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## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of an Iowa worker retraining
2 forgivable loan program and fund and making an appropriation.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. COLLEGE STUDENT AID COMMISSION. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the college student aid commission for the fiscal year beginning July l,

Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 261.114 IOWA WORKER RETRAINING FORGIVABLE LOAN PROGRAM.
l. An Iowa worker retraining forgivable loan program is established to be administered by the college student aid commission. An individual is eligible for the forgivable loan program if the individual is a resident of this state who is enrolled at a community college as established under chapter 260C, an institution of higher learning under the control of the state board of regents, or an accredited private institution as defined in section 261.9, in a designated skill area in which occupational shortages are anticipated as determined pursuant to subsection 2.
2. The governor's skills forecasting council shall annually designate the skill areas in which occupational shortages are anticipated. In designating skills areas in which occupational shortages are anticipated, the council shall consider the quality of the jobs in the occupational shortage area. In rating the quality of the jobs, the council shall place greater emphasis on those jobs that have a higher wage scale, have a lower turnover rate, are full-time or career-type positions, provide comprehensive health benefits, or have factors associated with them that are indicative of jobs higher in quality than jobs in other occupational shortage areas.
3. Each applicant shall, in accordance with the rules of the commission, do the following:
a. Complete and file an application, on forms provided by the commission, for an Iowa worker retraining forgivable loan. The individual shall be responsible for the submission of the financial information required for evaluation of the applicant's need for a forgivable loan, on forms determined by the commission.
b. File a new application and financial information annually on the basis of which the applicant's eligibility for a renewed forgivable loan will be evaluated and determined.
4. Forgivable loans to eligible students shall not become due until after the student graduates or leaves school. The individual's total loan amount, including principal and interest, shall be reduced by twenty-five percent for each year in which the individual remains an Iowa resident and is employed in Iowa in the skill shortage area for which the loan was approved. If the commission determines that the person does not meet the criteria for forgiveness of the principal and interest payments, the commission shall establish a plan for repayment of the principal and interest over a five-year period. If a person required to make the repayment does not make the required payments, the commission shall provide for payment collection.
5. The amount of an Iowa worker retraining forgivable loan shall not exceed one thousand five hundred dollars annually, or the amount of the student's established financial need, whichever is less. However, if the loan amount approved by the commission exceeds the student's expenses for tuition, room and board, and mandatory fees, the balance shall be distributed to the student for whom the loan was made. However, the commission may exceed the maximum loan amount based upon the demand for loans or an extraordinary demand for trained workers in a skill shortage area.
6. The commission shall prescribe by rule the interest rate for the forgivable loan.

1 created for deposit of payments made by forgivable loan recipients who do not fulfill the conditions of the forgivable loan program, or by businesses who wish to contribute

The commission shall adopt rules for determining financial need, defining tuition and mandatory fees, defining residence for the purposes of this section, processing and approving applications for loan forgiveness, and determining priority of loan forgiveness. The commission shall give priority to students who have the greatest demonstrated financial need, who wish to upgrade their skills, and who are earning not more than two dollars over the minimum wage as established in section 91D.1. The commission shall also give priority to a person whose present or former employer contributes financial assistance as provided in subsection 7 on behalf of the person, and the level of priority shall be based upon the amount of the present or former employer's contribution.

Sec. 3. FISCAL YEAR 1999-2000 OCCUPATIONAL SHGRTAGE AREAS. Notwithstanding section 261.114 , subsection 2 , for the fiscal year beginning July 1,1999 , and ending June 30,2000 , the Iowa workforce development board, in consultation with the departments of education and economic development and the college student aid commission, shall designate skill shortage areas for purposes of the Iowa worker retraining forgivable loan program.

EXPLANATION
This bill establishes an Iowa worker retraining forgivable
loan program and fund to be administered by the college
2 student aid commission, and appropriates $\$ 1.75$ million for the program from the general fund of the state for fiscal year 4 1999-2000.

Under the bill, the program will be available to Iowa residents who are enrolled in a community college, regents university, or an accredited private postsecondary institution in a designated skill area in which occupational shortages are anticipated.

The bill requires the skills forecasting council to annually designate the skill areas in which occupational shortages are anticipated. However, for fiscal year 19992000, the designated shortage areas are to be determined by the Iowa workforce development board, in consultation with the departments of education and economic development, and the college student aid commission.

The commission is directed to give priority to students who have the greatest demonstrated financial need, who wish to upgrade their skills, and who are earning not more than two dollars over the minimum wage as established in Code section 91D.l. The commission is also to give priority to a person whose present or former employer contributes financial assistance on behalf of the person, and the level of priority shall be based upon the amount of the present or former employer's contribution.

After the student graduates or leaves school, the individual's total loan amount, including principal and interest, is reduced by 25 percent for each year in which the individual remains an Iowa resident and is employed in Lowa in the skill shortage area for which the loan was approved. The commission is required to establish a plan for repayment of the principal and interest over a five-year period if an individual does not meet the requirements for loan forgiveness. If the individual does not repay as required, the commission shall provide for payment collection.

The amount of an lowa worker retraining forgivable loan 2 shall not exceed $\$ 1,500$ annually, or the amount of the 3 student's established financial need, whichever is less.

4 However, the commission may exceed the maximum amount based
5 upon the demand for loan forgiveness or an extraordinary
6 demand for trained workers in a skill shortage area.
7 An Iowa worker retraining forgivable loan fund is created
8 for deposit of payments made by forgivable loan recipients who
9 do not fulfill the conditions of the forgivable loan program,
10 or by businesses who wish to contribute financial assistance
11 on behalf of current or former employees. Moneys deposited in
12 the forgivable loan fund carry over to be continuousiy
13 available to make additional loans under the program.
