SUBJECT:

Children and Controlled Substances

Children become involved as innocent victims of persons who manufacture controlled substances. While these children are completely dependent upon their parent they are exposed to potentially explosive operating laboratories with chemicals and deadly gases. Manufacturing controlled substances also produces strong odors and dangerous gases that can be dangerous to the children if exposed. Families and communities have experienced tragic fires caused by explosive ingredients used to manufacture controlled substances.

Manufacturing controlled substances, coupled with the use of these controlled substances increases the risk of child abuse and neglect and domestic violence. In fact, children whose parents abuse alcohol and drugs approximately three times more likely than others to be physically or sexually abused, and more than four times more likely to be neglected

By amending the juvenile code, we could provide to families adequate resources and support that could help to turn their life around so that they could succeed.
