A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making an appropriation from the tobacco settlement fund to the department of human services to provide 2 3 for twelve-month continuous eligibility for children under the medical assistance program, and providing an effective date 4 and providing for retroactive applicability. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16

- 1 Section 1. TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND -- APPROPRIATION TO THE
- 2 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. There is appropriated from the
- 3 tobacco settlement fund created in section 12.65 to the
- 4 department of human services for the fiscal year beginning
- 5 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount,
- 6 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose
- 7 designated:
- 8 To supplement the medical assistance appropriation to
- 9 provide twelve-month continuous eligibility for medical
- 10 assistance to eligible children under age 19:
- 11 \$ 7,500,000
- 12 Children who are eligible under the medically needy
- 13 coverage group or who are presumptively eligible for medical
- 14 assistance are not eligible for continuous eligibility under
- 15 this section.
- 16 Sec. 2. Section 12.65, Code 1999, is amended to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 12.65 TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND.
- 19 1. A tobacco settlement fund is created in the office of
- 20 the treasurer of state. After payment of litigation costs,
- 21 the state portion of any moneys paid to the state by tobacco
- 22 companies in settlement of the state's lawsuit for recovery of
- 23 public expenditures associated with tobacco use shall be
- 24 deposited in the tobacco settlement fund. Moneys deposited in
- 25 the fund shall be used only as provided in appropriations from
- 26 the fund to-the-department-of-human-services-for-the-medical
- 27 assistance-program-and-to-the-Iowa-department-of-public-health
- 28 for health care-related programs to-reduce-smoking-by-teenage
- 29 youth. For purposes of this section, "litigation costs" are
- 30 those costs itemized by the attorney general and submitted to
- 31 and approved by the general-assembly executive council.
- 32 2. On June 30, 2001, the balance remaining in the tobacco
- 33 settlement fund shall be transferred to the general fund of
- 34 the state. Beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement
- 35 fund shall be considered part of the general fund of the

- 1 state. However, the state portion of the moneys received
- 2 shall only be appropriated for health care-related programs.
- 3 Sec. 3. Section 249A.3, Code Supplement 1999, is amended
- 4 by adding the following new subsection:
- 5 NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. The department shall establish
- 6 twelve-month continuous eligibility under the medical
- 7 assistance program for a child under nineteen years of age
- 8 whose eligibility is not based on eligibility under the
- 9 medically needy category or on presumptive eligibility.
- 10 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section in this Act amending
- 11 section 12.65, being deemed of immediate importance, takes
- 12 effect upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to July
- 13 1, 1999.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- 15 This bill relates to the tobacco settlement fund, makes an
- 16 appropriation from the fund to the department of human
- 17 services, and provides conforming provisions relating to the
- 18 expenditure of the funds.
- 19 The bill appropriates \$7,500,000 to the department of human
- 20 services to supplement the medical assistance appropriation to
- 21 provide 12-month continuous eligibility to children under 19
- 22 years of age whose eligibility is based on criteria other than
- 23 eligibility under the medically needy program or presumptive
- 24 eligibility.
- 25 The bill also amends codified provisions relating to the
- 26 tobacco settlement fund and to the provisions of the bill.
- 27 The bill amends Code section 12.65, the tobacco settlement
- 28 fund, to provide that moneys deposited in the fund shall be
- 29 used only as provided in appropriations from the fund and for
- 30 health care-related programs. The amendment to the section
- 31 also provides that litigation costs, which are to be paid
- 32 prior to deposit of moneys in the fund, are to be submitted to
- 33 and approved by the executive council, which as provided in
- 34 Code section 7D.1 includes the governor, secretary of state,
- 35 auditor of state, treasurer of state, and the secretary of

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1 agriculture. The bill also amends Code section 12.65 to
 2 provide that the balance remaining in the tobacco settlement
 3 fund shall be transferred to the general fund of the state.
 4 Additionally, beginning July 1, 2001, the tobacco settlement
 5 fund is to be considered part of the general fund of the
 6 state. However, the state portion of the tobacco settlement
 7 funds are to continue to only be appropriated for health care-
 8 related programs. Code section 12.65 as amended in the bill
 9 is effective upon enactment and is retroactively applicable to
10 July 1, 1999.
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      The bill also makes a conforming change in the Code
12 relating to the medical assistance program and continuous
13 eligibility relevant to the appropriation portion of the bill.
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
