Section 1. <u>New Section</u>. 261.86 NATIONAL GUARD
 2 EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

1. A national guard educational assistance program is
4 established to be administered by the college student aid
5 commission for members of the Iowa national guard who are
6 enrolled as undergraduate students in a community college, an
7 institution of higher learning under the state board of
8 regents, or an accredited private institution. The college
9 student aid commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
10 17A to administer this section. An individual is eligible for
11 the national guard educational assistance program if the
12 individual meets all of the following conditions:
13 a. Is a resident of the state and a member of an Iowa army

14 or air national guard unit while receiving educational 15 assistance pursuant to this section.

16 b. Satisfactorily completed required initial active duty
17 training.

18 c. Maintains satisfactory performance of duty upon return 19 from initial active duty training, including attending a 20 minimum ninety percent of scheduled drill dates and attending 21 annual training.

d. Is enrolled as an undergraduate student in a community college as defined in section 260C.2, an institution of higher learning under the control of the board of regents, or an sccredited private institution as defined in section 261.9, and is maintaining satisfactory academic progress.

e. Provides proper notice of national guard status to the
community college or institution at the time of registration
for the term in which tuition benefits are sought.

30 f. Submits an application to the adjutant general of Iowa, 31 on forms prescribed by the adjutant general, who shall 32 determine eligibility and whose decision is final.

33 2. The amount of educational assistance received by a 34 national guard member pursuant to this section shall be 35 determined by the adjutant general and shall not exceed the

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1 resident tuition rate established for institutions of higher 2 learning under the control of the state board of regents. If 3 the amount appropriated in a fiscal year for purposes of this 4 section is insufficient to provide educational assistance to 5 all national guard members who apply for the program and who 6 are determined by the adjutant general to be eligible for the 7 program, the adjutant general shall determine the amount of 8 educational assistance each eligible guard member shall 9 receive. However, educational assistance paid to an eligible 10 national guard member shall not be less than an amount equal 11 to fifty percent of the resident tuition rate established for 12 institutions of higher learning under the control of the state 13 board of regents. The adjutant general shall not determine 14 educational assistance amounts based upon a national guard 15 member's unit, the location at which drills are attended, or 16 whether the eligible individual is a member of the Iowa army 17 or air national guard.

18 3. An eligible member of the national guard, attending an 19 institution as provided in subsection 1, paragraph "d", as a 20 full-time student, shall not receive educational assistance 21 under this section for more than eight semesters, or if 22 attending as a part-time student for not more than sixteen 23 semesters, of undergraduate study, or the trimester or quarter 24 equivalent. A national guard member who has met the 25 educational requirements for a baccalaureate degree is 26 ineligible for educational assistance under this section.

4. The eligibility of applicants and amounts of educational assistance to be paid shall be certified by the adjutant general of Iowa to the college student aid commission, and all amounts that are or become due to a community college, accredited private institution, or institution of higher learning under the control of the state board of regents under this section shall be paid to the college or institution by the college student aid commission upon receipt of certification by the president or governing

1 board of the educational institution as to accuracy of charges 2 made, and as to the attendance and academic progress of the 3 individual at the educational institution. The college 4 student aid commission shall maintain an annual record of the 5 number of participants and the dollar value of the educational 6 assistance provided.

7 5. For purposes of this section, unless otherwise
8 required, "educational assistance" means the same as "cost of
9 attendance" as defined in Title IV, part B, of the federal
10 Higher Education Act of 1965 as amended.

11 Sec. 2. Section 261.21, Code 1999, is repealed.
12 EXPLANATION

13 This bill repeals the national guard tuition aid program, 14 and creates the national guard education assistance program 15 under the administration of the college student aid 16 commission.

17 The main difference between the program repealed under the 18 bill and the newly created program, is that the new program 19 provides an eligible national guard member with a maximum 20 level of educational assistance equal to up to 100 percent, 21 rather than up to 50 percent, of the resident tuition rate at 22 regents universities. As with the tuition aid program, the 23 eligible member may use the educational assistance for 24 undergraduate studies at any community college, regents 25 university, or accredited private institution.

Another difference between the old and new program is the change from "tuition aid" to "educational assistance". "Educational assistance", as defined by the bill, is the cost of attendance as defined by the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. Under the federal Act, "cost of attendance" includes but is not limited to tuition and fees, including the rental or purchase of equipment; room and board; books, materials, supplies, transportation, and miscellaneous personal expenses; dependent care during the time the person is in class; costs associated with employment in a cooperative

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1 program; and loan origination fees.

2 As with the tuition aid program, under the educational 3 assistance program, an individual is eligible for the program 4 if the individual is a resident of the state and a member of 5 an Iowa army or air national guard unit, satisfactorily 6 completed required initial active duty training, maintains 7 satisfactory performance of duty upon return from initial 8 active duty training, is maintaining satisfactory academic 9 progress, provides proper notice of national guard status to 10 the community college or institution at the time of ll registration for the term in which tuition benefits are 12 sought, and submits an application to the adjutant general of 13 Iowa, who determines eligibility and whose decision is final. 14 If the amount appropriated for the program is insufficient 15 to provide educational assistance to all eligible national 16 guard members, the adjutant general is authorized to determine 17 the amount of educational assistance each eligible guard 18 member receives. However, that amount shall not be less than 19 50 percent of the resident tuition rate established for 20 regents universities. The adjutant general is prohibited from 21 determining educational assistance amounts based upon a 22 national guard member's unit, the location at which drills are 23 attended, or whether the eligible individual is a member of 24 the Iowa army or air national guard. 25
