EXPLANATION

The bill replaces the current provisions relating to foreign and international adoptions, including the requirement that if an adoption occurred in the minor person's country of origin, an additional adoption must occur in the state in which the adopting parents reside and under the laws of that state, and instead provides that a decree establishing a parent-child
