1 An Act relating to windshield wiper operation and lighted
2 headlamps and making a penalty applicable.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.384, Code 1999, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 321.384 WHEN LIGHTED LAMPS REQUIRED.
- 4 l. Every A motor vehicle operated upon a highway within
- 5 the this state, shall display lighted headlamps as provided in
- 6 section 321.415 at any time from sunset to sunrise, at any
- 7 time the motor vehicle's windshield wipers are in continuous
- 8 operation, and at such other times when conditions such as
- 9 fog, snow, sleet, or rain provide insufficient lighting to
- 10 render clearly discernible persons and vehicles on the highway
- 11 at a distance of five hundred feet ahead, shall-display
- 12 lighted-head-lamps-as-provided-in-section-321:415, subject to
- 13 exceptions with respect to parked vehicles as-hereinafter
- 14 stated pursuant to this chapter.
- 15 2. Whenever A requirement is-hereinafter-declared-as-to
- 16 regarding the distance from which certain lamps and devices
- 17 shall render objects visible or within which such lamps or
- 18 devices shall be visible, -said-provisions shall apply during
- 19 the times stated in subsection 1 of-this-section upon a
- 20 straight level unlighted highway under normal atmospheric
- 21 conditions unless a different time or condition is expressly
- 22 stated.
- 23 Sec. 2. WARNING CITATIONS. During the first six months
- 24 following the effective date of this Act, peace officers shall
- 25 issue only warning citations for motor vehicles not displaying
- 26 lighted headlamps at any time the motor vehicle's windshield
- 27 wipers are in continuous operation as required by section
- 28 321.384, subsection 1, as amended in this Act.
- 29 EXPLANATION
- 30 This bill requires a motor vehicle to display lighted
- 31 headlights at any time when the vehicle's wipers are in
- 32 continuous operation. A violation of this provision is a
- 33 simple misdemeanor punishable by a scheduled fine of \$20 under
- 34 Code section 805.8. The bill also provides that during the
- 35 first six months following enactment, violations of this

1 provision will only result in warning citations.
