1 Section 1. Section 91D.1, subsection 1, paragraphs a and 2 d, Code 1999, are amended to read as follows:

a. The hourly wage stated in the federal minimum wage law,
4 pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 206, shall be increased to \$3-85 \$6.15
5 on January 1 of ±990 2000, \$4-25-on-January-±-of-±99±7 and
6 \$4-65 \$7.15 on January 1 of ±992 2001.

d. An employer is not required to pay an employee the applicable minimum wage provided in paragraph "a" until the employee has completed ninety calendar days of employment with the employer. An-employee-who-has-completed-ninety-calendar days-of-employment-with-the-employer-prior-to-January-1-of 12 19907-19917-or-19927-shall-earn-the-applicable-hourly-minimum 13 wage: An employer shall pay an employee who has not completed 14 ninety calendar days of employment with the employer an hourly 15 wage of at least \$3:35-as-of-January-1-of-19907-\$3:85 \$5.15 as 16 of January 1 of 1991 2000, and \$4:25 \$6.15 as of January 1 of 17 1992 2001.

## **EXPLANATION**

19 This bill raises the state's hourly minimum wage to \$6.15 20 beginning January 1, 2000, and to \$7.15 beginning January 1, 21 2001. The hourly minimum wage for employees serving a 90-day 22 training period is raised to \$5.15 on January 1, 2000, and 23 \$6.15 on January 1, 2001.

The federal minimum wage is currently \$5.15.
