A BILL FOR

1 An Act establishing a senior pharmaceutical assistance and
 2 education program and providing for an appropriation.
 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 231.61 SENIOR PHARMACEUTICAL
- 2 ASSISTANCE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.
- 3 l. For the purposes of this section, unless the context 4 otherwise requires:
- 5 a. "Eligible person" means a person, sixty-five years of
- 6 age or older, with an annual net income of not more than two
- 7 hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level, as defined
- 8 by the most recent poverty income guidelines published by the
- 9 United States department of health and human services; or a
- 10 person, sixty-five years of age or older, who with the
- 11 person's spouse has an annual net income of not more than two
- 12 hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level, as defined
- 13 by the most recent poverty income guidelines published by the
- 14 United States department of health and human services.
- 15 "Eligible person" does not include a person who is eligible
- 16 for financial assistance for the purchase of prescription
- 17 drugs under another local, state, or federal program to the
- 18 extent that the other program provides financial assistance
- 19 for the purchase of prescription drugs.
- 20 b. "Prescription drug" means a prescription drug as
- 21 defined in section 155A.3.
- 22 c. "Program" means the senior pharmaceutical assistance
- 23 program established in this section.
- 24 2. A senior pharmaceutical assistance program is
- 25 established within the department to provide for subsidization
- 26 of the prescription drug costs of eligible persons. The
- 27 program shall be administered through the area agencies on
- 28 aging.
- 29 3. The commission shall adopt rules to implement this
- 30 section. The rules shall provide for all of the following:
- 31 a. A means to determine the eligibility of a person,
- 32 including proof of the person's actual and anticipated annual
- 33 net income, evidence of complete or partial payment for the
- 34 costs of prescription drugs from a provider other than the
- 35 program, and other provisions consistent with this section.

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- b. The program application form. An initial application
 2 shall be accompanied by proof of the date of birth of the
 3 person.
- 4 c. Issuance by the department of a participation card, 5 upon approval of an application. The card shall act as a form 6 of identification for a person to use in proving eligibility.
- 7 d. Prescription copayment and deductible amount.
- 8 e. Pharmacist case management.
- 9 4. In establishing copayment and deductible amounts, the 10 goal of the commission shall be to provide a benefit to the 11 greatest number of eligible persons. The department may 12 negotiate group discounts or utilize other methods to reduce 13 the cost of prescription drugs provided under the program.
- 14 5. The department shall establish a pharmaceutical 15 assistance education program to provide information regarding 16 options for pharmaceutical assistance. The pharmaceutical 17 assistance education program shall be provided through the 18 area agencies on aging.
- 19 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the 20 general fund of the state to the department of elder affairs 21 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 22 30, 2002, the following amount, or so much thereof as is 23 necessary, for the purpose designated:
- 24 For the senior pharmaceutical assistance program and the 25 pharmaceutical assistance education program established 26 pursuant to section 231.61:

28 EXPLANATION

This bill establishes a senior pharmaceutical assistance program in the department of elder affairs to provide for subsidization of prescription drug costs of eligible persons years of age and older with limited incomes, as established in the bill. The department of elder affairs is required to adopt rules regarding copayments and deductibles, and a form of participation card identification for eligible persons.

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1 The bill also establishes a pharmaceutical assistance
2 education program to provide information regarding options for
 3 pharmaceutical assistance. The program is to be provided
 4 through the area agencies on aging.
      The bill also provides for an appropriation to the
 6 department of elder affairs to finance the program.
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
