### A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating funds to the department of economic  
2 development, certain board of regents institutions, the  
3 department of workforce development, the public employment  
4 relations board, and making related statutory changes, and  
5 providing an effective date provision.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. There is  
 2 appropriated from the general fund of the state and other  
 3 designated funds to the department of economic development for  
 4 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,  
 5 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is  
 6 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

7 1. ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION

8 a. General administration

9 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
 10 for allocating \$250,000 to the world food prize, and for  
 11 providing that a business receiving moneys from the department  
 12 for the purpose of job creation shall make available ten  
 13 percent of the new jobs created for promise jobs program  
 14 participants who are qualified for the jobs created, and for  
 15 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

16 .....	\$	1,720,213
17 .....	FTEs	25.75

18 b. Film office

19 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
 20 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
 21 positions:

22 .....	\$	257,625
23 .....	FTEs	2.00

24 c. Iowa commission on volunteerism

25 For transferring to the Iowa state commission grant program  
 26 to be used as matching funds for salaries, support,  
 27 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

30 2. BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

31 a. Business development operations

32 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
 33 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
 34 positions:

35 .....	\$	4,510,534
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1 ..... FTEs 25.75

2 Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph "a", \$672,000  
3 shall be allocated to support activities in conjunction with  
4 the Iowa manufacturing technology center, and \$100,000 shall  
5 be allocated to the graphic arts center.

6 b. Workforce recruitment initiative

7 For workforce recruitment initiative purposes, including  
8 salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and  
9 for not more than the following full-time equivalent

10 positions:

11 ..... \$ 393,217

12 ..... FTEs 2.00

13 c. Strategic investment fund

14 For deposit in the Iowa strategic investment fund for  
15 salaries, support, and for not more than the following full-  
16 time equivalent positions:

17 ..... \$ 3,700,000

18 ..... FTEs 12.50

19 For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June  
20 30, 2001, the Iowa economic development board shall allocate  
21 from the Iowa strategic investment fund at least \$4,500,000 to  
22 the value-added agricultural products and processes financial  
23 assistance fund created in section 15E.112.

24 The department may allocate from the Iowa strategic  
25 investment fund up to \$96,000 for the microbusiness rural  
26 enterprise assistance program under section 15.114.

27 By January 14, 2001, the department shall submit a written  
28 report to the members of the joint appropriations subcommittee  
29 on economic development and the legislative fiscal bureau on  
30 the progress made by the department in making the community  
31 economic betterment program a self-sustaining, revolving loan  
32 program. The report shall include information regarding the  
33 department's progress in making the community economic  
34 betterment program self-sufficient and projections and plans  
35 for continuing to make the program self-sufficient over the

1 subsequent five years.

2 d. Insurance economic development

3 There is appropriated from moneys collected by the division  
4 of insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues under  
5 section 505.7, subsection 3, to the department for the fiscal  
6 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the  
7 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for  
8 insurance economic development and international insurance  
9 economic development:

10 ..... \$ 100,000

11 e. Value-added agriculture

12 There is appropriated from the moneys available to support  
13 value-added agricultural products and processes, 6 percent, or  
14 so much thereof as is necessary, for administration of the  
15 value-added agricultural products and processes financial  
16 assistance program as provided in section 15E.111, including  
17 salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and  
18 for not more than 3.00 FTEs.

19 The department shall collaborate with the university of  
20 northern Iowa on a strategic initiative to develop ag-based  
21 industrial lubrication technology and to create projects to  
22 deploy the technology in commercial applications.  
23 Notwithstanding the requirements of section 15E.111 and the  
24 administrative rules for value-added agricultural products and  
25 processes, the department shall allocate \$275,000 for this  
26 initiative.

27 3. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

28 a. Community assistance

29 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
30 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
31 positions for administration of the community economic  
32 preparedness program, the Iowa community betterment program,  
33 and the city development board:

34 ..... \$ 855,031

35 ..... FTEs 10.50

1     b. Main street/rural main street program  
2     For salaries and support for not more than the following  
3 full-time equivalent positions:  
4 ..... \$       427,698  
5 ..... FTEs       3.00

6     Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys committed to grantees  
7 under contract from the general fund of the state that remain  
8 unexpended on June 30, 2001, shall not revert to any fund but  
9 shall remain available for expenditure for purposes of the  
10 contract during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001.

11    c. Community development program  
12    For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
13 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
14 positions, for rural resource coordination, rural community  
15 leadership, rural innovations grant program, and the rural  
16 enterprise fund:  
17 ..... \$       958,440  
18 ..... FTEs       7.50

19    There is appropriated from the rural community 2000 program  
20 revolving fund established in section 15.287 to provide to  
21 Iowa's councils of governments funds for planning and  
22 technical assistance to local governments:

23 ..... \$       150,000  
24    There is appropriated from the rural community 2000 program  
25 revolving fund established in section 15.287 to the rural  
26 development program for the purposes of the program including  
27 the rural enterprise fund and collaborative skills development  
28 training:

29 ..... \$       370,000  
30    Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys committed to grantees  
31 under contract from the general fund of the state or through  
32 transfers from the Iowa community development loan fund or  
33 from the rural community 2000 program revolving fund that  
34 remain unexpended on June 30, 2001, shall not revert but shall  
   be available for expenditure for purposes of the contract

1 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001.

2 d. Community development block grant and HOME

3 For administration and related federal housing and urban  
4 development grant administration for salaries, support,  
5 maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the  
6 following full-time equivalent positions:

7 ..... \$ 406,000

8 ..... FTEs 21.75

9 e. Housing development and shelter assistance funds

10 For providing technical assistance to communities of all  
11 sizes and local financial institutions to help meet local  
12 housing needs, and to provide and transfer matching funds for  
13 the HOME program, and to provide \$400,000 to the shelter  
14 assistance fund, and for not more than the following full-time  
15 equivalent positions:

16 ..... \$ 500,000

17 ..... FTEs 2.00

18 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys committed to grantees  
19 under contract from the housing development fund and moneys  
20 transferred for matching funds for the HOME program that  
21 remain unexpended or unobligated on June 30, 2001, shall not  
22 revert to any fund but shall remain available for obligation  
23 and expenditure for purposes of those programs during the  
24 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001.

25 4. INTERNATIONAL DIVISION

26 a. International trade operations

27 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
28 for support of foreign representation and trade offices, and  
29 the agricultural product advisory council, and for not more  
30 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

31 ..... \$ 2,059,569

32 ..... FTEs 11.25

33 From among the full-time equivalent positions authorized by  
34 this lettered paragraph, one position shall concentrate on the  
35 export sale of grain, one on the export sale of livestock, and

1 one on the export sale of value-added agricultural products.

2 b. Export trade assistance program

3 For export trade activities, including a program to  
4 encourage and increase participation in trade shows and trade  
5 missions by providing financial assistance to businesses for a  
6 percentage of their costs of participating in trade shows and  
7 trade missions, by providing for the lease/sublease of  
8 showcase space in existing world trade centers, by providing  
9 temporary office space for foreign buyers, international  
10 prospects, and potential reverse investors, and by providing  
11 other promotional and assistance activities, including  
12 salaries and support:

13 ..... \$ 408,000

14 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
15 lettered paragraph that remain unencumbered or unobligated at  
16 the close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
17 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until  
18 the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

19 c. For the partner state program to contract with private  
20 groups or organizations which are the most appropriate to  
21 administer this program and the groups and organizations  
22 participating in the program shall, to the fullest extent  
23 possible, provide the funds to match the appropriation made in  
24 this paragraph:

25 ..... \$ 120,000

26 5. TOURISM DIVISION

27 Tourism operations and advertising

28 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
29 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
30 positions:

31 ..... \$ 4,940,413

32 ..... FTEs 18.52

33 Any state-owned interstate welcome center located in  
34 suitable, year-round facilities shall be operated on a year-  
round basis.

1 The department shall not use the moneys appropriated in  
2 this subsection, unless the department develops public-private  
3 partnerships with Iowa businesses in the tourism industry,  
4 Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism organizations, and political  
5 subdivisions in this state to assist in the development of  
6 advertising efforts. The department shall, to the fullest  
7 extent possible, develop cooperative efforts for advertising  
8 with contributions from other sources.

9 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND. Notwithstanding  
10 section 15E.120, subsections 5, 6, and 7, and section 15.287,  
11 there is appropriated from the Iowa community development loan  
12 fund all the moneys available during the fiscal year beginning  
13 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, to the department of  
14 economic development for the community development program to  
15 be used by the department for the purposes of the program.

16 Sec. 3. JOB TRAINING FUND. Notwithstanding section  
17 15.251, subsection 2, there is appropriated from the job  
18 training fund to the department of workforce development for  
19 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30,  
20 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is  
21 necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

22 1. For the target alliance program:

23 ..... \$ 30,000

24 2. After the appropriation in subsection 1 relating to the  
25 target alliance program, all remaining moneys in the job  
26 training fund, including any moneys appropriated or credited  
27 to the fund during the fiscal year, shall be transferred to  
28 the workforce development fund established pursuant to section  
29 15.343.

30 Sec. 4. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated  
31 from the workforce development fund account created in section  
32 15.342A, to the workforce development fund created in section  
33 15.343, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending  
34 June 30, 2001, the following amount, for the purposes of the  
35 workforce development fund, and for not more than the



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1 following full-time equivalent positions:

2 ..... \$ 9,000,000

3 ..... FTEs 4.00

4 Sec. 5. From funds appropriated or transferred to or  
5 receipts credited to the workforce development fund created in  
6 section 15.343, up to \$400,000 for the fiscal year beginning  
7 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, may be used for the  
8 administration of workforce development activities including  
9 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes and  
10 for not more than 4.00 FTEs.

11 Sec. 6. IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY. There is appropriated from  
12 the general fund of the state to the Iowa state university of  
13 science and technology for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
14 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so  
15 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
16 designated:

17 1. For funding and maintaining in their current locations  
18 the existing small business development centers, and for not  
19 more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

20 ..... \$ 1,411,869

21 ..... FTEs 5.80

22 2. For the Iowa state university of science and technology  
23 research park, including salaries, support, maintenance,  
24 miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following  
25 full-time equivalent positions:

26 ..... \$ 377,109

27 ..... FTEs 4.31

28 3. For funding the institute for physical research and  
29 technology, provided that \$306,000 shall be allocated to the  
30 industrial incentive program and for not more than the  
31 following full-time equivalent positions:

32 ..... \$ 4,406,995

33 ..... FTEs 46.42

34 It is the intent of the general assembly that the  
35 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial sectors

1 and seek contributions and in-kind donations from businesses,  
2 industrial foundations, and trade associations and that moneys  
3 for the institute for physical research and technology  
4 industrial incentive program shall only be allocated for  
5 projects which are matched by private sector moneys for  
6 directed contract research or for nondirected research. The  
7 match required of small businesses as defined in section  
8 15.102, subsection 4, for directed contract research or for  
9 nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds.

10 The match required for other businesses for directed contract  
11 research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1  
12 of state funds. The match required of industrial foundations  
13 or trade associations shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.

14 Iowa state university of science and technology shall  
15 report annually to the joint appropriations subcommittee on  
16 economic development and legislative fiscal bureau the total  
17 amounts of private contributions, the proportion of  
18 contributions from small businesses and other businesses, and  
19 the proportion for directed contract research and nondirected  
20 research of benefit to Iowa businesses and industrial sectors.

21 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
22 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close  
23 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available  
24 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of  
25 the succeeding fiscal year.

26 Sec. 7. UNIVERSITY OF IOWA. There is appropriated from  
27 the general fund of the state to the state university of Iowa  
28 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June  
29 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is  
30 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

31 1. For the university of Iowa research park, including  
32 salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, miscellaneous  
33 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
34 equivalent positions:

35 ..... \$ 336,669

1 ..... FTEs 2.15

2 2. For funding the advanced drug development program at  
3 the Oakdale research park, and for not more than the following  
4 full-time equivalent positions:

5 ..... \$ 271,770

6 ..... FTEs 3.50

7 The board of regents shall submit a report on the progress  
8 of regents institutions in meeting the strategic plan for  
9 technology transfer and economic development to the secretary  
10 of the senate, the chief clerk of the house of  
11 representatives, and the legislative fiscal bureau by January  
12 15, 2001.

13 Sec. 8. UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA. There is  
14 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
15 university of northern Iowa for the fiscal year beginning July  
16 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or  
17 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
18 designated:

19 1. For the metal casting institute, including salaries,  
20 support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more  
21 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

22 ..... \$ 172,356

23 ..... FTEs 2.60

24 2. For the institute of decision making, including  
25 salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and  
26 for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
27 positions:

28 ..... \$ 741,439

29 ..... FTEs 8.00

30 Sec. 9. ACCELERATED CAREER EDUCATION GRANT PROGRAM. If  
31 Senate Study Bill 3187 is enacted by the Seventy-eighth  
32 General Assembly, 2000 Session, there is appropriated from the  
33 general fund of the state to the college student aid  
34 commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and  
35 ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof

1 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

2 For the accelerated career education grant program,  
3 including salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous  
4 purposes:

5 ..... \$ 250,000

6 Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There is  
7 appropriated from the general fund of the state, to the  
8 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the  
10 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the  
11 purposes designated:

12 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

13 For the division of labor services, including salaries,  
14 support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more  
15 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

16 ..... \$ 3,325,363

17 ..... FTEs 88.50

18 From the contractor registration fees, the division of  
19 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections  
20 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under  
21 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

22 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

23 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
24 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
25 positions:

28 The division of workers' compensation shall continue  
29 charging a \$65 filing fee for workers' compensation cases.  
30 The filing fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim.  
31 However, the fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing  
32 party, except in cases where it would impose an undue hardship  
33 or be unjust under the circumstances.

34 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT STATE AND REGIONAL BOARDS

35 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,

1 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
2 position for the workforce development state and regional

7 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes  
8 for collection of labor market information, and for not more  
9 than the following full-time equivalent position:

12 It is the intent of the general assembly that, by July 1,  
13 2001, the department of workforce development assume the  
14 responsibility for conducting the labor shed survey analysis  
15 currently conducted by the institute for decision making. By  
16 July 1, 2001, the department of workforce development shall  
17 produce labor market information that meet the requirements of  
18 the department of workforce development, the department of  
19 economic development, and the federal department of labor.

20 5. WELFARE-TO-WORK MATCHING FUNDS

21 For matching funds for welfare-to-work grants authorized  
22 through the United States department of labor to provide  
23 additional services for the hardest to employ recipients of  
24 family investment program benefits and for salaries, support,  
25 maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the  
26 following full-time equivalent positions:

27 .....	\$	853,000
28 .....	FTEs	3.55

29 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
30 subsection which remain unexpended or unobligated on June 30,  
31 2001, shall not revert to the general fund of the state but  
32 shall remain available for expenditure for the same purpose  
33 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001.

34 Sec. 11. ADMINISTRATIVE CONTRIBUTION SURCHARGE FUND.

35 There is appropriated from the administrative contribution

1 surcharge fund of the state to the department of workforce  
2 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and  
3 ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much  
4 thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

5 1. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT CENTERS

6 Notwithstanding section 96.7, subsection 12, paragraph "c",  
7 for salaries, support, maintenance, conducting labor  
8 availability surveys, miscellaneous purposes, for workforce  
9 development regional advisory board member expenses, and for  
10 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

11 ..... \$ 7,500,000  
12 ..... FTEs 124.97

13 2. NEW EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

14 Notwithstanding section 96.7, subsection 12, paragraph "c",  
15 for salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
16 and the new employment opportunity program established in  
17 section 84A.10, and for not more than the following full-time  
18 equivalent positions:

19 ..... \$ 1,500,000  
20 ..... FTEs 1.79

21 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
22 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
23 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
24 available for expenditure for the new employment opportunity  
25 program until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

26 Sec. 12. EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND. There is  
27 appropriated from the special employment security contingency  
28 fund to the department of workforce development for the fiscal  
29 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the  
30 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the  
31 purposes designated:

32 1. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

33 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
34 purposes:

35 ..... \$ 471,000

2. IMMIGRATION SERVICE CENTERS

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes for the establishment of pilot immigration service centers:

..... \$ 200,000

The department of workforce development shall establish a pilot partnership between the private and public sectors to be called the Iowa immigration service center.

The centers shall offer one-stop services to deal with the multiple issues related to immigration and employment. The centers shall provide support to immigrants and Iowa employers. The support shall primarily take the form of immigration counseling and technical assistance on such issues as forms, documentation, and recruitment of immigrant workers. The centers shall provide information and referral services regarding translation services, language training, job placement assistance in cooperation with the department of workforce development. The centers shall offer resettlement assistance including referral to appropriate education and community service resources, but shall not duplicate services provided by the Iowa refugee services bureau of the department of human services.

The center shall seek private sector matching moneys and shall be managed by a nonprofit, statewide agency with an established record of international services and linkages to federal government. A board of directors for the center shall include representatives from the business community, the legal community, private sector service providers, the department of human services, department of education, the department of workforce development, the department of economic development, the general assembly, the governor's office, and the Iowa refugee services bureau of the department of human services.

3. LABOR SURVEY PROGRAMS

To upgrade labor survey computer program applications to incorporate labor shed information and to contract with the

1 institute for decision making at the university of northern  
2 Iowa for labor shed training:

13 Any additional penalty and interest revenue may be used to  
14 accomplish the mission of the department upon notification of  
15 the use to the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint  
16 appropriations subcommittee on economic development, the  
17 department of management, and the legislative fiscal bureau.  
18 However, the department shall not allocate any additional  
19 penalty and interest revenue prior to January 30, 2001. If  
20 department projections indicate the special employment  
21 security contingency fund revenues will be insufficient to  
22 fund all appropriations under this section, the department  
23 shall fully fund subsections 1 through 4 before fully funding  
24 the appropriation under subsection 5.

Dear Mr. Secretary:

I hereby transmit Senate File 2428, an Act appropriating funds to the department of economic development, certain board of regents institutions, the department of workforce development, the public employment relations board, making related statutory changes, and providing an effective date.

Economic development touches all Iowans, and I am pleased that this bill seeks to provide additional opportunities throughout our state. It is notable that several initiatives the Lieutenant Governor and I developed to create more Iowans, younger Iowans, and better paid Iowans are contained within this bill. Our state will benefit from additional worker training opportunities at community colleges through the ACE program, assistance to businesses that provide new employment opportunities for Iowans with disabilities and minority population, additional immigration services, and worker safety. These are quality of life issues that better our state and make it more attractive to those looking for a place to live and work.

Senate File 2428 is, therefore, approved on this date with the following exceptions, which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve section 1, subsection 2a, unnumbered paragraph 3. This would require the department of economic development and the small business development centers develop a written report on services provided by each and identify the distinct services to be provided by the department and the small business development centers and recommend actions that would eliminate any duplication of services. The department and the small business development centers undertook this exercise prior to the last legislative session. It would be more appropriate for them to continue working on resolving issues under consideration from that report than to re-start the process from the beginning.

I am unable to approve the designated portion of section 12, subsection 5, unnumbered paragraph 2. This prevents the department of workforce development from allocating additional penalty and interest revenues prior to January 30, 2001. In the past,

the department has had the flexibility to identify projects or target areas that would receive funding and report these expenditures to the legislature. The language contained in this bill is unduly prescriptive, usurps normal executive branch functions, and could hamper administration of the fund.

I am unable to approve section 19 in its entirety. This would expand the acceptable uses of the physical infrastructure fund to include program capital costs for the accelerated career education program. Senate File 2453 already provides \$5.3 million for accelerated career education program capital projects; the \$2.5 million for the physical infrastructure assistance fund should be targeted toward community infrastructure improvement projects, such as, for example, child care facilities, that do not have an alternative funding source.

I am unable to approve section 27 in its entirety. Subsection 1 would require the information technology services division of the department of general services to study the workforce investment one-stop program and submit a report by January 15, 2001. This issue has already received thorough study, and I believe that there are more productive uses for the division and the department's time. Subsection 2 would require the department of workforce development to submit a written report by August 10, 2000 for a plan for financing the state's system of workforce development centers after the administrative contribution surcharge is repealed. The short timeframe provided for the completion of the study will make it difficult for the department to adequately address these issues as well as those involved in meeting their statutory requirements under Iowa Code Chapter 8.23.

For the above reasons, I hereby respectfully approve Senate File 2428 with the exceptions noted above.

AN ACT

APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, CERTAIN BOARD OF REGENTS INSTITUTIONS, THE DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, THE PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD, MAKING RELATED STATUTORY CHANGES, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state and other designated funds to the department of economic development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION

a. General administration

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, for allocating \$250,000 to the world food prize, and for providing that a business receiving moneys from the department for the purpose of job creation shall make available ten percent of the new jobs created for promise jobs program participants who are qualified for the jobs created, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

..... FTEs 25.75

b. Film office

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

The department shall consult and work with the small business development centers in an effort to eliminate any duplication of services provided by the department and the small business development centers and to determine how to deliver services to small businesses in the state in the most efficient manner. The department, in consultation with the small business development centers, shall develop a written report identifying and distinguishing the distinct services to be provided by the department and the small business development centers and recommend actions which would eliminate any duplication of services. By December 1, 2000, the written report shall be submitted to the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development.

For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the department shall allocate \$100,000 from the moneys appropriated under this subsection for the federal procurement office.

b. Workforce recruitment initiative

For workforce recruitment initiative purposes, including salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and

c. Strategic investment fund

The department may allocate from the Iowa strategic investment fund up to \$96,000 for the microbusiness rural enterprise assistance program under section 15.114.

By January 14, 2001, the department shall submit a written report to the members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development and the legislative fiscal bureau on the progress made by the department in making the community economic betterment program a self-sustaining, revolving loan program. The report shall include information regarding the department's progress in making the community economic betterment program self-sufficient and projections and plans for continuing to make the program self-sufficient over the subsequent five years.

d. Insurance economic development

There is appropriated from moneys collected by the division of insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection 3, to the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for insurance economic development and international insurance economic development:

e. Value-added agriculture

The department shall collaborate with the university of northern Iowa on a strategic initiative to develop ag-based industrial lubrication technology and to create projects to deploy the technology in commercial applications. Notwithstanding the requirements of section 15E.111 and the administrative rules for value-added agricultural products and processes, the department shall allocate \$275,000 for this initiative.

3. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

a. Community assistance

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions for administration of the community economic preparedness program, the Iowa community betterment program, and the city development board:

The department shall, to the fullest extent possible, develop cooperative efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

Sec. 2. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND. Notwithstanding section 15E.120, subsections 5, 6, and 7, and section 15.287, there is appropriated from the Iowa community development loan fund all the moneys available during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, to the department of economic development for the community development program to be used by the department for the purposes of the program.

Sec. 3. JOB TRAINING FUND. Notwithstanding section 15.251, subsection 2, there is appropriated from the job

training fund to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

The match required of small businesses as defined in section 15.102, subsection 4, for directed contract research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds. The match required for other businesses for directed contract research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds. The match required of industrial foundations or trade associations shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.

Iowa state university of science and technology shall report annually to the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development and legislative fiscal bureau the total amounts of private contributions, the proportion of contributions from small businesses and other businesses, and the proportion for directed contract research and nondirected research of benefit to Iowa businesses and industrial sectors.

Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

Sec. 7. UNIVERSITY OF IOWA. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. For the university of Iowa research park, including salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

2. For funding the advanced drug development program at the Oakdale research park, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

##### 1. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

##### 2. IMMIGRATION SERVICE CENTERS

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes for the establishment of pilot immigration service centers:

The department of workforce development shall establish pilot immigration service centers that offer one-stop services to deal with the multiple issues related to immigration and employment. Any additional penalty and interest revenue may be used to accomplish the mission of the department upon notification of the use to the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development, the department of management, and the legislative fiscal bureau. However, the department shall not allocate any additional penalty and interest revenue prior to January 30, 2001. If department projections indicate the special employment security contingency fund revenues will be insufficient to fund all appropriations under this section, the department shall fully fund subsections 1 through 4 before fully funding the appropriation under subsection 5.

Sec. 13. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

Sec. 14. Section 15.313, subsection 2, Code Supplement 1999, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. i. The value-added agricultural products and processes financial assistance fund created in section 15E.112.

Sec. 15. Section 15.342A, Code Supplement 1999, is amended to read as follows:

15.342A WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT FUND ACCOUNT.

A workforce development fund account is established in the office of the treasurer of state under the control of the department. The account shall receive funds pursuant to section 422.16A up to a maximum of ten eight million dollars per year. The account shall also receive funds pursuant to section 15.251 with no dollar limitation.

Sec. 16. Section 15.343, subsection 3, Code Supplement 1999, is amended to read as follows:

3. a. The director shall submit not later than January 1 of each year at a regular or special meeting, for approval by the economic development board, the proposed allocation of funds from the workforce development fund to be made for the next fiscal year for the programs and purposes contained in subsection 2. The director shall also submit a copy of the proposed allocation to the chairpersons of the joint economic development appropriations subcommittee of the general assembly. Notwithstanding section 8.39, the plan may provide for increased or decreased allocations if the demand for a program indicates that the need is greater or lesser than the allocation for that program. The director shall report on a quarterly basis to the board on the status of the funds and may present proposed revisions for approval by the board in January and April of each year. The director shall also provide quarterly reports to the legislative fiscal bureau on the status of the funds. Unobligated and unencumbered moneys remaining in the workforce development fund or any of its accounts on June 30 of each year shall be considered part of the fund for purposes of the next year's allocation.

b. The first seven million dollars deposited in the workforce development fund shall be used for purposes provided in subsection 2, paragraph "b".

Sec. 17. Section 15E.112, subsection 1, Code 1997, as amended by 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 207, section 6, is amended to read as follows:

1. A value-added agricultural products and processes financial assistance fund is created within the state treasury under the control of the department. ~~Three-million-six hundred-fifty-thousand-dollars-is-appropriated-from-the general-fund-of-the-state-to-the-fund-each-fiscal-year.~~ The fund shall consist of moneys allocated from the Iowa strategic investment fund created in section 15.313, those appropriated moneys, and any other moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the department from the federal government or private sources for placement in the fund. The assets of the fund shall be used by the department only for carrying out the purposes of section 15E.111.

Sec. 18. Section 15E.112, Code 1999, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 5. Four hundred thousand dollars is appropriated from the value-added agricultural products and processes financial assistance fund to the office of renewable fuels and coproducts created in section 159A.3 each fiscal year for deposit in the renewable fuels and coproducts fund created in section 159A.7.

Sec. 19. Section 15E.175, subsection 2, paragraph b, Code 1999, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:

NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (4) To provide funding for program capital costs under the accelerated career education program as defined in section 260G.2.

Sec. 20. NEW SECTION. 94A.10 NEW EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM.

The department of workforce development shall implement and administer a new employment opportunity program to assist individuals in underutilized segments of Iowa's workforce, including but not limited to the persons with physical or

mental disabilities, persons convicted of a crime, or minority persons between the ages of 12 and 25, to gain and retain employment. The program shall be designed to complement existing employment and training programs by providing additional flexibility and services that are often needed by individuals in underutilized segments of the workforce to gain and retain employment. Services provided under the program may include, but are not limited to, transportation costs, child care, health care, health care insurance, on-the-job training, career interest inventory assessments, employability skills assessment, short-term basic education, internships, mentoring, assisting businesses with compliance issues related to the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and reducing perceived risks that cause these populations to be underutilized. The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A to administer the program, including rules relating to eligibility criteria, eligible populations, and services to implement the intent of this section.

Sec. 21. Section 159A.7, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1997, as amended by 1997 Iowa Acts, chapter 207, section 7, is amended to read as follows:

A renewable fuels and coproducts fund is created in the state treasury under the control of the office of renewable fuels and coproducts. ~~Three-hundred-fifty-thousand-dollars-is appropriated-from-the-general-fund-of-the-state-to-the-fund each-fiscal-year.~~ The fund may also include other moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the office, including moneys from the United States, other states in the union, foreign nations, state agencies, political subdivisions, and private sources.

Sec. 22. Section 159A.7, Code 1999, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 7. Moneys appropriated pursuant to section 15E.112 shall be deposited in the fund. Not more than fifteen percent of the moneys appropriated pursuant to section 15E.112 may be used by the department for administration of the office.

VETOED

Sec. 23. Section 422.16A, Code 1999, is amended to read as follows:

422.16A JOB TRAINING WITHHOLDING -- CERTIFICATION AND TRANSFER.

Upon the completion by a business of its repayment obligation for a training project funded under chapter 260E, including a job training project funded under section 15A.8 or repaid in whole or in part by the supplemental new jobs credit from withholding under section 15A.7 or section 15.331, the sponsoring community college shall report to the department of economic development the amount of withholding paid by the business to the community college during the final twelve months of withholding payments. The department of economic development shall notify the department of revenue and finance of that amount. The department shall credit to the workforce development fund account established in section 15.342A twenty-five percent of that amount each quarter for a period of ten years. If the amount of withholding from the business or employer is insufficient, the department shall prorate the quarterly amount credited to the workforce development fund account. The maximum amount from all employers which shall be transferred to the workforce development fund account in any year is ten eight million dollars.

Sec. 24. IMMIGRATION. The department of economic development and the department of workforce development shall collaborate efforts in delivering immigration services in Iowa.

Sec. 25. NONREVERSION OF TECHNOLOGY INITIATIVES ACCOUNT MONEYS. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated and allocated to the department of economic development in 1999 Iowa Acts, chapter 207, section 5, subsection 3, paragraph "i", subparagraph (1), relating to the business licensure center, that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

Sec. 26. OFFICE SUPPLIES. When the department of economic development, the department of workforce development, and the public employment relations board make adjustments to program budgets for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, based on reduced appropriation levels, it is the intent of the general assembly that the departments and board first examine and find appropriate reductions in expenditures for office supplies and other supplies before making adjustments to program budgets.

Sec. 27. STUDIES.

1. The information technology services division of the department of general services shall study the workforce investment one-stop program of the department of workforce development to identify stakeholder entities and determine the feasibility of expanding the one-stop program concept to multiple departmental programs. By January 15, 2001, the division shall submit a report on the division's findings to the department of management, the legislative fiscal bureau, and the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development.

2. By August 10, 2000, the department of workforce development shall submit a written report relating to the funding of workforce development centers to the department of management, the legislative fiscal bureau, and the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development. The report shall include the plan of the department for financing the state's system of workforce development centers after the administrative contribution surcharge is repealed pursuant to section 96.7, subsection 12, paragraph "d". The plan shall not include a continuation of the administrative contribution surcharge.

Sec. 28. Notwithstanding the requirements of section 16.10, subsections 1 and 2, the Iowa finance authority shall, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, transfer \$1,200,000 to the department of economic development for deposit in the community development block grant account to be used as state matching funds for the federal HOME program.

*Vetoed*

Sec. 29. SHELTER ASSISTANCE FUND. In providing moneys from the shelter assistance fund to homeless shelter programs in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, the department of economic development shall explore the potential of allocating moneys to homeless shelter programs based in part on their ability to move their clients toward self-sufficiency.

Sec. 30. BUDGET PROPOSALS. The department of economic development and the department of workforce development shall submit all budget proposals in the traditional format as well as in the budgeting for results format for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001.

Sec. 31. By December 31 of each year, the ISCC liquidation corporation shall submit an annual written report to the chairpersons and the ranking members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development. The report shall include an update on the financial condition of the corporation relating to the status of any moneys, assets, or contracts currently being held by the corporation or transferred by the corporation during the prior year.

Sec. 32. FEDERAL GRANTS. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of agencies appropriated funds under this Act, not otherwise appropriated, are appropriated for the purposes set forth in the federal grants or receipts unless otherwise provided by the general assembly.

Sec. 33. Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security Act shall be appropriated to the department of workforce development and shall be used by the department for the administration of the unemployment compensation program only. This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year after December 31, 2002.

Sec. 34. In lieu of the appropriation made in section 15.365, subsection 3, there is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, \$100,000, or so much thereof as is necessary, from the general fund of the state to the department of economic development to pay refunds as provided under section 15.365.

Sec. 35. 2000 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2439, sections 1 and 9, if enacted, amending sections 15.342A and 422.16A, are repealed.

Sec. 36. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 25 of this Act, relating to the nonreversion of technology initiatives account moneys, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
