A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the school year beginning date.
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 279.l0, subsection 1, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

1. The school year shall begin annually on the-first-day of July $\underline{1}$ and each-fegutarły-estabłished-ełementary-and secondary-sehooz-shazz-begin-no-sooner-than-a-day-during-the catendar-week-in-whieh-the-£irst-day-of-September-fałłs-but-no łater-than-the-first-Monday-in-Becember end the following June 30. Howeverf-if-the-first-day-of-September-fatłs-on-a-Sundayt sehoot-may-begin-on-a-day-during-the-catendar-week-which
immediateły-precedes-the-first-day-of-September---Sehoot The regular school calendar may commence on or after July 1 , but once commenced shall continue for at least one hundred eighty days, except as provided in subsection 3 ;-and-may-be maintained-during-the-entire-cazendar-year. However, if the board of directors of a district extends the school calendar because inclement weather caused the district to temporarily close school during the regular school calendar, the district may excuse a graduating senior who has met district or school requirements for graduation from attendance during the extended school calendar. A school corporation may begin employment of personnel for in-service training and development purposes before the date to begin elementary and secondary school.

Sec. 2. Section 279.10, subsection 4, Code 2001, is amended by striking the subsection.

Sec. 3. Section 299.4, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:
299.4 REPORTS AS TO PRIVATE INSTRUCTION.

The parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a child who is of compulsory attendance age, who places the child under competent private instruction under either section 299A. 2 or 299A.3, not in an accredited school or a home school assistance program operated by a public or accredited nonpublic school, shall furnish a report in duplicate on forms provided by the public school district, to the district by the

earłiest-starting-date-speeified-in-seetion-z79-ł0;-subsection $\pm$ August 15 of the school year in which the child is placed 3 under private instruction. The secretary shall retain and 4 file one copy and forward the other copy to the district's 5 area education agency. The report shall state the name and 6 age of the child, the period of time during which the child 7 has been or will be under competent private instruction for 8 the year, an outline of the course of study, texts used, and the name and address of the instructor. The parent, guardian, 10 or legal custodian of a child, who is placing the child under 11 competent private instruction for the first time, shall also 12 provide the district with evidence that the child has had the immunizations required under section 139A.8. The term "outline of course of study" shall include subjects covered, lesson plans, and time spent on the areas of study. Sec. 4. Section 257.17, Code 2001, is repealed. EXPLANATION This bill abolishes the requirement that school start during the week in which September 1 falls and makes related changes.

The bill specifies that the annual school year begins on July 1 and ends the following June 30. Once commenced, the bill requires that the school calendar continue for at least 180 days. The bill strikes a subsection that permits a school to apply to the department of education for a waiver from the school start date, and repeals a Code section that penalizes schools by reducing their state aid payments if they begin their calendars early. In accordance with the change in the school start date, the bill establishes a deadine of August 15 for the filing of a report that a parent who places a child under competent private instruction must furnish to the school district of residence. Currently, the report must be furnished by the earliest starting date specified in the code, 34 which under the bill is July 1.
