Section 321.20B, subsection 1, Code 1999, is 1 2 amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph after 3 unnumbered paragraph 1: It shall be conclusively NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. 5 presumed that a motor vehicle that is subject to registration 6 in this state and driven upon a parking lot which is available 7 to the public without charge or which is available to 8 customers or invitees of a business or facility without charge 9 was driven on the highways of this state in order to enter the 10 parking lot, and this section shall be applicable to such a 11 motor vehicle. RELATING TO MANDATORY MOTOR VEHICLE PROOF OF FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY BY REQUIRING SUCH PROOF WHEN A MOTOR VEHICLE IS OPERATED ON A PARKING LOT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.20B, subsection 1, Code 1999, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph after unnumbered paragraph 1:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. It shall be conclusively presumed that a motor vehicle driven upon a parking lot which is available to the public without charge or which is available to customers or invitees of a business or facility without charge was driven on the highways of this state in order to enter the parking lot, and this section shall be applicable to such a motor vehicle. As used in this section, "parking lot" includes access roads, drives, lanes, aisles,
