Additional information to be 8 collected under the bill includes: the name of the facility 9 at which the termination of pregnancy took place; the name of 10 the city or location at which the termination of pregnancy 11 took place; the name of the attending physician; the name of 12 the person completing the report; the confidential 13 identification number of the patient; the city, county, state, 14 and zip code of the area in which the patient resides; whether 15 the patient is of Hispanic or non-Hispanic origin; the 16 ancestry of the patient; if previous live births have **7** occurred, whether the children are living or deceased at the 18 time of the reporting; the type of termination procedure used, 19 if the termination is induced; and the month, day, and year on 20 which the patient's last menstrual period began. The bill 21 also makes conforming changes relating to the use of a 22 confidential patient identification number, and makes changes 23 relating to the dissemination of information.
