**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act to repeal the upper Mississippi riverway compact.  
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Chapter 463A and section 97B.55, Code 1999, are  
2 repealed.

3 EXPLANATION

4 This bill repeals the upper Mississippi riverway compact  
5 which was adopted by the general assembly in 1967. The  
6 compact was drafted to include the states of Illinois, Iowa,  
7 Minnesota, and Wisconsin. The state of Missouri was also  
8 invited to join. The purpose of the compact was to encourage  
9 economic development, tourism, and resource conservation along  
10 the river area within the member states.

11 The compact was not adopted by any of the other states  
12 which were cited as potential members and the compact was not  
13 ratified by the United States Congress.

14 Also repealed is a provision in the Iowa public employees'  
15 retirement system which offered an agreement extending IPERS  
16 membership to employees of the upper Mississippi riverway  
17 commission.
