1 30 EXPLANATION

This bill amends the Code section relating to the filing of 2 a veterinary lien. The bill requires that the verified 3 account for products provided and services rendered be filed 34 with the secretary of state, rather than the clerk of the 35 district court, that the lien must be filed within 180 days 2 1 after the last day products were provided or services were 2 rendered, rather than 60 days, and that the lien is limited to 3 products provided or services rendered within two years prior 4 to the filing of the lien.

The bill also reorganizes the Code section and provides that the secretary of state may create and provide forms for filing.
