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1	Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. There is appropriated
2	from the general fund of the state to the department of
3	education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and
4	ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof
5	as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:
6	For character education through service learning incentive
7	grants for school districts to implement programs that
8	integrate service learning into the school district's
9	curriculum and graduation requirements:
10	\$ 300,000
11	The director of the department of education shall develop
12	grant approval criteria and procedures. In developing grant
13	criteria and awarding grants, the director shall consider
14	equity concerns and options for distributing grant amounts
15	based on service population size groupings to accommodate
16	small, medium, and large population school districts. The
17	deadline for applications for character education through
18	service learning incentive grants in the fiscal year beginning
19	July 1, 2000, shall be August 31, 2000, with grant awards to
20	be made on or about October 1, 2000.
21	EXPLANATION
22	This bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the
23	state to the department of education for fiscal year 2000-
24	2001, for character education through service learning
25	incentive grants for school districts to implement programs
26	that integrate service learning into the school district's
27	curriculum and graduation requirements.
28	Under the bill, the director of the department of education
29	must develop grant approval criteria and procedures, taking
30	into consideration equity concerns and school district size.
31	To receive a grant, a school must apply by August 31, 2000,
32	and the department must award the grants on or about October
33	1, 2000.
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
