SENATE FILE 2246 FISCAL NOTE

The estimate for Senate File 2246 is hereby submitted as a fiscal note pursuant to Joint Rule 17 and as a correctional impact statement pursuant to Section 2.56, Code of Iowa. Data used in developing this fiscal note and correctional impact statement are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 2246 requires Iowa inmates to receive credit for time served in another state. Current law prohibits credit being given for time served in another jurisdiction.

ASSUMPTIONS

There is no data available to assess how many offenders will be affected by this Bill.

CORRECTIONAL IMPACT

Senate File 2246 is not expected to have a significant correctional impact.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of Senate File 2246 cannot be determined. However, it is anticipated that any impact that may occur would result in a small savings to prison operations under the Department of Corrections.
