A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the resource limits applicable to certain
2 employed persons with disabilities under the medical
3 assistance program.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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Section 1. Section 249A.3, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 2 Supplement 2001, is amended to read as follows: a. As allowed under 42 U.S.C. § 1396a(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XIII), 3 4 individuals with disabilities, who are less than sixty-five 5 years of age, who are members of families whose income is less 6 than two hundred fifty percent of the most recently revised 7 official poverty line published by the federal office of 8 management and budget for the family, who have earned income 9 and who are eligible for medical assistance or additional 10 medical assistance under this section if earnings are 11 disregarded. As allowed by 42 U.S.C. § 1396a(r)(2), unearned 12 income shall also be disregarded in determining whether an 13 individual is eligible for assistance under this paragraph. 14 For the purposes of determining the amount of an individual's 15 resources under this paragraph and as allowed by 42 U.S.C. § 16 1396a(r)(2), a maximum of ten thirty thousand dollars of 17 available resources shall be disregarded and any additional 18 resources held in a retirement account, in a medical savings 19 account, in an assistive technology account, or in any other 20 account approved under rules adopted by the department shall 21 also be disregarded. Individuals All individuals eligible for 22 assistance under this paragraph, -whose-individual-income 23 exceeds-one-hundred-fifty-percent-of-the-official-poverty-line 24 published-by-the-federal-office-of-management-and-budget-for 25 an-individual, shall pay a premium. The amount of the premium 26 shall be based on a sliding fee schedule adopted by rule of 27 the department and shall be based on a percentage of the 28 individual's income. The maximum premium payable by an 29 individual whose-income-exceeds-one-hundred-fifty-percent-of 30 the-official-poverty-line shall be commensurate with premiums 31 charged for private group health insurance in this state. 32 This-paragraph-shall-be-implemented-no-later-than-March-17 33 2000-34

EXPLANATION

This bill increases the resource disregard under the

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1 medical assistance program for employed persons with

2 disabilities from \$10,000 to \$30,000. The bill also adds to

3 retirement accounts and medical savings accounts, assistive 4 technology accounts, as additional resources that may be 5 disregarded under the program. The bill requires all 6 individuals eligible for assistance under the bill to pay a 7 premium based on a sliding fee schedule. Existing law 8 requires payment of a premium only for individuals whose 9 income exceeds 150 percent of the poverty line.

Description

House File 2578 directs the Department of Human Services (DHS) to increase resource disregards under the Medical Assistance Program for employed persons with disabilities from \$10,000 to \$30,000. The Bill adds to retirement accounts and medical savings accounts, assistive technology accounts, as additional resources that may be disregarded under the Program. The Bill requires all individuals eligible for assistance to pay a premium based on a sliding fee schedule.

Assumptions

- 1. A change in resource disregard will add 94 eligibles in FY 2003 and 109 eligibles in FY 2004.
- 2. The new eligibles will pay premiums which would offset DHS administrative costs associated with implementing changes to resource disregards.
- 3. Department of Human Services currently provides a disregard for assistive technology accounts.
- 4. Requiring all individuals eligible for assistance to pay premiums based on a sliding fee schedule will affect 3,422 additional eligibles.
- 5. The premium payment would be \$20.00 a month per eligible.
- 6. There would be administrative costs associated with implementation of the new premium payments and additional eligibles.
