			A BILL FOR
1	An	Act making	an appropriation to the college student aid
2			for the teacher shortage forgivable loan program.
3	BE		BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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JF 2405 APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of 2 the state to the college student aid commission for the fiscal 3 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the 4 following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to 5 be used for the purpose designated: For the teacher shortage forgivable loan program 7 established in section 261.111: 600,000 Sec. 2. Section 261.111, subsections 2 and 4, Code 10 Supplement 1999, are amended to read as follows: 11 The director of the department of education, in 12 consultation with the director of human services, shall 13 annually designate the areas in which teacher shortages are 14 anticipated. The director shall periodically conduct a survey 15 of school districts, accredited nonpublic schools, and 16 approved practitioner preparation programs to determine 17 current shortage areas and predict future shortage areas. 18 director of human services shall periodically conduct a survey 19 of high-quality child care providers, as determined under 20 section 237A.30, subsection 1, to determine current and to 21 predict future preschool teacher shortage areas. 4. Forgivable loans to eligible students shall not become 22 23 due until after the student graduates or leaves school. 24 individual's total loan amount, including principal and 25 interest, shall be reduced by twenty percent for each year in a 26 which the individual remains an Iowa resident and is employed. 27 in Iowa by a school district, or an accredited nonpublic 28 school, or a high-quality child care provider that is a holder 29 of the gold seal quality designation as provided in section 30 237A.30, as a practitioner in the teacher shortage area for 31 which the loan was approved. If the commission determines 32 that the person does not meet the criteria for forgiveness of 33 the principal and interest payments, the commission shall 34 establish a plan for repayment of the principal and interest

35 over a ten-year period. If a person required to make the

1 repayment does not make the required payments, the commission 2 shall provide for payment collection. 3 **EXPLANATION** This bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the 5 state to the college student aid commission for the teacher 6 shortage forgivable loan program for fiscal year 2000-2001. The bill also expands the teacher shortage forgivable loan 7 8 program by permitting the college student aid commission to 9 provide forgivable loans issued to individuals who met the 10 program eligibility requirements, qualified for and received a 11 loan, and who are employed within the state by a high quality 12 child care provider which holds the gold seal quality 13 designation awarded by the department of human services. 14 The bill instructs the director of human services to 15 periodically conduct a survey of high quality child care 16 providers to determine current and predict future preschool 17 teacher shortage areas. The bill also requires the director 18 of the department of education to consult with the director of 19 human services when designating current and predicting future 20 teacher shortage areas. The college student aid commission 21 uses the director's list of designated areas when determining 22 which individuals are eligible for forgivable loans under the 23 program. 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32

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
