment amount.
- 4 f. A reimbursement system which includes on-line point of
- 5 service claims transmission and adjudication, with utilization
- 6 review.
- 7 g. A provision to ensure choice of pharmaceutical services
- 8 by the eligible person.
- 9 h. A program of prospective and retrospective drug
- 10 utilization review to ensure the appropriate use of
- 11 prescription medication and to detect prescription drug
- 12 therapy problems.
- i. A program of prescription drug case management by
- 14 pharmacists to ensure appropriate use and understanding of
- 15 prescription medications and drug interaction potential with
- 16 prescription and nonprescription medications.
- 17 4. A person who supplies false information to establish
- 18 eligibility for the program or to obtain reimbursement is
- 19 guilty of a serious misdemeanor.
- 20 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION.
- 21 1. Notwithstanding section 99D.17 for the fiscal year
- 22 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, of the tax
- 23 revenues received pursuant to section 99D.15, subsections 1,
- 24 3, and 4, an amount equal to three-tenths of one percent of .
- 25 the gross sum wagered by the pari-mutuel method shall be
- 26 deposited in the gambling treatment fund pursuant to section
- 27 99E.10, subsection 1, paragraph "a", for use by the
- 28 pharmaceutical assistance and case management by pharmacists
- 29 program.
- 30 2. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there is
- 31 appropriated from the gambling treatment fund established
- 32 pursuant to section 99E.10, subsection 1, paragraph "a", for
- 33 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30,
- 34 2000, receipts in excess of \$1,900,000 to the department of
- 35 elder affairs for the pharmaceutical assistance and case

1 management by pharmacists program.

3. If moneys appropriated under this section are not sufficient to fund the pharmaceutical assistance and case 4 management by pharmacists program, the benefits under the program shall be reduced proportionately.

EXPLANATION

7 This bill creates a pharmaceutical assistance and case 8 management by pharmacists program in the department of elder 9 affairs to provide for subsidization of prescription drug 10 costs of eligible persons 65 years of age and older with 11 limited incomes, as established in the bill and to provide 12 case management by pharmacists to eligible persons. 13 department of public health is required to develop a 14 reasonable cost, which includes a dispensing fee, for 15 prescription drugs. The department of elder affairs is 16 required to adopt rules regarding copayments, reimbursement 17 policies for generic and brand name drugs, a reimbursement 18 system for dispensing pharmacies, and a form of participation 19 card identification for eligible persons. A person who 20 supplies false information in order to become eligible for the 21 program or to obtain reimbursement is guilty of a serious

The bill also provides for an appropriation to the department of elder affairs from pari-mutuel tax revenues and the gambling treatment fund to finance the program.

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
