- 13 The representatives of the departments of workforce

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BACKGROUND STATEMENT DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

Division I of LSB 5313DP changes the number of state general officer positions in the Iowa National Guard by adding a deputy adjutant general position and eliminating two assistant adjutant general positions. Division I also changes the qualifications necessary for appointment to the positions of Adjutant General or Deputy Adjutant General.

Providing a Deputy Adjutant General for the Army National Guard and one for the Air National Guard reflects the changing nature of the missions and units assigned to the lowa Army and Air National Guard. To provide a state active duty position for the additional Deputy Adjutant General, the position of Administrative Orders Officer is being eliminated.

The Assistant Adjutant General for Army and Assistant Adjutant General for Air positions are being eliminated because they are no longer necessary following the addition of the additional Deputy Adjutant General position.

The qualifications for appointment to Adjutant General or Deputy Adjutant General are being changed to provide that the officers holding those positions are capable of being federally recognized as general officers.

Division II of LSB 5313DP expands membership of the lowa Emergency Response Commission from 12 to 15 and designates voting and non-voting members. Expansion of membership provides an opportunity for previously unrepresented stake-holders to participate on the Commission. Designating voting and non-voting, advisory members reduces the number of members necessary for a quorum, which will increase Commission effectiveness by allowing business meetings to occur on a more regular basis.
