## A BILL FOR

Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135.110 BICYCLE SAFETY FUND.
 1. The director shall publish a list of bicycle helmets
 which meet the standards of the American national standards
 institute or the 1990 standard for protective headgear for use
 in bicycling produced by the Snell memorial foundation or
 another appropriate standard as adopted by the director by
 rule.

8 2. A bicycle safety fund is created in the state treasury 9 under the control of the department. All moneys collected in 10 fines for bicycle helmet violations under section 321.435 11 shall be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund shall be 12 used to provide bicycle safety education programs and assist 13 low-income families in purchasing bicycle helmets approved by 14 the director pursuant to subsection 1. Notwithstanding 15 section 12C.7, subsection 2, interest or earnings on moneys 16 deposited in the fund shall accrue to the fund.

17 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321.435 BICYCLE HELMETS. 18 1. a. A person under fourteen years of age shall not 19 operate a bicycle, or ride on a bicycle as a passenger, unless 20 that person is wearing a properly fitted and fastened bicycle 21 helmet which meets the standards of the American national 22 standards institute or the 1990 standard for protective 23 headgear for use in bicycling produced by the Snell memorial 24 foundation or another appropriate standard as adopted by the 25 director of the department of public health pursuant to 26 section 135.110.

b. A person under fourteen years of age who rides on a bicycle while in a restraining seat which is attached to the bicycle or in a trailer towed by a bicycle shall also wear a helmet as required by this section.

31 2. a. A person regularly engaged in the business of
32 renting bicycles shall require each person seeking to rent a
33 bicycle to provide the person's signature either on the rental
34 form or on a separate form indicating both of the following:
35 (1) Receipt of a written explanation of the provisions of

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1 this section and the penalties for violations.

2 (2) A statement concerning whether a person under fourteen 3 years of age will operate the bicycle.

b. A person regularly engaged in the business of renting
5 bicycles shall provide a helmet to any person required to wear
6 a helmet under this section who will operate the bicycle, if
7 the person does not already have a helmet. A reasonable fee
8 may be charged for the helmet rental.

9 c. A person regularly engaged in the business of renting 10 bicycles who complies with this section is not liable for 11 damages for any injuries sustained by a bicycle operator or 12 passenger as a result of the operator's or passenger's failure 13 to wear a helmet or to wear a properly fitted or fastened 14 helmet in violation of this section.

3. a. A person who violates subsection 1 shall receive a warning of the violation. The parent or legal guardian of a person who violates subsection 1 prior to July 1, 2000, shall also receive a warning of the violation. The parent or legal guardian of a person who violates subsection 1 on or after July 1, 2000, is subject to a scheduled fine under section 805.8, subsection 2, paragraph "ai", unless the parent or legal guardian, within a reasonable time, provides proof that the person has purchased or otherwise acquired a bicycle 4 helmet which meets the standards in subsection 1.

b. A person who violates subsection 2 on or after
September 1, 1999, is subject to a scheduled fine under
section 805.8, subsection 2, paragraph "ai".

28 Sec. 3. Section 805.8, subsection 2, Code 1999, is amended 29 by adding the following new paragraph:

30 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. ai. For violations of section 321.435 31 which are subject to a fine pursuant to that section, the 32 scheduled fine is fifteen dollars. Notwithstanding sections 33 602.8106 and 602.8108, all moneys collected pursuant to this 34 paragraph shall be deposited in the bicycle safety fund 35 created in section 135.110.

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Sec. 4. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACT. Section 25B.2, subsection 1 2 3, shall not apply to this Act. 3 EXPLANATION This bill requires persons under 14 years of age who are 4 5 operating or riding on a bicycle, including children in 6 restraining seats or trailers, to wear bicycle helmets. It 7 provides for a warning to be issued to a violator and, for 8 violations occurring prior to July 1, 2000, to the parent or 9 legal guardian of a violator. The parent or legal guardian of 10 a violator is subject to a scheduled fine of \$15 for 11 violations occurring on or after July 1, 2000, unless the 12 parent or legal guardian provides proof of acquisition of a 13 bicycle helmet within a reasonable time. The bill requires persons renting bicycles to the public to 14 15 have renters sign a release form and to provide helmets to 16 renters for a reasonable fee. The bill also provides that 17 persons renting bicycles in compliance with the requirements 18 are not liable for damages sustained as a result of an 19 operator's or passenger's failure to properly wear a helmet. 20 A person violating the requirements on or after September 1, 21 1999, is also subject to the \$15 scheduled fine. 22 Finally, the bill requires the director of the department 23 of public health to publish a list of approved bicycle helmets 24 and creates a bicycle safety fund under the control of the 25 department of public health to provide bicycle safety 26 education programs and assist low-income families in 27 purchasing bicycle helmets. Moneys collected for violations 28 of this bill are deposited in the bicycle safety fund. This bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code 29 30 section 25B.3. This bill makes inapplicable Code section 31 25B.2, subsection 3, which would relieve a political 32 subdivision from complying with a state mandate if funding for 33 the cost of the state mandate is not provided or specified. 34 Therefore, political subdivisions are required to comply with 35 any state mandate included in this bill.
