**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to school finance, providing additional state  
 2 funding for changes in enrollment, and providing an effective  
 3 date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 257.6, subsection 4, Code 1999, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 4. BUDGET ENROLLMENT.

4 a. Budget enrollment for the budget year is the basic  
5 enrollment for the budget year.

6 b. For the budget year commencing July 1, 2000, and  
7 succeeding budget years, if a district's actual enrollment for  
8 a budget year is less than its budget enrollment, the district  
9 shall be eligible for a budget enrollment adjustment. The  
10 budget enrollment for the budget year shall be the greater of  
11 either the budget enrollment for the base year or the average  
12 of the budget enrollment for the base year, the budget  
13 enrollment for the year preceding the base year, and the  
14 budget enrollment for the second preceding base year. If a  
15 district's actual enrollment for a budget year is greater than  
16 its budget enrollment, the district shall be eligible for an  
17 advance for increasing enrollment as provided in section  
18 257.13.

19 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 257.13 ADVANCE FOR INCREASING  
20 ENROLLMENT.

21 For the budget year beginning July 1, 2000, and succeeding  
22 budget years, if a district's actual enrollment for the budget  
23 year, determined under section 257.6, exceeds its budget  
24 enrollment for the budget year, the district is granted an  
25 advance from the state equal to its regular program district  
26 cost per pupil for the budget year multiplied by the  
27 difference between the actual enrollment for the budget year  
28 and the budget enrollment for the budget year. The advance is  
29 miscellaneous income.

30 If a district receives an advance under this section for a  
31 budget year, the department of management shall determine the  
32 amount of the advance which would have been generated by local  
33 property tax revenues if the actual enrollment for the budget  
34 year had been used in determining district cost for that  
35 budget year, shall reduce the district's total state school

1 aids otherwise available under this chapter for the next  
2 following budget year by the amount so determined, and shall  
3 increase the district's additional property tax levy for the  
4 next following budget year by the amount necessary to  
5 compensate for the reduction in state aid, so that the local  
6 property tax for the next following year will be increased  
7 only by the amount by which it would have been increased in  
8 the budget year if the enrollment calculated in this section  
9 could have been used to establish the levy.

10 There is appropriated each fiscal year from the general  
11 fund of the state to the department of education the amount  
12 required to pay advances authorized under this section, which  
13 shall be paid to school districts in the same manner as other  
14 state aids are paid under section 257.16.

15 Sec. 3. Section 257.14, subsection 1, Code 1999, is  
16 amended to read as follows:

17 1. For the budget years commencing July 1, 1997, and July  
18 1, 1998, July 1, 1999, and succeeding budget years, if the  
19 department of management determines that the regular program  
20 district cost of a school district for a budget year is less  
21 than the total of the regular program district cost plus any  
22 adjustment added under this section for the base year for that  
23 school district, the department of management shall provide a  
24 budget adjustment for that district for that budget year that  
25 is equal to the difference.

26 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of  
27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

28 EXPLANATION

29 This bill provides additional state funding for school  
30 districts experiencing changes in enrollment.

31 The bill provides that for the budget year commencing July  
32 1, 1999, and succeeding budget years, the budget guarantee  
33 provision contained in Code section 257.14 will apply.

34 Accordingly, if the department of management determines that  
35 the regular program district cost of a school district for the

1 budget year is less than the level of the regular program  
2 district cost for the base year, the department shall provide  
3 a budget adjustment for that district for that budget year  
4 that is equal to the difference.

5 The bill also provides that for the budget year commencing  
6 July 1, 2000, and succeeding budget years, a school district  
7 experiencing declining enrollment will be eligible for a  
8 budget adjustment. The budget enrollment for the budget year  
9 will be the greater of either the budget enrollment for the  
10 base year or the average of the budget enrollment for the base  
11 year, the budget enrollment for the year preceding the base  
12 year, and the budget enrollment for the second preceding base  
13 year.

14 The bill further provides that, for the budget year  
15 beginning July 1, 2000, and succeeding budget years, if a  
16 district's actual enrollment for the budget year exceeds its  
17 budget enrollment for the budget year, the district is granted  
18 an advance from the state equal to its regular program  
19 district cost per pupil for the budget year multiplied by the  
20 difference between the actual enrollment for the budget year  
21 and the budget enrollment for the budget year. The advance  
22 would be subject to repayment in the following budget year in  
23 the form of a decrease in state aid otherwise payable, and a  
24 corresponding increase in the school district's additional  
25 property tax levy, equivalent to the amount of additional  
26 property tax which would have been payable had the actual  
27 enrollment count been utilized in determining district cost  
28 for the budget year.

29 The bill would take effect upon enactment.
