

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 256D.8, subsections 1 and 3, Code Supplement 1999, are amended to read as follows:

Except as provided in subsection 2, a school district shall expend funds received pursuant to section 256D.5, subsection 2, for the acquisition, lease, lease-purchase, installation, and maintenance of instructional technology equipment, including hardware and software, materials and supplies related to instructional technology, and staff development and training related to instructional technology, and shall establish priorities for the use of the funds. However, funds received by a school district pursuant to section 256D.5, subsection 2, shall not be expended to add a full-time equivalent position or otherwise increase staffing, unless the school district expends not more than ten percent of the funds received to employ or enter into a contract with information technology specialists to provide technical consulting and integration of technology in curriculum and instruction to advance student achievement.
