A BILL FOR 1 An Act providing for the care, feeding, and disposition of animals in certain animal feeding operations, and providing for the allocation of moneys. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 7D.10A, Code 1999, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 7D.10A ALLOCATION TO MANURE-STORAGE THE ANIMAL FEEDING 4 OPERATION INDEMNITY FUND.
- 5 If moneys are not sufficient to support the manure-storage
- 6 animal feeding operation indemnity fund as provided in chapter
- 7 455J, the executive council may allocate from moneys in the
- 8 general fund of the state, which are not otherwise obligated
- 9 or encumbered, an amount to the manure-storage animal feeding
- 10 operation indemnity fund as provided under section 455J.2.
- 11 However, not more than a total of one million dollars shall be
- 12 allocated to the manure-storage animal feeding operation
- 13 indemnity fund at any time.
- 14 Sec. 2. Section 159.1, Code 1999, is amended by adding the
- 15 following new subsection:
- 16 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. "Animal feeding operation" means the
- 17 same as defined in section 455B.161.
- 18 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 159.32 EMERGENCY ORDER.
- 19 The department may issue an emergency order for the care
- 20 and feeding of animals kept in an animal feeding operation as
- 21 provided in this section.
- 22 1. The order shall only apply to an animal feeding
- 23 operation that keeps five hundred or more animal units as
- 24 defined in section 455J.1. However, regardless of the number
- 25 of animal units kept at the animal feeding operation, the
- 26 order shall apply to an animal feeding operation which keeps
- 27 more than five hundred cattle, one thousand swine, or twenty
- 28 thousand chickens or turkeys.
- 29 2. The department may only issue an emergency order under
- 30 this section after receiving a petition by a county board of
- 31 supervisors in the county where the animal feeding operation
- 32 is located. The petition must include all of the following:
- 33 a. A description of the animal feeding operation,
- 34 including its address and the name of its owner.
- 35 b. A statement providing that the county will relinquish

- 1 the right to rescue or maintain neglected livestock as
- 2 provided in section 717.2A, or relinquish any claim for
- 3 maintenance provided to the neglected livestock according to
- 4 the terms of the emergency order.
- 5 c. A statement by a veterinarian licensed pursuant to
- 6 chapter 169 certifying that there is a clear, present, and
- 7 impending danger to the health of the animals due to a failure
- 8 to provide the animals care and feeding consistent with
- 9 customary animal husbandry practices.
- 10 3. The department may require that the state veterinarian
- 11 conduct an inspection of the animal feeding operation as
- 12 determined necessary by the department prior to issuing the
- 13 emergency order. The department may require inspections of
- 14 the animals by a state veterinarian during any period that the
- 15 emergency order is in effect. A county sheriff shall take all
- 16 actions necessary in order to rescue animals as directed by
- 17 the department. The law enforcement officer may enter onto an *:
- 18 animal feeding operation if the officer obtains a search
- 19 warrant issued by a court, or enters onto the premises in a
- 20 manner consistent with the laws of this state and the United
- 21 States, including Article I, section 8 of the Constitution of
- 22 the State of Iowa, or Amendment 4 to the Constitution of the
- 23 United States.
- 24 4. An emergency order is binding and effective
- 25 immediately, unless the order is modified, vacated, or stayed
- 26 at an administrative hearing or by a district court. The
- 27 emergency order shall be continued, modified, or revoked
- 28 within thirty days. If the department is appointed as a
- 29 receiver pursuant to section 159.32, the emergency order shall
- 30 continue until the receivership expires.
- 31 5. The emergency order may provide for any of the
- 32 following:
- 33 a. Reimbursement of expenses incurred by the county in
- 34 providing maintenance to neglected livestock as provided in
- 35 section 717.5, if the county subrogates its right to receive

- 1 moneys from the disposition of the animals under that section.
- 2 b. Rescuing, maintaining, and disposing of animals kept in
- 3 the animal feeding operation in the same manner as a local
- 4 authority as provided in sections 717.2A and 717.5, if the
- 5 county subrogates its right to receive moneys from the
- 6 disposition of the animals under that section.
- 7 c. Authorization under receivership as provided in section 8 159.33.
- 9 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 159.33 RECEIVERSHIP.
- 10 1. Upon issuance of an emergency order pursuant to section
- 11 159.32, the department may file a petition in the district
- 12 court requesting that the department be appointed as a
- 13 receiver to take custody of the animals, to provide for the
- 14 care and feeding of the animals as provided in section 159.32,
- 15 and to provide for the disposition of the animals. The
- 16 petition shall be filed in the county in which the animal
- 17 feeding operation is located.
- 2. The district court shall appoint the department as
- 19 receiver, if the court determines that there is a clear,
- 20 present, and impending danger to the health of the animals due
- 21 to a failure to provide the animals care and feeding
- 22 consistent with customary animal husbandry practices. The
- 23 hearing shall be a civil proceeding. If the case is related
- 24 to a criminal proceeding, the disposition shall not be part of
- 25 that proceeding and shall not be considered a criminal penalty
- 26 imposed on a person found in violation of section 717.2.
- 27 3. A petition filed by the department under subsection 1
- 28 shall be accompanied by the department's plan for disposition
- 29 of the animals, including the sale of all or part of the
- 30 animals for the benefit of the owner of the animals, the owner
- 31 of the animal feeding operation, and creditors.
- 32 4. The department may employ or retain a merchandiser to
- 33 effect the sale of the animals.
- 34 5. The department is entitled to reimbursement out of the
- 35 sale of the animals held in receivership for all expenses

- 1 incurred as court costs or in handling and disposing of
- 2 animals, and for all other costs directly attributable to the
- 3 receivership. The right of reimbursement of the department is
- 4 prior to any claims against the animals or proceeds of sales
- 5 of the animals.
- 6. When the plan of disposition is approved by the court
- 7 and executed by the department, the department shall be
- 8 discharged and the receivership terminated. At the
- 9 termination of the receivership, the department shall file a
- 10 final report containing the details of its actions, together
- 11 with such additional information as the court may require.
- 12 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 159.34 LIEN.
- 13 1. A statutory lien is imposed on all property of an
- 14 animal feeding operation subject to receivership under section
- 15 159.33. The lien shall arise when the department is appointed
- 16 receiver, and shall terminate when the receivership
- 17 terminates.
- 18 2. To perfect the lien, the department must file a lien
- 19 statement with the office of the county recorder and the
- 20 secretary of state. The lien statement shall disclose the
- 21 name of the animal feeding operation owner, and the address of
- 22 the animal feeding operation. The lien amount shall be the
- 23 department's estimate of the final cost of administering the
- 24 receivership reduced by the amount received by the department
- 25 from the disposition of the animals.
- 3. A lien perfected under this section is superior to and
- 27 shall have priority over a conflicting lien or security
- 28 interest in the property, including a lien or security
- 29 interest that was perfected prior to the creation of the lien
- 30 under this section.
- 31 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 159.35 ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATION
- 32 INDEMNITY FUND.
- 33 Upon the issuance of an emergency order pursuant to section
- 34 159.32, the department may order the transfer of any
- 35 unobligated amount deposited into the animal feeding

- 1 operation's indemnity fund which is necessary in order to pay
- 2 for costs associated with carrying out the emergency order.
- 3 The department shall transfer any unexpended moneys into the
- 4 fund upon the termination of the emergency order.
- 5 Sec. 7. Section 455B.109, subsection 4, Code 1999, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 4. All civil penalties assessed by the department and
- 8 interest on the penalties shall be deposited in the general
- 9 fund of the state. However, civil penalties assessed by the
- 10 department and interest on penalties, arising out of
- 11 violations committed by animal feeding operations under
- 12 division II, part 2, shall be deposited in the manure-storage
- 13 animal feeding operation indemnity fund as created in section
- 14 455J.2. Civil penalties assessed by the department and
- 15 interest on the penalties arising out of violations committed
- 16 by animal feeding operations under division III, which may be
- 17 assessed pursuant to section 455B.191, shall be deposited in
- 18 the manure-storage animal feeding operation indemnity fund as
- 19 created in section 455J.2.
- 20 Sec. 8. Section 455B.191, subsection 8, Code 1999, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 8. Moneys assessed and collected in civil penalties and
- 23 interest earned on civil penalties, arising out of a violation
- 24 involving an animal feeding operation, shall be deposited in
- 25 the manure-storage animal feeding operation indemnity fund as
- 26 created in section 455J.2.
- 27 Sec. 9. Section 455B.200A, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 28 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- 29 a. An indemnity fee as provided in section 455J.3 which
- 30 the department shall deposit into the manure-storage animal
- 31 feeding operation indemnity fund created in section 455J.2.
- 32 Sec. 10. Section 455I.6, subsection 2, Code 1999, is
- 33 amended to read as follows:
- 34 2. Moneys collected from the assessment of civil penalties
- 35 and interest on civil penalties as provided for in this

- 1 section shall be deposited in the manure-storage animal
- 2 feeding operation indemnity fund as created in section 455J.2.
- 3 Sec. 11. Section 455J.1, subsection 5, Code 1999, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5. "Fund" means the manure-storage animal feeding
- 6 operation indemnity fund created in section 455J.2.
- 7 Sec. 12. Section 455J.2, subsections 1 and 3, Code 1999,
- 8 are amended to read as follows:
- 9 1. A-manure-storage-indemnity An animal feeding operation
- 10 indemnity fund is created as a separate fund in the state
- 11 treasury under the control of the department. The general
- 12 fund of the state is not liable for claims presented against
- 13 the fund.
- 14 3. The moneys collected under this section shall be
- 15 deposited in the fund and shall be appropriated to the
- 16 department for the exclusive-purpose-of-providing-moneys-for
- 17 following purposes:
- 18 a. Supporting programs as provided for in this chapter,
- 19 including providing for the cleanup of abandoned facilities as
- 20 provided in section 455J.5, and to pay the department for
- 21 costs related to administering the provisions of this chapter.
- 22 For each fiscal year, the department shall not use more than
- 23 one percent of the total amount which is available in the fund
- 24 or ten thousand dollars, whichever is less, to pay for the
- 25 costs of administration.
- 26 b. Paying for administrative costs associated with an
- 27 emergency order issued by the department of agriculture and
- 28 land stewardship pursuant to section 159.32.
- 29 Moneys in the fund shall not be subject to appropriation or
- 30 expenditure for any other purpose than provided in this
- 31 section.
- 32 Sec. 13. Section 455J.2, subsection 5, paragraph b, Code
- 33 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- 34 b. The executive council may allocate moneys from the
- 35 general fund of the state as provided in section 7D.10A in an

- 1 amount necessary to support the fund, including-payment-of
- 2 claims-as-provided-in-section-455d-5 in order to support a
- 3 program provided in this chapter or an emergency order issued
- 4 by the department of agriculture and land stewardship pursuant
- 5 to section 159.32. However, an allocation of moneys from the
- 6 general fund of the state shall be made only if the amount of
- 7 moneys in the fund, which are not obligated or encumbered, and
- 8 not counting the department's estimate of the cost to the fund
- 9 for pending or unsettled claims and any amount required to be
- 10 credited to the general fund of the state under this
- 11 subsection, is less than one million dollars.
- 12 Sec. 14. NEW SECTION. 717.7 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
- 13 AND LAND STEWARDSHIP -- EMERGENCY ORDER.
- 14 The department of agriculture and land stewardship may
- 15 provide for the rescue and disposition of neglected animals as
- 16 provided in section 159.32.
- 17 EXPLANATION
- 18 This bill provides that the department of agriculture and
- 19 land stewardship may issue an emergency order for the care and
- 20 feeding of livestock kept in animal feeding operations. The
- 21 order applies to an animal feeding operation that keeps 500 or
- 22 more animal units as defined in Code section 455J.1. The bill
- 23 provides that, regardless of the number of animal units kept
- 24 at the animal feeding operation, the order shall apply to an
- 25 animal feeding operation which keeps more than 500 cattle,
- 26 1,000 swine, or 20,000 chickens or turkeys.
- 27 The bill provides that the county board of supervisors in
- 28 the county where the animal feeding operation is located must
- 29 petition the department. The bill provides that the emergency
- 30 order may provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by a
- 31 county in providing maintenance to neglected livestock as
- 32 provided in Code section 717.5, if the county subrogates its
- 33 right to receive moneys from the disposition of the animals
- 34 under that section. The bill allows the department to rescue,
- 35 maintain, and dispose of animals in the same manner that a

1 county may rescue, maintain, or dispose of the animals under 2 those Code sections. It also authorizes the department to 3 petition a court to be appointed as a receiver of the animals, 4 in order to take custody of the animals, and to provide for 5 their disposition according to a plan approved by the court. 6 The bill provides for the reimbursement to the department for 7 costs related to administration. The bill imposes a statutory lien on all property of an 9 animal feeding operation subject to receivership. 10 provides procedures for filing the lien. The bill provides 11 that the lien is superior to and shall have priority over a 12 conflicting lien or security interest in the property, 13 including a lien or security interest that was perfected prior 14 to the creation of the lien under this provision of the bill. 15 The bill also authorizes the department to order the transfer 16 of any unobligated moneys in the manure storage indemnity fund 17 which the bill renames as the animal feeding operation 18 indemnity fund. 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33

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
