Section 1. Section 257.8, subsection 1, Code 1999, is
amended to read as follows:

3 1. STATE PERCENT OF GROWTH. The state percent of growth 4 for the budget year beginning July 1, 1999, is three percent. 5 The state percent of growth for the budget year beginning July 6 <u>1, 2000, is four percent</u>. The state percent of growth for 7 each subsequent budget year shall be established by statute 8 which shall be enacted within thirty days of the submission in 9 the year preceding the base year of the governor's budget 10 under section 8.21. The establishment of the state percent of 11 growth for a budget year shall be the only subject matter of 12 the bill which enacts the state percent of growth for a budget 13 year.

14 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act is applicable for 15 computing state aid under the state school foundation program 16 for the school budget year beginning July 1, 2000.

EXPLANATION This bill establishes a state percent of growth of 4 percent for purposes of the state school foundation program for the school budget year beginning July 1, 2000. The bill is applicable for state aid computation under the school foundation program for the school budget year beginning July 1, 2000.
