## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the establishment of a beginning teacher 2 induction program.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4

3 7. "Mentor" means an individual employed by a school 4 district or area education agency as a classroom teacher and 5 who holds a valid license to teach issued under chapter 272. 6 The individual shall, at a minimum, have a record of four

9 basis, and demonstrate professional commitment to the

14 1. A board of directors participating in the beginning
15 teacher induction program shall appoint a district
16 facilitator, whose duties shall include, but are not limited
17 to, overseeing the development of a plan for meeting the goals
18 of the program as set forth in section 256 E .1 , and composing a
19 district committee pursuant to subsection 2 . The board of
20 directors may contract with a public or private postsecondary
21 institution with an approved practitioner preparation program,
22 or with a member of the instructional staff of an approved
23 practitioner preparation program, to perform the duties of the 24 district facilitator in accordance with this chapter.
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mentors and beginning teachers; the minimum amount of release time for mentors and beginning teachers for meetings for planning, demonstration, observation, feedback, and workshops; the process for dissolving mentoring partnerships; and the process for measuring the results of the program. The district committee shall recommend to the board of directors the names of classroom teachers eligible to be mentors.
4. The district facilitator shall submit the plan, and the proposed costs of implementing the plan, to the board of directors, which shall consider the plan and, once approved, submit the plan and a reasonable cost proposal to the department of education, which shall award grants as equitably as possible based on the geographic and population diversity
14 of the school districts submitting plans. Grants may be
15 awarded in subsequent years based upon the most recent plan on 16 file with the department.
the costs of the employer's share of contributions to federal social security and the Iowa public employees' retirement system or a pension and annuity retirement system established under chapter 294, for such amounts paid by the district.
3. Moneys received by a school district under this chapter are miscellaneous income for purposes of chapter 257 or are considered encumbered. Each local school district shall maintain a separate listing within its budget for payments received and expenditures made pursuant to this section. Moneys received for purposes of this chapter shall not be used for payment of any collective bargaining agreement or arbitrator's decision negotiated or awarded under chapter 20.
4. A beginning teacher induction fund is established in the office of the treasurer of state to be administered by the department. Moneys appropriated by the general assembly for deposit in the fund shall be used to provide funding to school districts pursuant to the requirements of this section.
5. Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds remaining on June 30 of the fiscal year for which the funds were appropriated shall not revert but shall be available for expenditure in the following fiscal year for the purposes of this section.

Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 256E. 6 REPORTS.
The board of directors of a school district implementing an approved beginning teacher induction program as provided in this chapter shall submit an assessment of the program's results by July 1 of the fiscal year succeeding the year in which the school district received moneys under this chapter. The department shall annually report the statewide results of the program to the chairpersons and the ranking members of the senate and house education committees by January 1.

EXPLANATION
This bill creates a beginning teacher induction program to promote excellence in teaching, build a supportive environment in school districts, increase the retention of promising
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1 beginning teachers, and promote the personal and professional 2 well-being of teachers.
3 The bill directs the department of education to develop a 4 process to be used in awarding beginning teacher grants.

A teacher serving as a mentor under the program is eligible 6 for an award of $\$ 500$ per semester of participation. Moneys
7 received by a district shall be expended to implement the
8 plan, for awards to mentors, and for the costs of the
9 employer's share of contributions to federal social security 10 and the Iowa public employees' retirement system or a pension 11 and annuity retirement system established under chapter 294, 12 for such amounts paid by the districts.
13 The bill establishes a beginning teacher induction fund in 14 the office of the treasurer of state to be administered by the 15 department of education.
16 A school district shall appoint a district facilitator 17 whose duties include overseeing the development of a plan for 18 meeting program goals and composing a district committee. The 19 district committee membership shall include, but is not 20 limited tor the district facilitator, licensed teachers and an 21 area education agency staff development professional. The 22 district committee must adopt a plan and written procedures 23 for a mentor program which shall, at a minimum, address the 24 mentor selection and training processes; the timetable for 25 plan implementation; placement; minimum contact and release

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1 plans based solely upon equitability and geographic and 2 population diversity.
3 The bill also defines a mentor as a licensed classroom 4 teacher employed by a school district or area education agency
5 as a classroom teacher, with a record of at least four years 6 of effective practice, who has been employed for one full year
7 on a nonprobationary basis, and who demonstrates professional
8 commitment to the improvement of teaching and learning, and
9 the development of beginning teachers.
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
