Section 1. DISPROPORTIONATE SHARE PAYMENTS -- CHILDREN'S 2 HOSPITALS. The department of human services shall designate a 3 children's hospital that meets the criteria for a voting 4 member of the national association of children's hospitals and 5 related institutions and that operates as part of a licensed 6 hospital, as a qualifying hospital for the purpose of receipt 7 of disproportionate share hospital payments for inpatient 8 services under the medical assistance program. 9 children's hospital shall be eligible for receipt of 10 disproportionate share hospital funds, whether or not the 11 children's hospital has a separate federal Medicare provider 12 number. The department of human services shall adopt rules 13 and shall seek an amendment from the centers for Medicare and 14 Medicaid of the United States department of health and human 15 services, as necessary to implement this Act. **EXPLANATION** 16 This bill directs the department of human services to 17 18 designate a children's hospital that meets the criteria for a 19 voting member of the national association of children's 20 hospitals and related institutions and that operates as part 21 of a licensed hospital, as a qualifying hospital for the 22 purpose of receipt of disproportionate share hospital payments 23 for inpatient services under the medical assistance program. 24 Such a children's hospital is eligible for receipt of 25 disproportionate share hospital funds, whether or not the 26 children's hospital has a separate federal Medicare provider 27 number.
