1 1 Section 1. Section [257.46](#), subsection 2, Code Supplement
1 2 1999, is amended to read as follows:

1 3 2. The remaining portion of the budget shall be funded by
1 4 the thirty-eight dollar increase in allowable growth for the

1 12 program to the department of education. The proportion of a
1 13 school district's budget which corresponds to the thirty-eight
1 14 dollar increase in allowable growth for the school budget year
1 15 beginning July 1, 1999, added to the amount in subsection 1,
1 16 shall be utilized exclusively for a school district's

1 18 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
1 19 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

1 20 EXPLANATION

1 21 This bill provides that the \$38 increase in allowable
1 22 growth for the school budget year beginning July 1, 1999, will
1 23 be multiplied by a school district's budget enrollment in
1 24 determining the amount of state funding provided for gifted
1 25 and talented programs pursuant to Code section 257.46. By
1 26 utilizing budget enrollment, additional enrollment generated
1 27 by special education weighting will not be included for gifted
1 28 and talented funding purposes.

1 29 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
