"Student search rule" means a rule established by the 4 school board of a public school, pursuant to section 279.8 or 5 279.9, or the authorities in charge of a nonpublic school 6 controlling the manner of the searching of students or 7 protected student areas and school lockers, desks, and other 8 facilities or spaces owned by the school. A student search 9 rule, to be valid for purposes of this chapter, shall require 10 that all searches of students or protected student areas be 11 reasonably related in scope to the circumstances which gave 12 rise to the need for the search and based upon consideration 13 of relevant factors which include, but are not limited to, the 14 following:

15 a. The nature of the violation for which the search is 16 being instituted.

b. The age or ages and gender of the students who may be18 searched pursuant to the rule.

19 c. The objectives to be accomplished by the search.

However, a student search rule may include a drug and
alcohol testing program which shall be deemed valid if
established pursuant to section 808A.5.

EXPLANATION

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This bill permits public and nonpublic schools to implement a drug and alcohol testing program as part of the school's student search rule as provided by Code chapter 808A. The bill permits drug and alcohol testing of middle school and high school students who seek to participate in schoolsponsored extracurricular activities if certain additional requirements are met. The bill provides that, if a drug and alcohol testing program is adopted, the program must include teacher training, drug and alcohol abuse education for students, an explanation of the program in the school's
