The estimate for House File 498 is hereby submitted as a fiscal note pursuant to Joint Rule 17 and as a correctional impact statement pursuant to Section 2.56, Code of Iowa. Data used in developing this fiscal note and correctional impact statement are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

SUMMARY

House File 498 defines the creation, possession, or use of a fraudulent retail sales receipt or universal price code label as fraudulent. Fraudulent acts are punishable, depending on the amount of damages, anywhere from a Class C felony to a simple misdemeanor.

BACKGROUND

A Class C felony is punishable by confinement for no more than 10 years and a fine of at least \$500 but not more than \$10,000. A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than 30 days or a fine of at least \$50 but not more than \$100.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. Information is not available to estimate how many additional fraud cases (if any) would occur.
- 2. To the extent that current law does not facilitate the successful prosecution of cases of this type, a correctional impact on prisons, probation, and jail may be realized.

CORRECTIONAL IMPACT

The correctional impact of House File 498 cannot be estimated due to insufficient information.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of House File 498 cannot be estimated due to insufficient information.

For purposes of this subsection:

- a. "Retail sales receipt" means a document intended to evidence payment for goods or services.
- b. "Universal price code label" means the unique ten-digit bar code placed on the packaging of an item that may be used for purposes including but not limited to tracking inventory,
