ASSUMPTIONS

- l. The reimbursement rate will increase to 70.0% of usual, customary, and reasonable rates.
- 2. The annual State cost of reimbursing dentists at 70.0% of usual, customary, and reasonable rates will be approximately \$9.8 million.
- 3. The current annual State expenditure for dental reimbursements is approximately \$6.9 million.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of Senate File 2350 will be an increase in General Fund expenditures of \$2.9 million in FY 2001 and each year thereafter.
