A BILL FOR

1 An Act requiring the state board of regents to adopt rules 2 directing its institutions of higher learning to waive certain 3 tuition charges for the children of police officers, fire 4 fighters, sheriffs, deputies, volunteer emergency services 5 providers, and individuals in protection occupations killed in the line of duty. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 8 9 10 11 12

- 1 Section 1. Section 262.9, Code Supplement 2001, is amended
- 2 by adding the following new subsection:
- 3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 29. a. Adopt rules that require an
- 4 institution of higher learning under its control to waive the
- 5 institution's tuition charges for any undergraduate student
- 6 who is a resident of Iowa and meets any of the following
- 7 criteria:
- 8 (1) Is the child of a peace officer, as defined in section
- 9 97A.1, who is killed in the line of duty as determined by the
- 10 board of trustees of the Iowa department of public safety
- 11 peace officers' retirement, accident, and disability system in
- 12 accordance with section 97A.6, subsection 16.
- 13 (2) Is the child of an individual in a protection
- 14 occupation, as defined in section 97B.49B, or is the child of
- 15 a sheriff, deputy sheriff, or an airport fire fighter, as
- 16 defined in section 97B.49C, who is killed in the line of duty
- 17 as determined by the department of personnel in accordance
- 18 with section 97B.52, subsection 2.
- 19 (3) Is the child of a volunteer emergency services
- 20 provider, as defined in section 100B.11, who is killed in the
- 21 line of duty as determined by department of public safety in
- 22 accordance with section 100B.11, subsection 2.
- 23 (4) Is the child of a police officer or a fire fighter, as
- 24 defined in section 411.1, who is killed in the line of duty as
- 25 determined by the statewide fire and police retirement system
- 26 in accordance with section 411.6, subsection 15.
- 27 b. An individual who is eligible for a waiver under
- 28 paragraph "a" shall complete and file an application, with an
- 29 institution of higher learning under the board's control, for
- 30 a waiver for the ensuing academic year on a form approved by
- 31 the board.
- 32 c. For purposes of this section, "child" includes only a
- 33 child who is under the age of thirty years and is a full-time
- 34 student.

35 EXPLANATION

This bill requires the state board of regents to adopt 2 rules directing its institutions of higher learning to waive 3 undergraduate tuition charges for the children of peace and 4 police officers, fire fighters, sheriffs, deputies, volunteer 5 emergency services providers, and individuals in protection 6 occupations killed in the line of duty. Eligible individuals must apply to the institutions for a 8 waiver.
