A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing for the redistricting of county supervisor
2 districts for certain counties.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 331.210A, subsection 2, Code 2001, is 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph: NEW PARAGRAPH. f. Notwithstanding the provisions of this 4 section to the contrary, for a county with a population of 5 ninety-five thousand or more that is required to draw a plan 6 "three" supervisor representation plan, the legislative 7 service bureau, and not the temporary county redistricting 8 commission, shall draw a first plan as required by paragraph The plan drawn by the legislative service bureau shall 10 be based upon the precinct plan adopted for use by the county 11 and shall be drawn in accordance with section 42.4. The plan 12 drawn by the legislative service bureau shall be submitted to 13 the temporary county redistricting commission which shall 14 perform the duties required by paragraphs "b" and "c" 15 concerning the plan. After the requirements of paragraphs "b" 16 and "c" have been met, the plan drawn by the legislative 17 service bureau shall be submitted to the board or supervisors 18 for its approval or rejection. If the plan drawn by the 19 legislative service bureau is rejected by the board of 20 supervisors, the board of supervisors shall direct the 21 temporary county redistricting commission to prepare a second 22 plan as provided by paragraph "d". 23 EXPLANATION 24 This bill provides that the legislative service bureau 25 shall draw a first supervisor redistricting plan for plan 26 "three" counties with a population of 95,000 or more in lieu 27 of the plan being drawn by the temporary county redistricting 28 commission. The plan drawn by the legislative service bureau 29 shall be submitted to the temporary county redistricting

30 commission which will still be required to conduct a public

31 hearing concerning the first plan and prepare a report

32 concerning the plan. Following the public hearing and

33 submission of the commission's report, the plan drawn by the

34 legislative service bureau shall be submitted to the county

35 board of supervisors for its approval or rejection. If the

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1 first plan is rejected, the temporary county redistricting
2 commission, and not the legislative service bureau, would draw
3 a second plan. Plan "three" counties are those counties which
4 elect supervisors from a district within the county.
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
