A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing additional funding for at-risk programs and 2 providing an effective date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. H.F.

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This bill provides that a school district which received
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 2 supplementary weighting for at-risk pupils for the school
 3 budget year beginning July 1, 1999, and which does not qualify
 4 for supplementary weighting for at-risk pupils for the school
 5 budget year beginning July 1, 2000, shall receive additional
 6 funding for at-risk pupils.
      The bill provides that for the school budget year beginning
 8 July 1, 2000, a school district shall receive an amount of
 9 additional funding for at-risk pupils equivalent to 100
10 percent of the amount of supplementary weighting which the
11 district was entitled to receive for the budget year beginning
12 July 1, 1999. The bill provides that for each succeeding
13 budget year, the amount of additional funding shall be reduced
14 incrementally by 25 percent, until the school budget year
15 beginning July 1, 2004, when a school district shall not be
16 eligible to receive additional funding for at-risk pupils.
17 The bill provides that the additional funding received shall
18 be in the form of modified allowable growth established by the
19 department of management.

- 12 This bill provides that a school district which received

- 17 funding for at-risk pupils under specified circumstances.
- 18 The bill provides that for the school budget year beginning
- 19 July 1, 2000, a school district shall receive an amount of
- 20 additional funding for at-risk pupils equivalent to 100
- 21 percent of the amount of supplementary weighting which the
- 22 district was entitled to receive for the budget year beginning
- 23 July 1, 1999. The bill provides that for each succeeding
- 24 budget year, the amount of additional funding shall be reduced
- 25 incrementally by 25 percent, until the school budget year

The bill provides that if the 2 amount received pursuant to Code section 257.41 is less than 3 the amount of supplementary weighting which the district was 4 entitled to receive for the budget year beginning July 1, 5 1999, then for the applicable school budget year a district 6 shall receive the sum of the amount received pursuant to the 7 fully funded dropout and dropout prevention levy and the 8 amount of supplementary weighting which the district was 9 entitled to receive for the budget year beginning July 1, 10 1999. The bill provides that if a fully funded dropout and 11 dropout prevention program results in an amount received that 12 is equal to or exceeds the amount of supplementary weighting 13 which the district was entitled to receive for the budget year beginning July 1, 1999, a district shall not receive 15 additional funding.

The bill further provides that the department of education shall annually prepare a report regarding school finance provisions or programs receiving a standing appropriation, including supplementary weighting programs. The report shall provide information regarding amounts received by school districts, trends regarding increases or decreases observed, and adequacy and equity issues. The bill provides that the report shall be submitted to the general assembly by January 1 each year, and copies of the report shall be forwarded to the chairpersons and members of the committee on education in the senate and the house of representatives.
