1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 256E.6 LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND 2 INTENT.

3 1. The general assembly finds that classroom management is 4 often difficult and complex, that students are from diverse 5 racial, ethnic, and social backgrounds, and that behavioral 6 disorders and special education needs abound. Teachers, 7 therefore, must be prepared to effectively manage classrooms, 8 to communicate with and engage parents in their child's 9 education, to assess students' developmental needs, and to 10 organize and work in teams. While student needs are great, 11 the nation is experiencing a teacher shortage. Therefore, it is the intent of the general assembly 12 2. 13 that the department of education encourage each school 14 district to develop and implement a volunteer program that 15 utilizes a valuable, tested human resource, Iowa's retired 16 teachers and administrators, by inviting these experienced . 17 educators to return to the schools as volunteer mentors and A volunteer mentor is not a mentor as defined in-18 aides. 19 section 256E.1, and is ineligible for awards made under 20 section 256E.4.
