- Section 1. ALTERNATIVE REHABILITATION PROGRAMS.
- 2 1. The department of corrections shall evaluate the
- 3 potential rehabilitative effectiveness of providing convicted

- 6 release therapy, or other faith-based or nonfaith-based
- 7 programs. The evaluation shall consider the rehabilitative
