Section 1. IOWA FREEDOM TRAIL STUDY. The department of 1 2 cultural affairs shall prepare a proposal with cost estimates 3 to explore the establishment of an Iowa freedom trail program 4 designed to preserve and commemorate the underground railroad 5 and educate the public on issues related to the underground 6 railroad and antislavery campaign in Iowa. The department 7 shall explore the possibility of securing the cooperation and 8 assistance of the national park service in developing and 9 implementing the program. The program would assist in 10 locating, identifying, and preserving sites, routes, and other ll resources located in the state which served a function in the 12 underground railroad and antislavery campaign in the state. 13 The program would identify and recognize any citizens of the 14 state who were instrumental in the underground railroad and 15 antislavery campaign. EXPLANATION
