A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the drainage of land by constructing or
2 reconstructing open or covered drains.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. H.F. 342

Section 1. Section 468.621, Code 1999, is amended to read 1 2 as follows: 468.621 DRAINAGE IN COURSE OF NATURAL DRAINAGE --4 RECONSTRUCTION -- DAMAGES. Owners The owner of land may drain the land in the general 6 course of natural drainage by constructing or reconstructing 7 open or covered drains, and discharging the drains in any 8 natural watercourse or depression so the water will be carried 9 into some other natural watercourse, and if the drainage 10 is wholly upon the owner's land the owner is not liable in 11 damages for the drainage unless-it-increases-the-quantity-of 12 water-or-changes-the-manner-of-discharge-on-the-land-of 13 another. An owner in constructing a replacement drain, wholly 14 on the owner's land, and in the exercise of due care, is not 15 liable in damages to another person if a previously 16 constructed drain on the owner's own land is rendered 17 inoperative or less efficient by the new drain, unless in 18 violation of the terms of a written contract. This section 19 does not affect the rights or liabilities of proprietors in 20 respect to running streams. 21 **EXPLANATION** 22 This bill amends Code section 468.621 that provides that a 23 landowner may drain land in the general course of natural 24 drainage by constructing or reconstructing open or covered The section provides that if the drainage occurs 25 drains. 26 wholly upon the owner's land, the owner is not liable for 27 damages claimed to result from the drainage. The section also 28 currently provides one exception: the owner may be liable if 29 the construction or reconstruction changes the quantity of 30 water or changes the manner of discharge onto the land of 31 another person. This bill eliminates that exception. 32 33 34 35
