4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

2 1999, is amended to read as follows:

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2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 4 state to the department of education for each fiscal year of 5 the fiscal period beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 6 2003, the sum of thirty thirty-two million five hundred 7 thousand dollars for the school improvement technology block 8 grant program.

9 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 256D.8A TECHNOLOGY FOR ACCREDITED 10 NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS.

11 1. Technology adopted and purchased by a school district 12 as provided in this chapter may, and shall to the extent funds 13 are appropriated by the general assembly and allocated as 14 provided in this chapter, be made available to students of 15 accredited nonpublic schools located within the boundaries of 16 the school district upon the written request of the 17 authorities in charge of the nonpublic school on behalf of the 18 school's students as provided in this section.

2. From the moneys appropriated in section 295.2, 19 20 subsection 1, paragraph "d" and from the moneys appropriated 21 in section 256D.5, subsection 2, for each fiscal year in which 22 moneys are appropriated, the sum of two million five hundred 23 thousand dollars shall be allocated to school districts for 24 the purchase of technology for accredited public schools as 25 provided in this section, subject to the restrictions of 26 section 295.4, subsection 1, and section 256D.8, subsection 1, 27 and notwithstanding section 295.2, subsections 2 and 3, and 28 section 256D.6, subsections 1 and 2. The department of 29 education shall ascertain a maximum annual amount the school 30 district shall be required to use for the purchase of 31 technology for participating accredited nonpublic schools. 32 The amount shall be in the proportion that the basic 33 enrollment of a participating accredited nonpublic school 34 bears to the sum of the basic enrollments of all participating 35 accredited nonpublic schools in the state for the budget year.

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1 For each school year in which the authorities in charge of an 2 accredited nonpublic school request technology as provided in 3 this section, the participating accredited nonpublic school 4 shall certify its actual enrollment to the department of 5 education by October 1. By October 15, the department shall 6 notify the board of directors of each school district of the 7 maximum amount of its allocation that shall be made available 8 for purchasing technology for each of the participating 9 accredited nonpublic schools located within the school 10 district in accordance with this section. The technology made 11 available to accredited nonpublic schools in accordance with 12 this section shall be comparable to the technology of the 13 district of attendance. For purposes of this section only, an 14 accredited nonpublic school's enrollment count shall include 15 only students who are residents of Iowa.

16 3. The costs of providing technology to participating 17 accredited nonpublic schools as provided in this section shall 18 not be included in the computation of district cost under 19 chapter 257, but shall be shown in the budget as an expense 20 from miscellaneous income.

21 4. Prior to receiving technology under this section, the 22 authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school shall 23 adopt a technology plan that supports school improvement 24 technology efforts and includes an evaluation component. The 25 plan shall be developed by licensed professional staff of the 26 school, including both teachers and administrators. The plan 27 shall, at a minimum, focus on the attainment of student 28 achievement goals determined in accordance with section 256.7, 29 subsection 21, and shall demonstrate how the school will 30 utilize technology to improve student achievement. Only one 31 plan shall be required while technology is received under this 32 section. The technology plan shall be kept on file in the 33 school and a copy of the plan, and any subsequent amendments 34 to the plan, shall be sent to the department of education. 35 Progress made under the plan shall be included as part of the

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1 annual comprehensive school improvement plan submitted to the 2 department of education in compliance with section 256.7, 3 subsection 21.

5. Notwithstanding section 295.2, subsection 8, for
5 purposes of this section, "school district" does not mean the
6 Iowa braille and sight saving school, the state school for the
7 deaf, the Price laboratory school at the university of
8 northern Iowa, and the institutions under the control of the
9 department of human services as provided in section 218.1,
10 subsections 1 through 3, 5, 7, and 8.

11 6. The provisions of section 256D.8, subsection 2, shall 12 not apply.

13 Sec. 3. Section 295.2, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code 14 1999, is amended to read as follows:

15 c. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 16 state to the department of education for each fiscal year of 17 the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 18 $2001 \ 2000$, the sum of thirty million dollars for the school 19 improvement technology program.

20 Sec. 4. Section 295.2, subsection 1, Code 1999, is amended 21 by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. d. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the sum of thirty-two million five hundred thousand dollars for the school improvement technology program.

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EXPLANATION

This bill permits accredited nonpublic schools to receive school improvement technology and school improvement technology block grant program moneys by increasing the appropriation to the programs to \$32.5 million annually and requiring that \$2.5 million annually be used to make technology that is comparable to that purchased by a school district, available to students of accredited nonpublic schools.

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The bill directs the department of education to ascertain a 1 2 maximum annual amount a school district will be required to 3 use for the purchase of technology for participating 4 accredited nonpublic schools within its boundaries. The 5 amount shall be in the proportion that the basic enrollment of 6 a participating accredited nonpublic school bears to the sum 7 of the basic enrollments of all participating accredited 8 nonpublic schools in the state for the budget year. Each 9 year, the authorities in charge of a participating accredited 10 nonpublic school must certify its actual enrollment to the 11 department of education by October 1. By October 15, the 12 department notifies the board of directors of each school 13 district of the maximum amount of its allocation that must be 14 made available for purchasing technology for each of the 15 participating accredited nonpublic schools located within the 16 school district in accordance with this section. The 17 technology made available to accredited nonpublic schools in 18 accordance with this section shall be comparable to the 19 technology of the district of attendance.

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Prior to receiving technology, the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school must adopt, and file with the department of education, a technology plan that supports school improvement technology efforts and includes an evaluation component. The plan shall, at a minimum, focus on the attainment of student achievement goals, determined under the school's comprehensive school improvement plan, and demonstrate how the school will utilize technology to improve student achievement.

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
