**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to state budgetary matters by providing for  
2 reductions and supplementation of appropriations for the  
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, transferring, crediting,  
4 and appropriating certain moneys, increasing certain fees, and  
5 providing effective dates.
